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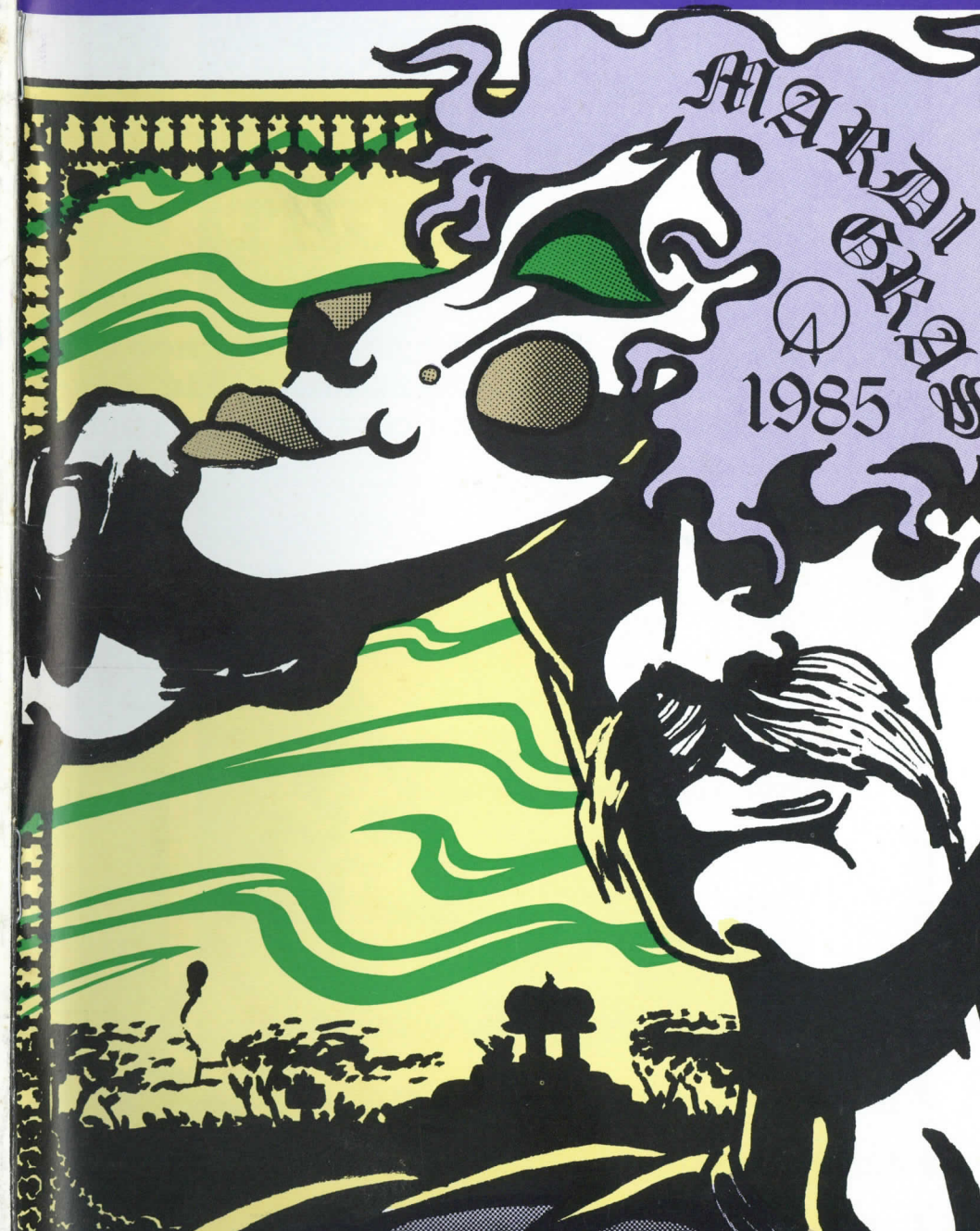

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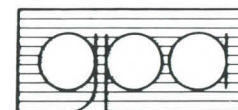
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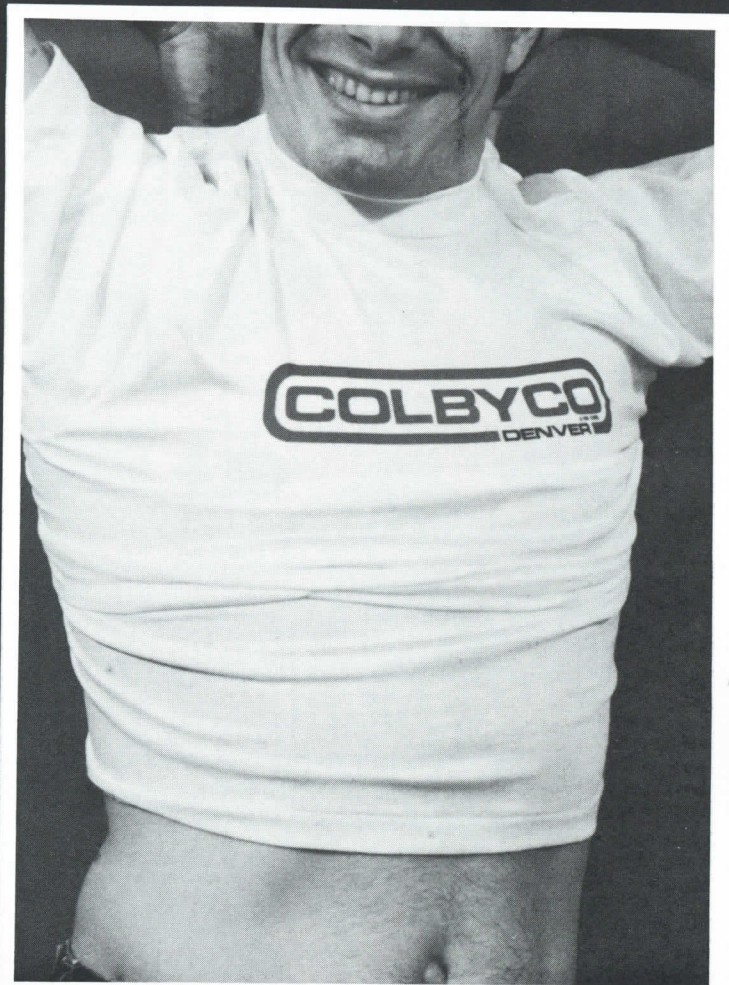
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## It's about time . . .

### IT'S CARNIVAL TIME

Only a few days remain before the fabled *Fat Tuesday*, better known as Mardi Gras. The excitement in New Orleans is already building with parades and other events leading up to the big blowout Tuesday.

Thursday, Feb. 14 — The Mystic Krewe of Apollo/New Orleans stages its annual ball at the Municipal Auditorium in Louis Armstrong Park across from the French Quarter. Formal attire is required, and attendance is by invitation only.

Be prepared to get there a little early or be late because the Krewe of Momus will parade down St. Charles Avenue.

The best place to see the parade is on Canal Street at the edge of the French Quarter. The parade should arrive in the CBD after 8 p.m.



Friday, Feb. 15 — The Krewe of Hermes will parade. It starts Uptown

around 6:30 p.m. and should be coming down Canal Street after 8 p.m.

Saturday, Feb. 16 — The Krewe of Armenius stage their annual ball at the St. Bernard Cultural Center.

Saturday, Feb. 16 — The Krewe of Tucks parade starts Uptown just after noon and should be at Canal Street around 2 p.m.

Saturday, Feb. 16 — The Krewe of Endymion will start their parade in Mid-City near Carrollton and Canal around 6:30 p.m. Any place on Canal Street is fine for viewing this very famous and elaborate parade. This parade does not disband on N. Rampart.

Sunday, Feb. 17 — The Krewe of Mid-City will start their parade around 12 noon near Canal and Carrollton and will parade down toward the river on Canal. The parade should pass the French Quarter sometime after 2 p.m.

Sunday, Feb. 17 — The Krewe of Thoth leaves from Napoleon and St. Charles about noon and falls in behind



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The Krewe of Mid-City when they reach downtown about 2:30 p.m.

Sunday, Feb 17 — The Krewe of Bacchus will leave St. Charles and Napoleon around 6:30 and arrive at Canal Street around 8:30 p.m. A must to see — they have a guest host every year.

Sunday, Feb 17 — Lords of Leather Ball will be held at St. Marks Community Center at the corner of Gov. Nicholls and N. Rampart. This leather groups' ball is not as formal as others and some tickets may still be available at Partner's 718 N. Rampart.

Monday, Feb. 18 — The Krewe of Proteus parade rolls from Uptown about 6:30 p.m. and should arrive on Canal Street after 8 p.m.

Tuesday, Feb. 19 — Happy Mardi Gras!

There is action all over the place, if parade watching is your thing than go up to Canal.

The Krewe of Zulu should arrive in the CBD around noon. Try your luck at

catching a famous "Zulu coconut."

The Krewe of Rex, The King of Mardi Gras, will pass down Canal Street sometime after 2 p.m. after numerous truck parades have wound their way through the city.

The Krewe of Comus, the oldest surviving Mardi Gras krewe is the last to parade, with their parade rolling down St. Charles and arriving on Canal Street sometime after 8 p.m. and then turning on N. Rampart to disband at Louis Armstrong Park.

If watching a parade is not your cup of tea there are many other things to see:

The Bourbon Street Awards return after a one year absence at the corner of Bourbon and Dumaine, in front of Cafe Lafitte's in Exile.

A large crowd can be expected so come out early to catch all the action!

Of course, anywhere you wander throughout the French Quarter, will find zany, costumed revelers, out to enjoy the festive holiday. ♦

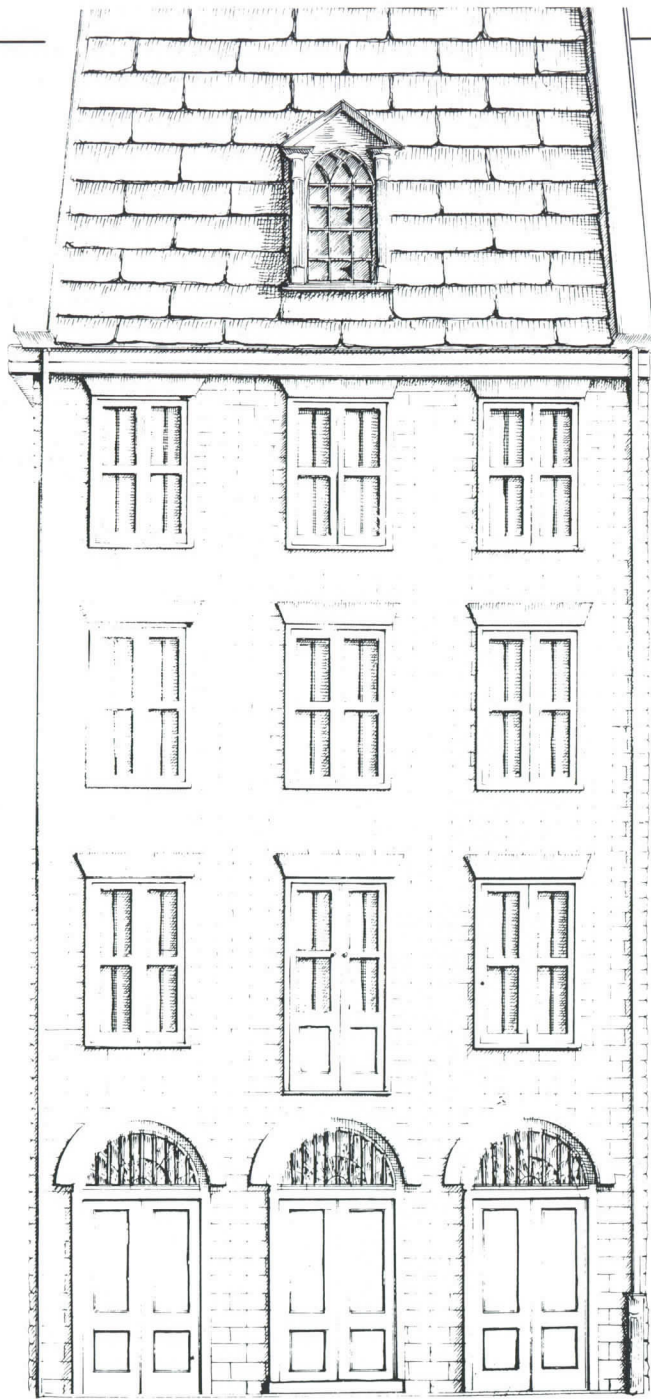

The all-woman band "Soft Touch" performed February 2nd at the Nest and will entertain from 10 p.m. to 2 a.m. on February 16, and 23 and on Mardi Gras Day from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m.

Lady Rae will appear February 16 from 11 p.m. to 3 a.m.

There is no cover for these performances.

On Sunday, February 3rd, the Krewe of David used the hospitality of Cuckoo's Nest owner Al Hooks to stage their first meeting since their ball January 6, and to look at the video tape of their ball. ♦

### **COUPLES GET ACQUAINTED PARTY FEB. 23**

A party for gay males and females to meet each other and get acquainted has been set for Saturday, February 23 in Atlanta.

Sponsored by the Atlanta group, A.C.T., the party will be staged at the Virginia Highlands Community in Atlanta, and out-of-town and out-of-state participants are welcome.

A.C.T., which stands for Atlanta Couples Together is the South's first male and female gay couples group, and will be offering assistance and counseling for those who live together with a life mate.

### **CAUTION URGED ON AIDS STOPPER**

Researchers are urging gay males to act cautiously over reports that a woman's spermicide product can help kill the virus which leads to AIDS.

Scientists reported January 31 that nonoxynol 9, which is present in some vaginal foam spermicides, kills the AIDS virus.

The use of the spray would be a preventative to AIDS, of which there are now more than 8,000 cases reported nationwide.


In a report by the Associated Press, researchers from the Centers for Disease Control confirmed that initial studies of the compound have found it does kill the AIDS virus.

Tests are expected shortly on whether the compound could be used to treat persons with AIDS.

Researchers, however, state that even though the spray kills the AIDS virus, people should not use this as an excuse to have sex promiscuously as



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
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more testing is required.

Use of the spray would probably be restricted to use in anal sex, but not oral sex, if scientists find the compound to be effective.

In a related development, Dr. James Curran of the CDC is reported to have stated that up to 300,000 people may have already been infected by the AIDS virus, with 30,000 expected to come down with the killer.

Curran based his estimate on studies which have shown that roughly five to ten percent of those exposed to the virus catch the killer. ♦

### PINK PAGES TO STAY

*The Advocate's* famous pink pages classified section will not be pulled from the national gay newspaper, as had earlier been reported, *The Advocate* has announced.

In October, *Adweek* magazine, a national advertising magazine, reported that *The Advocate* was pulling the section printed on pink colored paper in order to attract more national advertising.

The *Adweek* story quoted Peter Fritsch, former Assistant to the Publisher of the California based *Advocate*,

as saying that the section would be offered free in bars throughout the country.

However, tests run by the publication over the Christmas holidays show that the section of racy classifieds for meeting men, sex toys or models is just too popular, so it will remain. ♦

### HOUSTON MAYOR AND COUNCILPERSONS TARGETED FOR DEFEAT

The Mayor of Houston, Texas and eight City Council members have been targeted for defeat in Municipal election this November, because of their support for a gay a lesbian rights bill covering city employment, which was defeated January 19.

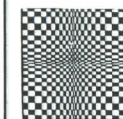
Houston Mayor Whitmire and the eight council members who voted for the laws which barred discrimination in city employment for gays and lesbians, should be defeated, the "Campaign for Houston" states, according to a report in *The Montrose Voice*.

Campaign for Houston was established after the council passed the laws in June, and fundamentalist churches gathered signatures to force the laws on the January 19 special election

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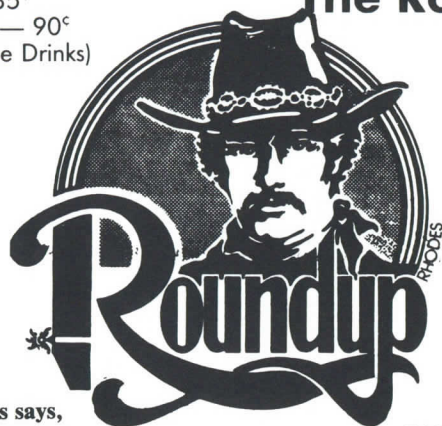

ballot.

Whitmire is being specially targeted  
for defeat, because she ran in her first  
election with substantial gay support,  
and because she has said that even  
though the voters killed the anti-  
discrimination laws, her administration  
will continue to honor them.

Gay activists have charged that the  
Campaign for Houston used mis-  
information and in some cases down-  
right lies in order to frighten people into  
voting against the laws.

Particularly the activists charge that  
the anti-gay group spread malicious  
misinformation about AIDS. ♦

### ARSONISTS OF GAY NEWSPAPER GETS 40 YEARS

An arsonist who was charged with  
setting fires which destroyed the offices  
of two Boston gay newspapers as well  
as a gay book store has been sen-  
tenced to 40 years in prison.

U.S. District Court Judge Rya Zobel  
sentenced Donald Stackpole to 40  
years in Federal prison just hours after a  
Suffolk County State Judge sentenced  
him to 18 to 20 years in state prison.

Stackpole, who becomes eligible for  
parole from the Federal charges after  
serving 13 years in prison, is charged  
with being the leader of an arson ring  
which set more than 200 fires in a three  
year period, according to a report in the  
*Boston Gay Community News*.

One of the fires was on July 7, 1982  
which destroyed the offices of the *Gay  
Community News*. Another gay news-  
paper *Fag Rag* and the Glad Day Book-  
store were also destroyed.

The arson ring included firemen and  
policemen who apparently were setting  
the fires to protest cutbacks in city ser-  
vices which were mandated after  
Massachusetts voters okayed a tax  
cutting amendment, "Proposition 2½."

The fires did more than \$50 million in  
damage and injured 282 firemen.

Other members of the arson rings will  
be standing trial within the next several  
months. ♦

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## DISCRIMINATION UP

Complaints of discrimination against gay males have increased 41 percent in the last year, the San Francisco Human Rights Commission reports.

Public fear of AIDS is being blamed in part for the increase, according to a report in the *Boston Gay Community News*.

A staff member in the HRC's Lesbian/Gay Unit stated that "AIDS hysteria is rampant in the city."

"We are hearing from gay people who are fired when they take a few days of sick leave because they have the flu," the staff person, Eileen Gillis stated.

Complaints of discrimination totaled 123 in 1984, up from 87 in 1983. ♦

## GAY GROUP ORGANIZES AT TEXAS UNIVERSITY

After more than seven years of legal battles, Texas A & M University has finally allowed the Gay Services of Texas A & M to be chartered as a campus organization.

The University finally complied with a 1984 decision of the U. S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals here in New Orleans, which overturned a lower court decision agreeing with the University.

The Texas university had been considering an appeal to the U. S. Supreme Court.

In 1977 the university denied recognition to the group citing the fact that it was illegal to participate in gay or lesbian sex, and that the university, and not student groups, provided student services, a report in the *American Bar Association Journal* states.

In later court battles, the university claimed the group was something like a fraternity and not a legitimate student group. ♦

## COUPLE BREAKING UP ONE BEING DEPORTED

A pair of California men who have been lovers for 10 years will have their relationship broken up by the Immigration and Naturalization Service (INS), when one of the pair is deported.

Anthony Sullivan, an Australian, met Richard Adams, a Californian, in 1974 and they fell in love.

Sullivan, who entered the U.S. on a tourist visa, then applied for immigrant status, which the INS denied.

Appeals to the Federal courts have failed and Sullivan has exhausted all possible means of staying in this

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country.

Attempts by Sullivan to get Adams admitted into Australia have failed as Australia immigration authorities have denied permission to allow Adams to move there. ♦

#### TEXAS SODOMY BILL MAY BE INTRODUCED

A conservative Republican State Representative might introduce a bill once again to outlaw sodomy in Texas, which would nullify the recent court victory throwing out the law.

Rep. Bill Ceverha, a Republican from North Dallas, introduced a similar bill last year, and according to a report in *The Montrose Voice*, "just doesn't accept homosexuality."

Gay activists are watching to see if the North Texas Republican will in-

troduce the bill again this year, and if he does, will fight to insure it is defeated. ♦

#### BRITISH PARLIAMENT MEMBER "COMES OUT"

A Labour member of the British Parliament, who has supported gay rights causes in the past, has come out publicly as being gay.

According to a report in the *Body Politic*, Chris Smith, 33, who represents a district in south London, made the announcement at an anti-discrimination rally in Rugby.

Smith is the first member of Parliament to come out publicly without being forced to because he has been caught in some scandal. ♦



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### OCEAN BREEZES AND CONCRETE WALLS: IMAGES IN THE COLOR MIND

You might look at the pictures on display throughout February at Christopher's Kind Book Store and say: "What wonderful photographs!" But you could as easily exclaim: "Superb paintings!" What you cannot confuse is that Timothy A. Burns has mastered two extremely difficult art forms.

His photography evidences an innate sense of line and design, an appreciation of architecture, structure and space; he has the eye of a builder and can see beauty in ordinary things — sand, mortar, brick, siding, marble, water. His sense of composition is Mondrian — like with the interior rhythms of a Le Corbusier.

He also creates a distinct time and place in each work — each one is evocative of some age: a photo of a dance-hall doorway ("Come and Get Your Spirits") tells its whole history. Even the titles give clue to an artist's

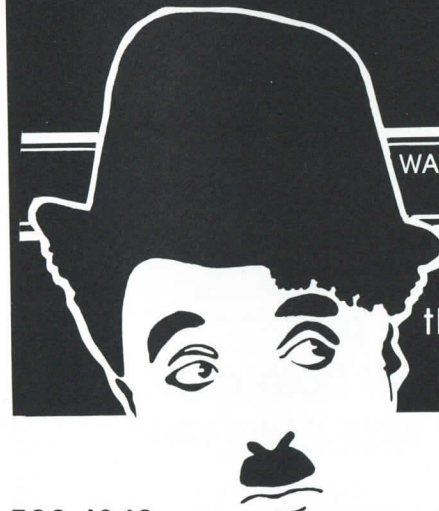
meaning beyond the obviousness of the subject matter: "Hung Out To Dry," "From One Life to Another," "Standing Strong." As a painter, Burns' color sense is superb — he can lay on his prints one single simple clear oil wash and bring a clump of pampas grass to brilliant, lucid life. He can paint a shutter "blue" and the wall behind them "pink" as in "East Bay Street," and you know it's Charleston — or somewhere just as colorful.

Or he can combine many tones and a multitude of shades on a stucco facade, as in "Dancing in the Sunlight" and painting and photography have been combined to produce a totally new art form.

And note — these are *painted* photographs — using oils as you would on canvas — not magic markers. Now, hand-colored photographs are nothing

new — they've depressed the market and this reviewer at the Atlanta Arts Festival for years. They most often reach abysmal levels of kitsch — but make no bones about it, Tim Burns' hand-painted photos are in a class by themselves.

It's all in what an artist sees.

The photographer painter is currently showing eighteen works collectively called: *Ocean Breezes and Concrete Walls*, at Christopher's Kind Book Store, 70 13th Street, (404) 873-KIND. Most of the photos were taken at Pawley's Island during a recent retreat wherein the artist took time to take stock and vacation. Some of the deceptively simple subjects are: beach houses, dunes, sunsets, store fronts, screen doors, column bases and cornices. All but two works are hand-painted. Several of the realistic photos, when so colored, become almost abstract constructions. Collectibility is enhanced by the unavoidable differences in the coloration of each print. The artist may be headed away from photography toward pure painting but one feels his sense of evocative time, space, composition, color and texture will remain true.

That Timothy A. Burns will continue to develop as an artist is undoubted.

His work is available at Christopher's Kind, in limited, numbered, hand-painted and signed framed editions from \$75.00 to \$250.00. Gene Loring, owner of Christopher's Kind, along with Dennis Wirzman, of The Bar on Peachtree, is to be commended for making space available to artists of Burns' quality: the community owes these creative attempts its personal attention and consideration.

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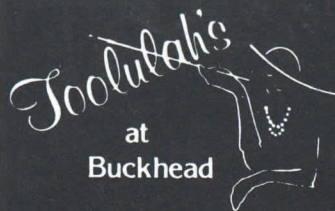
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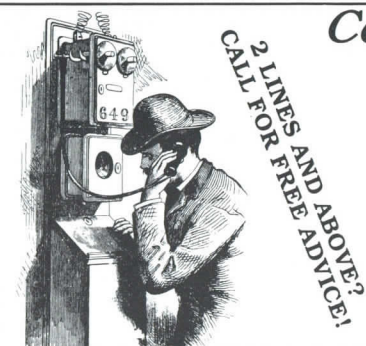

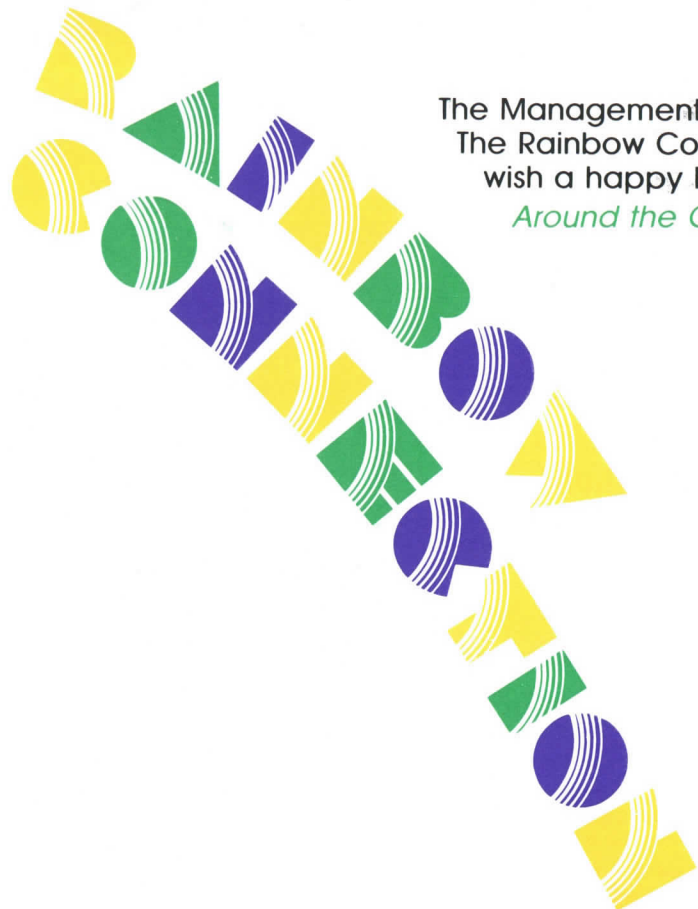
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
