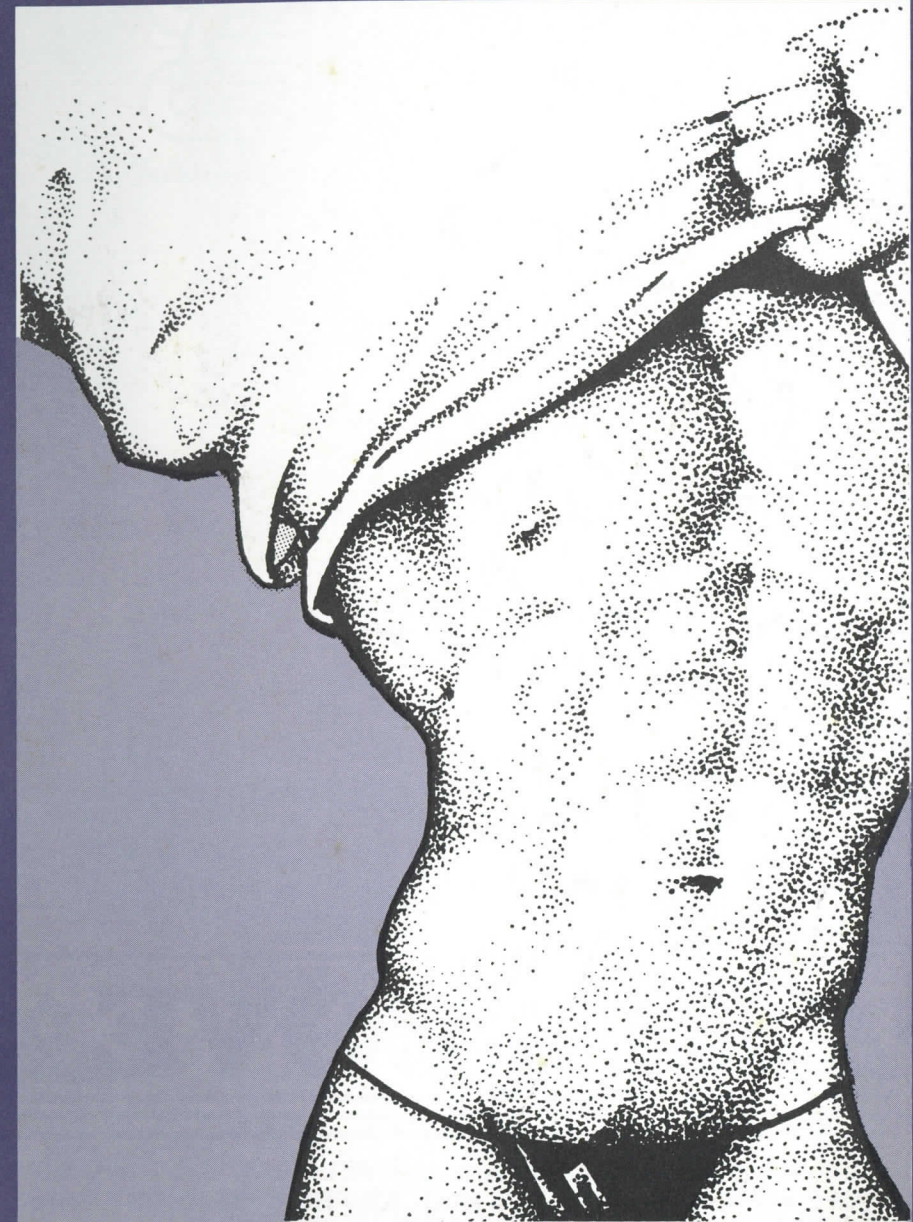

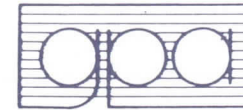

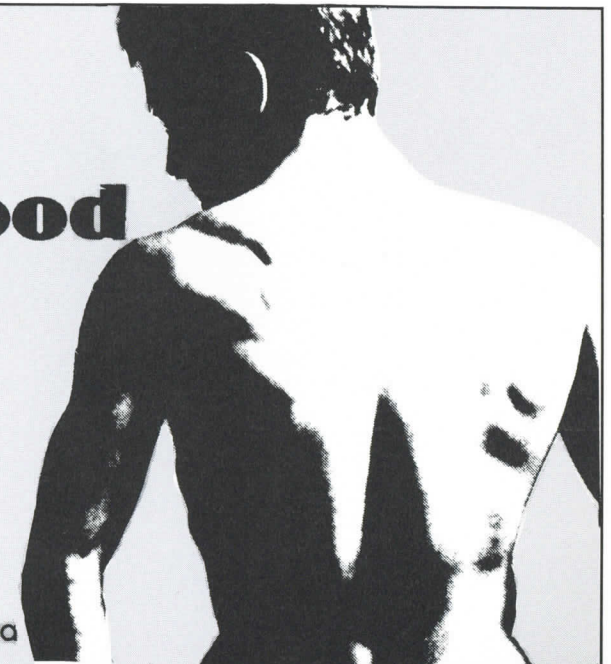

DANGER FROM THE RIGHT

The recent victory of gay rights advocates in the 11th Circuit Court of Appeals is an example of what can happen when you get your case before the "right" judges. But victories for those who champion civil rights and the separation of church and state will become few and far between if Jerry Falwell, Jesse Helms and Phyllis Schlafly are successful in an insidious plan to ensure that all future appointees to federal judgeships will vote their way.

On May 21, in a 2-1 decision, the 11th Circuit ruled that Georgia's sodomy statute infringed upon the rights of Michael Hardwick, a gay Atlanta man arrested for committing a homosexual act in the privacy of his home. The Appeals Court decision did not throw out the Georgia statute. It sent the case back to the Federal District Court where in April of 1983 Federal District Judge Robert H. Hall (a Reagan appointee) had, without even holding hearings, dismissed it in a short, 3-page decision. Justices Frank Johnson and

Elbert Tuttle, both Eisenhower appointees and long-standing advocates of civil rights, formed the majority in this case and wrote that "The activity he [Hardwick] hopes to engage in is quintessentially private and lies at the heart of an intimate association beyond the proper reach of state regulation."

But people who think like Judge Hall, rather than those with the more liberal views of Johnson and Tuttle, are being appointed by President Reagan. Falwell, Helms, Schlafly and others of the far right have taken steps to ensure that, with one-seventh of the Federal bench vacant and five Supreme Court justices over the age of seventy-five, they can take over our judicial system and make their mark on America.

Last summer in Dallas, Falwell, Helms and Schlafly, holding court before their followers, swore that every newly appointed Federal judge in a second Reagan term would become a foot soldier on behalf of the New Right Agenda. They understood that in the coming four years

they would have the opportunity to reshape the Supreme Court and to fill some 400 judicial seats, well over half the 744 active Federal judgeships, with people who endorse their views.

And they are succeeding. Individuals who have proven their loyalty have been systematically fed into the Justice Department through a key behind-the-scenes player — James McClellan. McClellan is President of the Center for Judicial Studies (an organization funded by the Moral Majority) which is engaged in a vicious strategy that would literally destroy the Bill of Rights. Their aim is a declaration that "guarantees" included in the Bill of Rights are a Federal matter and do not apply to state or local entities and that no Federal court could ever review a case dealing with any state or local issue. Under this interpretation cases such as Michael Hardwick's challenge of Georgia's sodomy statute could not be heard in federal court.

McClellan, who has said that "civil rights has nothing to do with liberty, but is in fact part of the Marxist agenda," is personally spearheading efforts to recruit judicial candidates who will agree beforehand to declare the Voting Rights Act unconstitutional, that environmental protection laws are invalid, and that censorship is warranted in some cases — that "blasphemy," for instance, should be declared illegal.

In addition Herbert Ellingwood, the current Chairman of the Merit Systems Protection Board and father of the ultrafundamentalist Christian Talent Bank, is about to be appointed head of the Justice Department's Office of Legal Policy. In that position he will do all the screening and make all the recommendations to the President and Attorney General on who should and should not be appointed to federal judgeships.

In the meantime they have already set up "mini-inquisitions" throughout the system to ensure that no mistakes are made — that the wrong kind of person doesn't

somehow slip through. These newly placed ideological "litmus tests" and lengthy questionnaires are being used to screen judicial candidates to ensure that they have the "right" views on everything from foreign policy to God.

Men and women with exceptional legal experience are now being denied the opportunity to serve in the Federal courts because they fail to answer one of the questions "properly" or hold memberships in groups not to the liking of the right wing hierarchy. A new form of Moral McCarthyism is taking hold.

A case in point: President Reagan was convinced to drop the nomination of his own Deputy Solicitor General Andrew Frey to a federal judgeship because a few powerful right-wing senators found out Frey made small donations to Planned Parenthood and the National Coalition to Ban Handguns.

Only the President and the United

States Senate stand in the way of this right-wing campaign to pack the federal bench with ideologues of their stripe. The President, with his laid back style of administration, is not likely to overrule recommendations by his friend, Attorney General Ed Meese. But the Senate has the power to reject nominations to the federal bench and in 1969 and 1970 did block Richard Nixon's nominations of Haysworth and Carswell to the Supreme Court. Whether this body will have the courage and wisdom to stand up to Falwell and company remains to be seen.

Many of us who opposed the reelection of Reagan last year did so on the grounds that we feared the takeover of the federal judiciary by his right-wing supporters. It appears our prophecies are being fulfilled. ♦

VALERIE FERIGNO GETS OVATION AT GAYFEST

Mayor of West Hollywood (California) Valerie Ferigno, gave a thoughtful and inspiring speech interrupted by much applause and ending with a standing ovation during GayFest activities on June 29 in New Orleans' Washington Square Park.

Ms. Ferigno, openly lesbian mayor of the newly-incorporated city nestled between Los Angeles and Beverly Hills had been traveling to several cities to speak about gay pride.

Her speech stressed the attitude of total involvement and the need "to go ahead and do it, whether you win or lose," in a reference to her run for the council seat.

(As top vote-getter, the council elected her mayor.) "So many people said I couldn't possibly win, but I did."

Ferigno attributes her victory to the coalitions she built with certain parts of her constituency, particularly the elderly.

Ms. Ferigno urged the GayFest crowd: "We should get the rights we so richly deserve. But we have to work for them." ♦

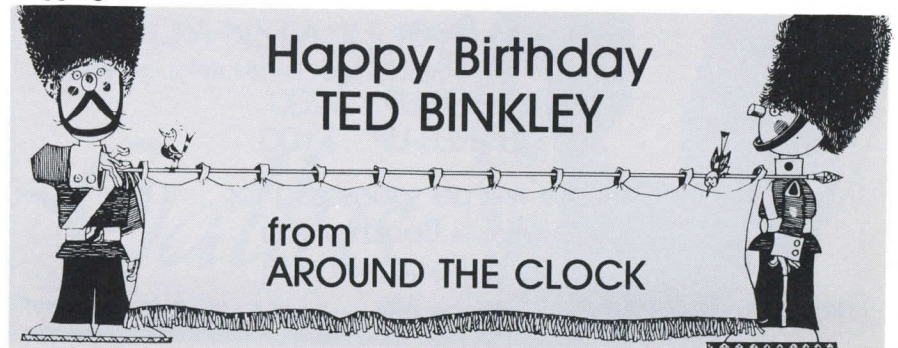

CLUB BODY CENTRES OPEN IN SOUTH & MIDWEST

A new chain of health spas designed for AIDS-conscious gay men officially opened its doors on July 1, Club Body Centre president Jack Campbell has announced.

Campbell has undertaken a nationwide tour beginning in San Diego and ending in the Northeastern states as ten cities open new or newly-refurbished facilities.

"My partners and I are committed to taking every step that will bring an end to the tragic outbreak of AIDS," Campbell said. "As individuals, we have each sought to educate gay men about AIDS. Now we are going to combine and expand our efforts."

According to new association guidelines, each health spa will provide a gym

or workout area, a whirlpool or swimming pool, extensive distribution and materials on AIDS risk reduction, as well as eliminate facilities viewed as conducive to high-risk sexual activities such as common rooms and poorly lit portal areas.

In addition, Campbell has made a personal donation of \$5,000 and pledged to raise a matching \$5,000 from new Club Body Centre owners to fund a Washington AIDS lobbying effort to broaden educational and research efforts. Campbell has long been a significant donor to gay civil rights causes.

Among those congratulating the new association on its initiatives was California assemblyman Art Agnos (D-San Francisco), a key leader in increasing his state's AIDS response.

"I also want to add my support for the initiatives you or leading in your business life," Agnos wrote Campbell. "I strongly believe that unless gay business leaders send a strong signal by their actions that

this crisis in the community is real and serious, public policy leaders will not act."

"Beyond those larger concerns," Agnos continued, "there is no question that the most effective AIDS education and behavior changes come from leadership within the community by respected people such as you are yourself. We must provide AIDS-conscious environments everywhere — not just in the political zones."

The initial member clubs in the new association are: Miami, Fort Lauderdale, New Orleans, Houston, Dallas, St. Louis, Indianapolis, Toledo, Cleveland (at West 32nd St.), and Akron.

Discussions with other clubs for eventual affiliation are already underway, Campbell said.

"The changes needed to make facilities AIDS-conscious are not just cosmetic," Campbell said. "Some clubs that would like to join us are only leasing space, and need to negotiate for either new locations

or new arrangements with existing landlords."

Campbell said memberships to use facilities in the new association will cost \$10 for six months. Individuals with current memberships at CBC facilities, commonly known as the Club Bath Chain, will have their cards honored until June 30, 1986.

Campbell launched the CBC chain in 1965. He now will devote his business interests to the new AIDS-conscious association. ♦

KOCH LOSES E.O.50 BID

New York State's highest court has ruled that New York City's Mayor Ed Koch overstepped his authority when he issued Executive Order 50, which bans the city from doing business with any group which discriminates against lesbians and gay men.

The state's highest appeals court was deciding on a case filed by the Archdiocese of New York, the Salvation Army and a Jewish social service agency Agduth Israel, which were protesting Koch's order in renewing contracts totaling nearly \$90 million for providing social services in the city.

In the June 28 decision, the appeals panel found (6-1) that Koch has "no authority to initiate such a policy under the city's charter." ♦

RED CROSS SENDING OUT RESULTS OF CONTROVERSIAL AIDS TEST

Blood donors who test positive for the presence of HTLV-III virus (suspected as the cause of AIDS) will be sent notices by blood banks that they have tested positive for the virus' antibodies.

The controversial test, which does not diagnose AIDS, but merely demonstrates the presence of the AIDS antibody, are given to every donor of blood in blood banks across the country.

However a positive test does not indicate that a person will get AIDS.

Doctors at New York City's Montifore Hospital report initial findings that only about 10 percent of those who test positive for the HTLV-III virus actually contract AIDS.

Only about 25 percent of those tested positive come down with AIDS-related

disorders.

Gay activists have attacked the tests because their results could be used to deny people employment, insurance, housing or vital services. ♦

Violence and threats against Northampton, Mass. lesbians that began three years ago have escalated recently. Lake last month a telephone caller threatened to blow up the Womynfire Bookstore and a man in Nazi uniform has been harassing patrons of a lesbian bar in town.

No bomb was found near the store, but police did find a note saying, "Lesbians must die. You are the ones ruining this country. Your morals will not be tolerated anymore." The note was signed by the National Socialist Party. The owner of the store had received two years ago.

In response to the earlier incidents Northampton Mayor Daniel Musante established a task force of homosexuals and city officials. He disbanded the group later, saying the problem had been solved. He is reported to have characterized the bomb threat as an isolated incident, adding, "There's no harassment here, this is a quiet town."

Phil Donahue, who hosts a nationally-syndicated television show focusing on contemporary issues, will receive the second annual Arthur Bell Award. Donahue was chosen because of the positive way he presents gay and lesbian issues on his television program. The Award honors Arthur Bell, a journalist and a founder of the modern gay and lesbian civil rights movement, and is given for outstanding contributions to gay and lesbian culture. Last year's award went to film historian Vito Russo.

Gloria Steinem and the Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund are each receiving the Robert Livingston Human Rights Award. Steinem, founder and publisher of *Ms. Magazine*, is a leading feminist and longtime supporter of equal rights for gay men and lesbians. Lambda is a non-profit legal organization handling a broad spectrum of cases relating to gay

and lesbian issues.

The Award honors the life of Robert Livingston, a writer, publisher and theatrical producer, who was also the first openly gay member of the New York City Human Rights Commission. At the same time, he was a member of Senator Daniel F. Moynihan's (D-NY) staff, and a leader in involving lesbians and gay men in the political arena. Past recipients of the Award include Judy Goldsmith, president of the National Organization for Women, Bella Abzug, president of Women USA, Congressman Henry Waxman (D-CA) and the Gay Men's Health Crisis.

The annual gala is held at the Waldorf Astoria to benefit the Human Rights Campaign Fund. HRCF is a political action committee supporting House and Senate candidates who favor gay and lesbian civil rights. The dinner will be Wednesday, October 9.
