The Wandering Albatross has a wingspread of 11 1/2 feet, the greatest of any living bird. The superstition that the Albatross brings good weather was long widespread, and was used by Coleridge as a starring point for "The Rhyme of the Ancient Mariner."

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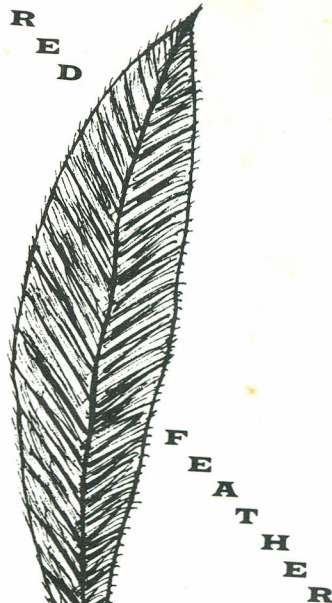

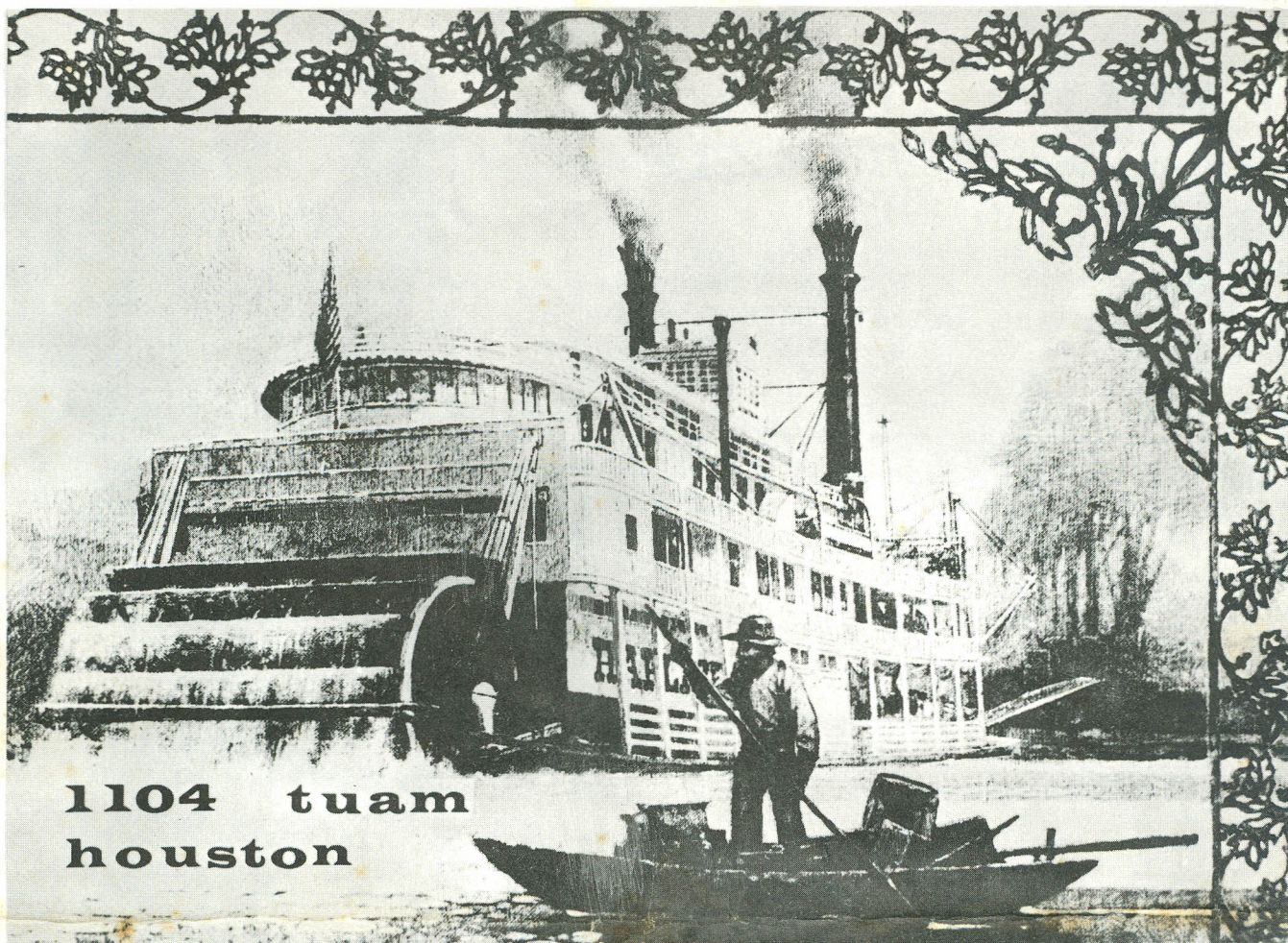

Then: A Waiter - One who provides good, fast service..making each customer feel like special people..HIS customers.

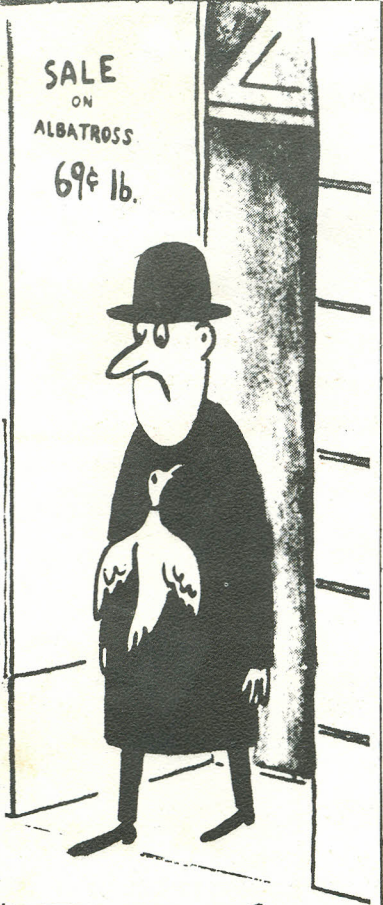
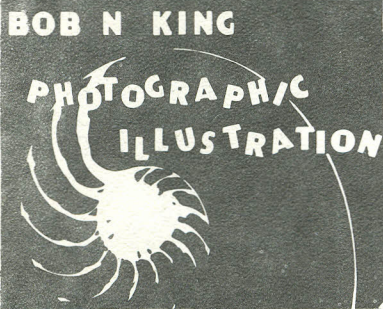
THINK about these things yourself..and the next time you see your favorite bartender, remember what I've said..then take another look at him. He's quite a remarkable fellow; HE has to be!

That you'd love me and I'd love you!

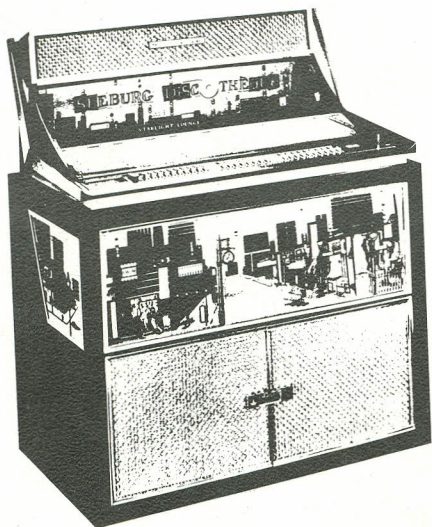

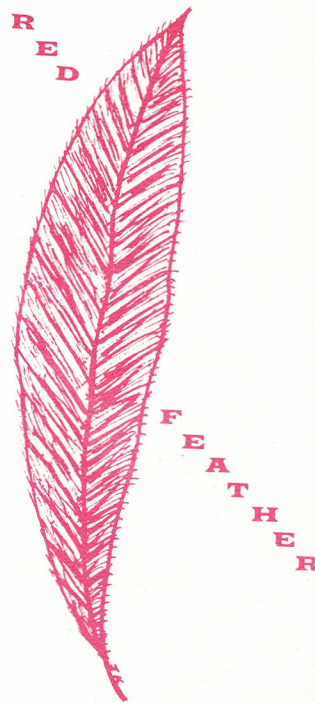
