It was literally standing room only. Nick of Lucille's stood by the door and only admitted those people who could be squeezed together while sitting on the floor.

Asked what he thought about all of the happenings at his bar, Nick replied, "I don't know. I'll wait to view the videotape to get a good idea of what went on."

No one could really describe the performance, but one member of the audience came close when he said, "Bizarre...like a bad Acid trip."

The keyboard artist was the first to enter and after she ripped a plastic cover from the stage the Blue Baby Dolls entered, each carrying a baby doll which they proceeded to hang by the neck from cords before starting their first set.

Songs performed included some with lyrics like "I'm not looking for love, I'm looking for fun" and "I'm as easy as 1,2,3."

Health and Human Service (HHS) Assistant Secretary Dr. Edward Brandt.

The money will be spent in two parts; \$1.75 million by the center for Disease Control in Atlanta and another \$6.55 million by the National Institutes of Health for AIDS research.

Brandt's recommendations were contained in a May memo to HHS Secretary Margaret Heckler, who has yet to act on the recommendation. ♦

A special preview is planned for Tuesday, October 9, where all seats will be \$17.50.

The following night and through October 21 performances will be offered with seats ranging from \$18.50 for the Thursday matinee to \$24.50 for the Friday and Saturday evening performances.

### G.O.P. LEAVES AS BAG LADIES DESCEND ON DALLAS

The Republican National Convention ended just in time, as Dallas must now brace itself for an invasion of delegates of definitely another kind. Bag Ladies descend on that Texas city for a Labor Day weekend convention.

Republicans started leaving Dallas August 24, which, according to reports, was just moments before the arrival of the Bag Lady advance squads, preparing for the meeting of the largely misunderstood institution.

### MIDGE COSTANZA, OTHER LEADERS JOIN GAY/LESBIAN PAC BOARD

Midge Costanza, former Assistant to the President, and two other leaders of the gay and lesbian community were elected in July to the Board of Directors of the Human Rights Campaign Fund, the political action committee which contributes to congressional candidates who support lesbian and gay civil rights.

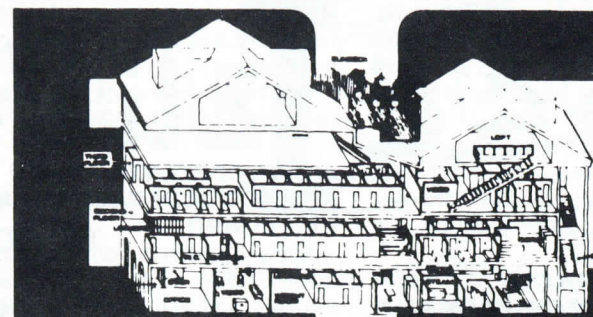
In addition to Ms. Constanza, the HRCF Board elected Diego Lopez, clinical director of the Gay Men's Health Crisis in New York and Susan Russell, an activist with the National Organization for Women in Albany, New York. The three will join the other twelve board members in authorizing contributions, setting policy and raising funds.

Midge Constanza entered politics in 1959 in Rochester, New York, where she managed the senatorial campaign of Robert F. Kennedy in Monroe County. In 1977 she became the first woman ever to hold the title Assistant to the President of the United States. She is now vice-president of Alan Landsburg Productions in Los Angeles.

"It is an honor to be selected to serve on the HRCF Board," said Constanza. "I have seen lesbians and gays become a political force in this country. I am proud to be part of one of the most important political forces in America in this political year."

Announcing the appointments, Vic Basile, executive director of HRCF, said "The appointment of these three national leaders adds strength, political savvy and diversity to the board, and significantly increases our ability to be major players in the political arena. They will play a major role in seeing that the Campaign Fund reaches its \$1 million goal

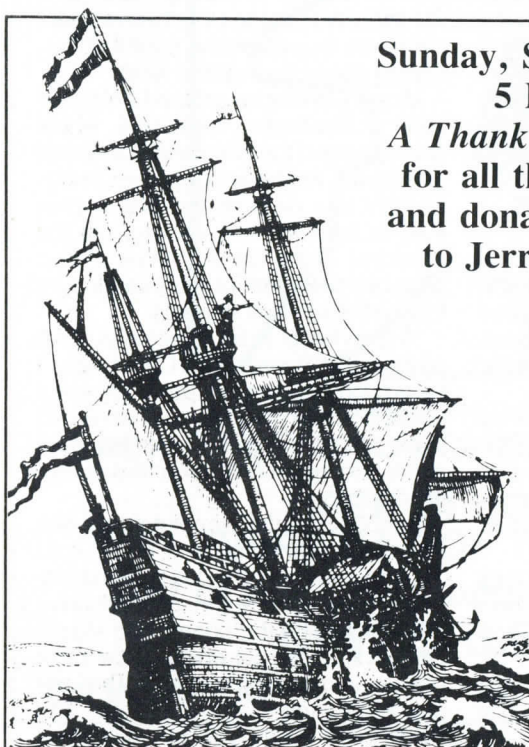

this year."

The Human Rights Campaign Fund raised more than \$600,000 in 1982, and made contributions to 119 candidates for the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, more than 80 percent whom won.

"We have measurable evidence that HRCF has already made a difference. After our first round of contributions in 1982 the number of co-sponsors of the Gay Rights Bill reached 78, up 20 from the previous year. The Administration requested a \$17 million appropriation for AIDS research, but Congress appropriated more than \$43 million," said Basile. "As I travel around the country, I find that state and local PACS are springing up everywhere to support civil rights for lesbians and gay men," he added. "We are now universally recognized as a serious force in America's political life. With our new board members, we will be able to represent our community even more effectively." ♦

### **THE NEW ORLEANS CITY/ CINCINNATI BALLET COMPLETES PRODUCTION OF "ALICE IN WONDERLAND" FOR PBS**

David McLain, Artistic Director of The New Orleans City/Cincinnati Ballet announced the completion of filming of the WCET production of Alice In Wonderland for the Public Broadcasting Service to be nationally televised this coming year.

This extraordinary full-length ballet with choreography by Ruth Page and funded by The Delores Kohl Educational Foundation of Chicago, will feature the brilliantly talented Katherine Healy in the title role of Alice.

Other principal roles will be danced by Michael Sharp, as the Queen of Hearts and Feno The Clown in the roles of The Mad Hatter and The Caterpillar. ♦

### **SAN FRANCISCO GAY VICTIM OF QUEERBASHING**

A gay man died after being attacked by a group of teenagers near the corner of Polk and California Streets in San

Francisco recently, according to the Bay Area Reporter.

John O'Connell, 40, reportedly was walking when he and a friend were attacked by about six teenagers, described by police as being between 17 and 20 years old, on a busy street corner around 9:30 p.m.

According to police, O'Connell was beaten by the group and knocked to the ground. His death was apparently the result of hitting the ground.

Tavern owners in the area reported there has been at least one other attack on a gay male, though no clear link has been established.

The California Senate has under consideration a bill which would add sexual orientation to those groups protected from violence.

The bill already passed by the Assembly amends that state's civil code to protect gays and lesbians from violence.

California Gov. George Deukmajian, who earlier this year vetoed a gay rights bill, is expected to sign it if it passes the legislature. ♦

### **CUOMO APPOINTS GAY RIGHTS PANEL**

New York Governor Mario Cuomo, has appointed a state Task Force on Gay Issues, and called having to protect the rights of citizens by Executive Order, like the one creating the task force, a "failure of government."

The Task Force, a result of Cuomo's Executive Order 28, will insure that there is no discrimination in state employment, or in the providing of state services on the basis of sexual orientation.

"This Executive Order represents a failure; it's a failure of government that I have to issue an executive order protecting lesbians and gay men from discrimination," Cuomo said.

"Non discrimination should be a matter of public policy," the Governor declared.

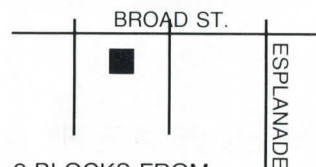

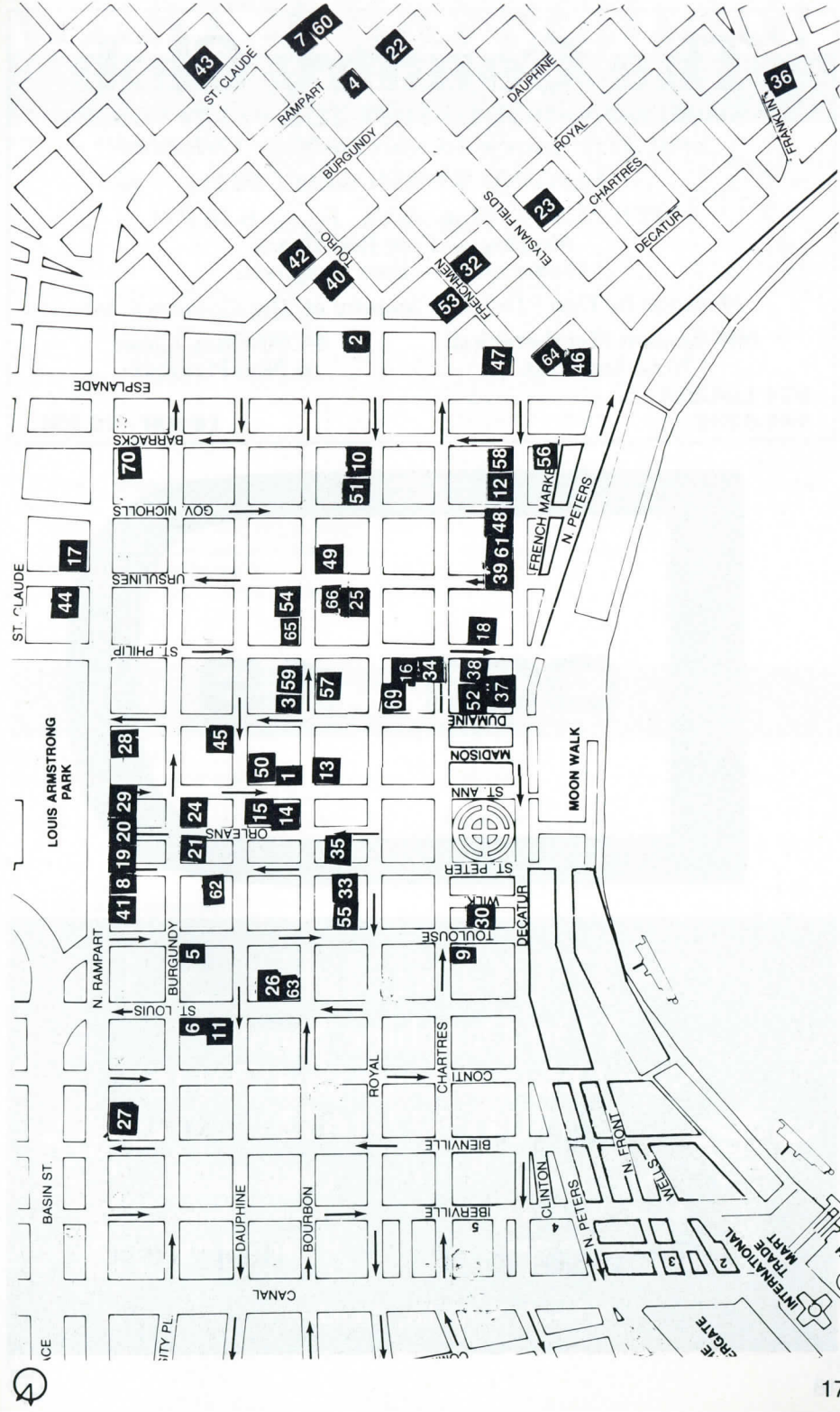
