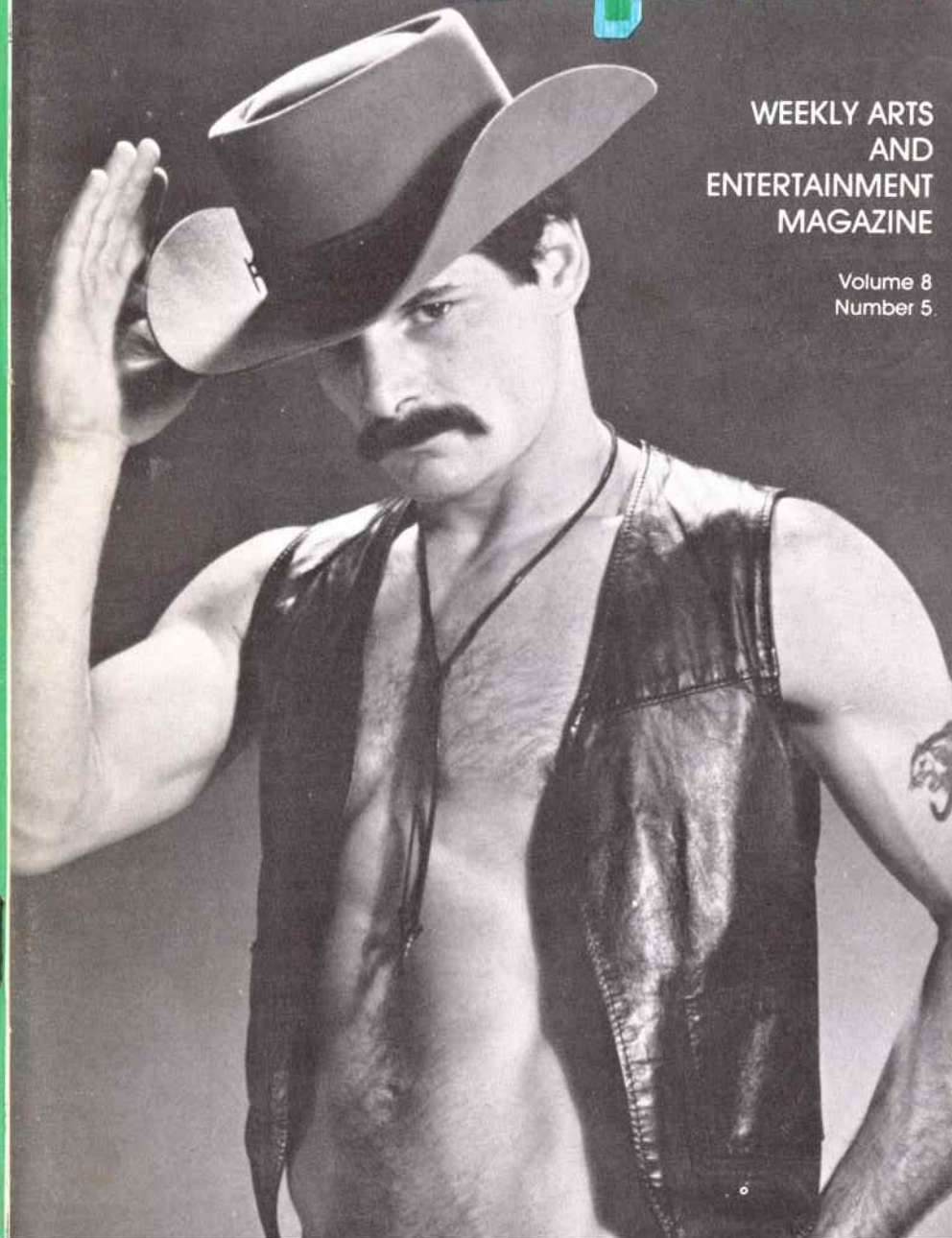

It's not all serious though. PALS also sponsors parties and has the beginnings of a bowling team going. For information write PALS, Box 72391, Atl 30339.

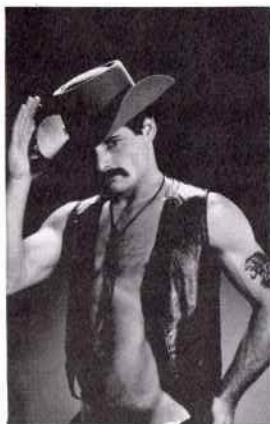

An open letter to the gay community on hepatitis B

Hepatitis B, a serious disease, may be sexually transmitted

Sexually transmitted diseases among the gay community are epidemic. Herpes has recently received a lot of attention; gonorrhea and syphilis are well known; but the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) recently issued a major recommendation for the prevention of another sexually transmitted disease: Hepatitis B. In their *Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report*, the CDC stated: "Susceptible homosexually active males should be vaccinated [against hepatitis B] regardless of their age or duration of their homosexual practices."

Gay men are at a high risk of contracting hepatitis B

In one study, from 51% to 76% of 3,816 gay men seen in five sexually transmitted disease clinics had evidence of past or present hepatitis B infection. Once infected, there's a 6% to 10% chance of becoming a carrier—capable of passing on the virus. The CDC estimated there are nearly 1 million carriers in the United States and that 100,000 of these carriers are gay men.

The hepatitis B virus can be passed on by contact with contaminated body fluids

such as saliva, urine, semen, and blood. The hepatitis B virus can be transmitted through tiny breaks in the skin or contact with mucous membranes. This can occur during intimate sexual contact and can lead to hepatitis B for the partner of an infected person. Although most patients recover and over half contracting hepatitis B do not get symptoms, there is no specific treatment and no known cure for hepatitis B infections.

Hepatitis B may lead to even more serious complications

For those who do get symptoms of hepatitis B, a mild

Why you should consult your doctor or clinic

The vaccine helps protect against infection caused by hepatitis B virus. This virus is an important cause of viral hepatitis, a disease mainly of the liver. Even mild forms of this disease may lead to serious complications and aftereffects, including liver cancer. There is no specific treatment for viral hepatitis.

Vaccination is recommended for persons who have a higher risk of becoming infected with hepatitis B virus because of frequent, close contact with infected people or exposure to body fluids from such people. It will not protect against hepatitis caused by viruses other than hepatitis B virus.

No serious adverse reactions were reported in over 6,000 individuals receiving the vaccine in clinical trials. The most frequent reaction was soreness at the point of injection, less

or severe "flu-like" sickness may continue for weeks or months. Ten percent of all infections become long lasting (chronic) with potential complications that are sometimes more serious than those of other sexually transmitted diseases. The serious complications include the chronic carrier state, chronic active hepatitis, chronic persistent hepatitis, cirrhosis, and even cancer of the liver. Every year almost 4,000 carriers die of cirrhosis. In addition, carriers have a risk 273 times greater than that of the general population of contracting a usually fatal form of liver cancer.

Now this serious sexually transmitted disease is usually preventable by vaccination with the new hepatitis B vaccine

After more than a decade of research and development, a new vaccine is available for prevention, *not treatment*, of hepatitis B. In clinical studies, the vaccine was highly effective in preventing hepatitis B infection and was generally well tolerated. No serious adverse reactions occurred in these studies.

The vaccination regimen consists of a series of three injections, the first two a month apart and the third, six months after the first. To be effective, the vaccine must be given before a person gets hepatitis B. The vaccine helps prevent the disease. It is *not effective as a treatment*. We suggest that you consult your doctor to determine if you should be vaccinated.

Common local reactions included redness, swelling, warmth or formation of a hard, lumplike spot. The local effects were usually mild and lasted no more than 2 days after vaccination. Occasionally, low-grade fever (less than 101°F) occurred. When it did, it usually lasted no longer than 48 hours following vaccination. In rare cases, fever over 102°F was reported.

More generalized complaints including malaise, fatigue, headache, nausea, dizziness, muscle pain, and joint pain were reported infrequently. Rash was reported rarely. As with any vaccine, broad use may reveal additional adverse reactions.

Your doctor or clinic knows what special care must be taken when administering the vaccine and in determining who should receive the vaccine. The vaccine is not intended for persons who are allergic to any of its components.

This experience causes some disappointment; because, as you know, beauty is only skin deep and unfortunately, many of these beauties do not carry a full deck, aside from their abusive use of drugs and alcohol.

When I run into someone I'm attracted to and if on the surface he appears to have some things on the ball, I find myself trying too hard to make this person like me. In doing this, I'm aware that I'm not the same relaxed person that I am around most people. I realize I'm not being fair to myself or someone else that could possibly be interested. I may smother this person with affection at one time and appear to be cold or stand-offish at another time. If I date someone only once or twice in a situation where I wanted more time with them, I find myself questioning why they were not interested in me. 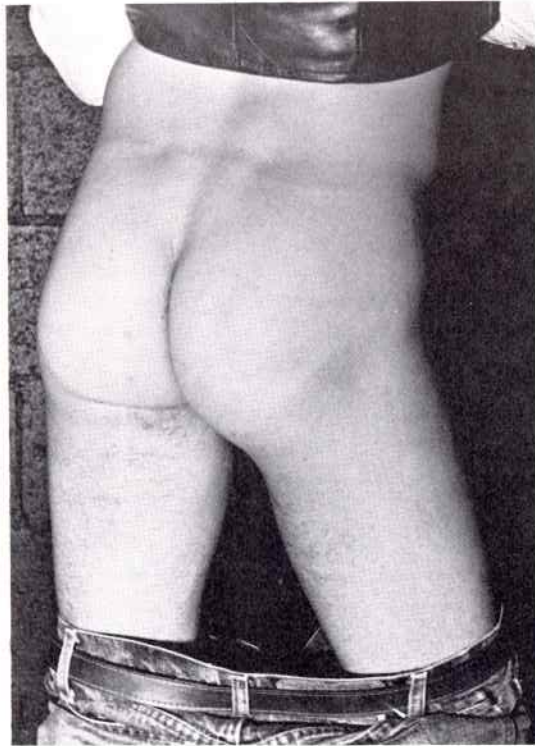

"TREASURE OF JUAN ALVAREZ" A TREASURE

"The Treasure of Juan Alvarez," the newest spark from the creative mind of Lewis Routh is indeed that ... a treasure.

It seems the more opportunities Mr. Routh has to give his fantasies concrete form, the better they become. Though his beginning efforts seemed, perhaps, a trifle 'high-schoolish,' "Juan Alvarez" is beginning to evidence a budding maturity in Routh's style which flourishes in his chosen milieu — melodrama.

Self-described as offering 'the best in illegitimate theatre,' "Juan Alvarez" is true slap-stick and farce, and cannot be taken seriously; unless you consider Routh as being serious about making people laugh.

The cast has given the best characterizations I have yet seen in any of Routh's plays and it would be difficult to single out any one performance, although the roles of Inez de Oro and Pedro Mortinez (Randall Willis and Lemmie Smith resp.) were played to the hilt. No less well-played, however, were the roles of Humbolt A. Jones-Rob Hadaway (cute), Izabella Alvarez-Robyn Riggs (wonderfully melodramatic), and

Carlos Castillo-Dean Turner (quite good as the hunchback). Aquilla played by Jimmy Greenway was well-played but often unintelligible. He needs just a little less emphasis on the speech impediment. Annetta (Tina DeVore) was a big surprise, to say the least. Ms. DeVore gives the role a camp and vigor that make Annetta, a saucy but quite 'virtuous' tart, the most believable role in the play; and of course, Lewis Routh handles the role of Juan Alvarez with his usual ease and humor.

The play and the fast-paced revue that follows are wonderful for an evening of uninterrupted laughter and fun. Don't go expecting serious theatre because you'll probably be disappointed but if you want an enjoyable escape you'll be delighted.

pleased by the station's sensitivity. The series was broadcast this week on Channel 11 news at 6 and 11pm. Several suggestions made by the preview audience were reflected in the final version of the series.

"I'm pleased," said Frank Scheuren, "but the Moral Majority is going to be screaming at them for being fag lovers." Afterwards he visited Channel 11 vice-president Ron Becker and complimented him for the "sensitive and objective handling of the report." Scheuren urged that interested viewers send their comments to: Paul Crawley, c/o Channel 11, 1611 W. Peachtree St., Atl 30309.

The five-part series included: "A Sense of Community," "Solving Community Problems," "Growing Political and Business Clout," "A Minority within a Minority — Lesbians," and "Religion in the Lesbian/Gay Community."

Excluding those who did not wish to be identified, the preview audience included: Ted Binkley (co-owner of Crazy Rayz and Illusions) of the Atlanta Royal Court; Frank Butler and Jeff McIntyre of the Atlanta Gay Men's Chorus; Gene Loring with Hal Myers of Havarim (lesbian/gay Jewish organization) and Christopher's Kind Bookstore; the Rev. Jimmy Brock of the Atlanta Metropolitan Community Church; Lew Katoff of the Atlanta Business and Professional Guild; Allida Black

of the Atlanta Gay Center; Foy Nix and Curtis (Bear) Mattich of the Midtown Service Center; Deenie Dudley and Rita Binn from the lesbian community; Lewis Routh, Doug Brown, Gregg Daugherty and Marlin Haindfield of Midtown Productions; Frank Scheuren, who, according to Crawley, was "my unofficial field producer"; and Jim Heverly, Fritz Rathmann and Ken Bond of Cruise.

Coincidentally, the series was broadcast during a time when T.V. ratings are monitored. Channel 11 will keep close tabs on how the series affected their ratings. Crawley said that the first phone call he received on the series came last week from an apparently gay man. Referring to an advertisement in T.V. Guide, the caller told Crawley, "Why don't you leave us alone ... we don't all march!" Crawley said he asked the caller to reserve judgement until he had seen the series. Other advertisements for the series appeared in T.V. Week and in the Atlanta Journal and Constitution.

"Surprisingly," Crawley revealed, "the station gave me the freedom to do the series my way. My goal was to be fair and objective."

Some memorable scenes in the series included: Bear Mattich in work clothes and tattooed arms simply stating, "People don't come here (Midtown Service Center) for anything but to get their car worked on"; Dan Bradley promising the

crowd at the first ABPG Installation and Awards Banquet that "we are not going to sit at the back of the bus for the next 200 years," and the mother of a lesbian who neatly sums up the current state of affairs with, "Society



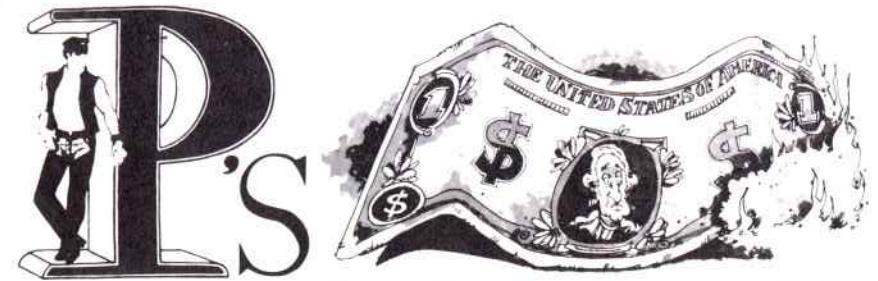
