HILL'S "JAIL TERM" NETS \$5,000

HOUSTON—Gay activist **Ray Hill** earned \$50 per minute for the time he spent in jail on his last arrest. Hill was arrested July 31, 1980, for refusing to show his driver's license to vice officer J. S. Krol during the trial of defendants from the raid on Mary's, which occurred before Gay Pride Week, 1980. Hill was covering the trial as a reporter for *KPFT Radio*, and had his city press pass pinned to his suit.

One hour and forty minutes later Hill was released on his own recognizance. No one appeared to testify against him at his trial for "Failure to identify as a witness." The Houston chapter of the *American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU)* and Hill pursued the case by filing suit in Federal Court against the City and Officer Krol. The ordinance was ruled unconstitutional by **Judge Woodrow Seals**, and HPD was enjoined from making arrests under the charge.

The \$5,000 check was given to Hill December 31, 1981, by then-still City Controller **Kathy Whitmire**.

"I hope others are encouraged to fight back as a result of our success in this suit," Hill told *TWT News*. He plans to hold a victory benefit for ACLU at *The Brasserie* in February, *TWT News* learned.

"MARDI GRAS"

The Carnival season in gay old New Orleans got off to a heavy start as the *Krewe of Dirtie Dottie* staged a *Leather Ball*, liberally populated with pimps and prostitutes.

The high point of the evening was the unmasking of the king, **Danny Fountain**, an honorary member of the *Knights d'Orleans* who was dressed in full leather.

Led by **Boots**, the newly-installed president of the *Lancers M.C.*, members of that club and the *Knights* followed his motorcycle out onto the ballroom floor for the event to be officially dedicated to them.

Also called to the throne by the new royalty was a representative of *The American Leathermen* in Houston, Treasurer **Lou Guadagno**.

The third *krewe ball* of the season, given by Memphis, also employed the talents of the *Knights* during its "Going To Hell" tableau. In full club dress, they served as color guard and pallbearers for the *Jazz Funeral* presentation of one of the maids.

Both *The Lancers* and *The Knights* also will serve as doormen for the ball of the *Mystic Krewe of Celestial Knights*.

All in all, there are nine gay balls in New Orleans. The last one, **Armeinuis**, is Saturday night before Mardi Gras—and, if you are hopeful of getting an invitation after your arrival in the Queen City, then don't forget to pack your tuxedo.

The Carnival season starts on the last day of Christmas—or Twelfth Night—which is always January 6. But the last day of the season—Carnival Day, or Mardi Gras—is a moveable date and a bit more confusing. The easy way to find out is to merely remember that it is the day before Ash Wednesday, February 23 this year and February 15 in 1983.

—But be sure to watch your terms. "Carnival" means the entire season.

"Mardi Gras" is but a single day, literally meaning "Fat Tuesday" in French—Tuesday and Tuesday only.

The Friday night before Mardi Gras the *Knights d'Orleans* will be hosting their traditional **Hospitality House** from 8 until midnight in the patio of their home bar, *TT's West*—only a block from the end of the parade route of the *Krewe of Hermes*. It is one of the most spectacularly-lighted street pageants of the season.

Saturday afternoon from 4 until 6, *The Lancers* will be holding court with a Beer Bust in the back of their new home bar, *Paw Paw's*. Both parties will be open only to club members wearing colors and invited guests.

After catching the *Iris* parade Saturday afternoon, you will only be a short one-block walk from Rampart Street to *Paw Paw's*—but to see the *Endymion* march that evening, you will have to trek to Canal Street. But the walk is worth it, as *Endymion* is noted far and wide for its elaborate costuming.

In New Orleans, the last Sunday of the season is often referred to as "Little Mardi Gras" because of the numerous parades throughout the city. From your vantage point at the *Finale II*, you can spend the afternoon seeing three parades while you run in and out for drinks. Not to be missed Sunday night on Canal Street is the paramount parade of *Bacchus*, which always has a show-biz personality as king. Serving as the God of Wine in past years have been the likes of **Danny Kaye, Bob Hope, Raymond Burr** and **The Fonz**.

Monday (after all, it will be a work day in New Awlins) is rather a quiet time, a breather before all hell breaks loose on Mardi Gras—although there is a night parade.

Kicking off the Fat Tuesday festivities will be the Burgundy Street Awards in front of *Play It Again, Sam* (formerly *Tiger's*) with **Lady Roz** as mistress of ceremonies.

The judging and continuous entertainment gets underway at 10 a.m., but the *Leather Competition* will not start until 1 p.m. Prizes will be given for the Best Master and Slave, Best Overall Leatherman, Best Male and Female and Best Overall Western and Military.

Edd Smith, the newest member of *The Knights d'Orleans*, will emcee his world-famous Mardi Gras Awards in front of the *Bourbon Pub and Parade* beginning at 4 p.m. Starting a new annual format of saluting different states, Texas will be honored first.

During Mardi Gras, it's usually wall-to-wall people on the streets and in the bars—and also wall-to-wall people

There will be a 24-hour attendant and, if you are not out partying, you can enjoy their heated pool, hot tub, TV room, 24-hour bar and cooking facilities. You will need to bring your own sleeping bag or bed roll.
