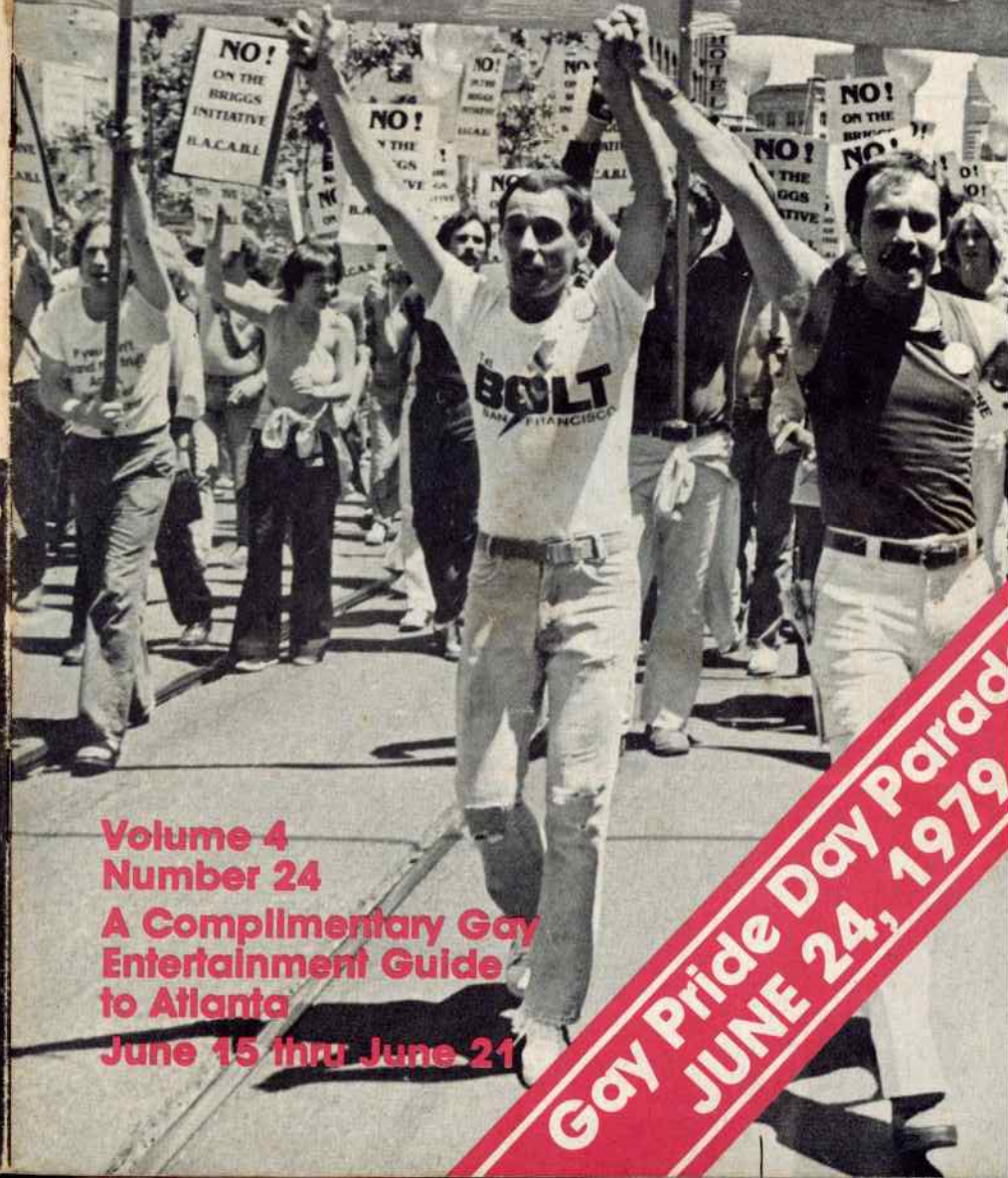

We here at CRUISE are very heartened by the response we have received from our friends, advertisers and readers since our name cropped up on Channel 11's sensationalized expose' of teenage male prostitution, "Boys For Sale", and our arrest for selling and distributing obscene material. During the past week we have talked with most of the owners and managers of Atlanta's gay businesses and all have been supportive, offering their time, facilities and money to support us in our fight against Channel 11 and the County Solicitor's Office.

While everything is not firmed up at this writing, tentative plans are to form a committee which will be in charge of raising funds and seeing that they are used as intended. We haven't come up with a name yet but it might be called something like the Gay Action Committee or Committee For Legal Aid for Gay Causes. It's immediate aim will of course be to aid those of us at CRUISE who were arrested with our legal expenses. And if the attorneys so advise, to enter a suit against Channel 11 for damages suffered as a result of their associating our company with male prostitution on "Boys For Sale". However if there were funds left over or if the need continued, the committee might continue to function to aid other gays with

similar problems. While nothing has been worked out yet, it has been suggested that this committee be coordinated with the legal aid efforts of the Atlanta Gay Center. CRUISE and CAVCO, INC. have pledged that any money recovered by a suit against Channel 11 would be donated back to the committee (after all legal expenses were paid) to be used in future projects or to be distributed to gay organizations within the community.

Details should be worked out by early next week and will be announced in next week's CRUISE WEEKLY. However it is not too early to announce that a benefit show is being worked up for Monday, June 25th at The Sweet Gum Head. John Austin has offered their facilities and the door money that night, and several entertainers have volunteered their time. Again we should be able to give you all the details next week, but make your plans now to be at The Sweet Gum Head that Monday night, the day after the Gay Pride March.

Speaking of Gay Pride, we want to commend those who are planning this year's Gay Pride Celebration here in Atlanta and urge everyone to participate. We particularly think it would be great to see twenty or thirty cars and floats in the parade. Last year's march proved that this kind of event can draw gays from all groups and can gain us a lot of favorable attention from the media. We hope everyone will make plans now to be there on Sunday, June 24th to make their own personal statement for gay rights by marching in the parade. Besides, it should be a lot of fun.

There are a lot of contests going on in town this week. I attended the Blueboy Man of the Year Regional at Numbers Sunday night and last night saw this year's version of "Mr. Locker Room". I never cease to be amazed at the number of good looking men whom I have never seen before who show up in these contests. And the

time and expense they put into their appearances must be enormous. It's a shame we only get to see them for a few minutes in those sexy outfits they wear in Sportswear, Do Your Own Thing or whatever the category is called where they come out in original clothes. I hope we can do a photo feature in full color in CRUISE sometime in the future spotlighting some of the trend-setting fashions.

The Mr. Locker Room Contest has always been more than just-another-bar contest, but this year's event took on the flavor of a national event with entries from Chicago, Miami and Raleigh, North Carolina in addition to lots of local talent. It was a special treat to discover Tiffany Jones, who emceed the Blueboy Contest the previous night, competing (out of drag, of course). While he was not one of the winners, The Texas Tornado was an impressive contender in all categories, proving he is a versatile and dynamic entertainer. Another treat

was to see R.C. Cola on stage again. R.C. has been traveling a lot in the past year treating gay audiences all over the country to his spectacular one man show. I hadn't realized how much we here in Atlanta had been missing until I saw him do some of his new material. He performed several truly outstanding numbers. But perhaps the most impressive thing at Mr. Locker Room was the number and variety of acts presented by The Hollywood Hots. Mama Dee mentioned the other day that Roski wanted her to rent another building. Now I know why. They need it to store all those costumes. All joking aside, the productions that were presented last night were all super. If you haven't been to see the shows at The Locker Room lately, we urge you to go, they're better than ever.

And now, we're looking forward to Mr. Gay Georgia tomorrow night. We'll give you a report on it next week.

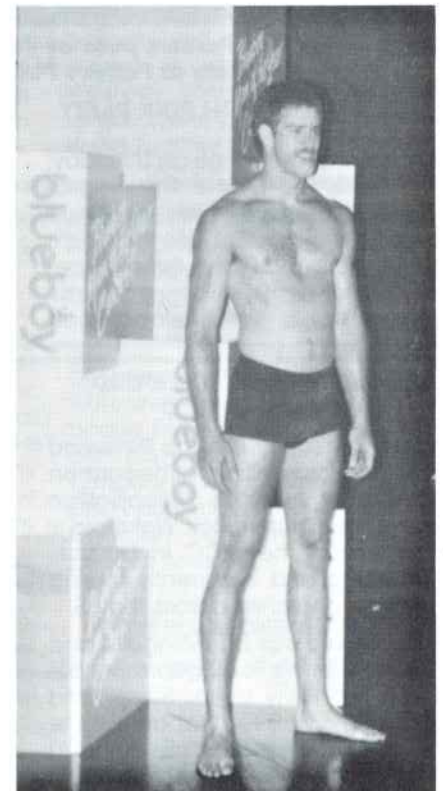

A fresh group of entertainers billing themselves as "Illusions" opened their new show at Numbers this week in the cabaret room, and we recommend that you see all the work that these performers are bringing to Atlanta audiences. Imported from Miami Beach, this troupe is famous for its studiously accurate impressions of famous film and concert celebrities.

The cast includes choreographer Jennifer Raquel, Miss Miami Beach 1977; and incomparable Diana Ross look-alike named Crystal Woods; beautiful and sultry Lauren Thomas; Carol Cunningham, reknown for her fiery Grace Jones; talented newcomer Destiny Hunter, a local addition to the cast; dancer Joey Pelli; and electric Nikki Adams, who lends a unique vivacity to her impersonation of Shirley MacLaine.

The opening night show held on Tuesday, June 12th, was a great success and exemplified a new style of entertainment for local crowds. Shows are scheduled at 1:30 am and 4:30 am Tuesdays through Sundays in the cabaret room. Members of the club as well as the general public will be charged a cover at the cabaret door, but, as always, there is no additional charge to members who are patronizing the disco at Numbers. FANTASY IDEATION IN GAY MEN

Have you ever paid much attention to the fantasies that run through your head while you are having sex? What are some of the daydreams that you experience while engaging in sex with another person? Traditionally, close followers of Freud and psychoanalytic theory have looked upon daydreams and fantasies as defenses which could be linked to some kind of "neurotic maladjustment." But in fact, up until the last ten years, no actual research had been conducted or made public to confirm or challenge this theoretical position.

Then in 1972, Barbara Hariton, a doctoral candidate in psychology at City University of New York, collected a great deal of research data on the subject of fantasies experienced during sex. Briefly, she sampled 141 married women to determine norms and content of women's fantasies while they were engaging in sex with their

husbands. The results revealed that nearly two-thirds of the participants (65%) reported experiencing some kind of fantasy/daydream while having sex with their partners. Several popular themes emerged, such as: "being with an imaginary lover"; "being overpowered or forced to surrender"; and "pretending to do something forbidden".

Dugald Steward, a local psychologist conducted a somewhat comparable study - but with men - in 1977. He sampled 157 married men and the results indicated that erotic fantasies are also common (65% reported experiencing erotic fantasy during marital sex) among married heterosexual men. Again, some popular fantasy themes emerged, such as "lying back as a woman makes love to me"; "having sex with another woman"; and "seeing parts of other women's bodies".

Now, a doctoral candidate at an Atlanta college is conducting a sim-

ilar study with Gay Male Couples. Any man who has lived with his lover/partner for six months or more is eligible to participate in the study and he/they need not be residents of Atlanta. Of course, participants are assured of confidentiality and anonymity. Token compensation and results of the study are offered on request.

Undoubtedly, research of this nature will tend to explode a number of sexual myths and misconceptions about so-called "normal" sexual behavior. If you are a Gay male and currently living with your lover/partner for at least 6 months, you are encouraged to "lend a helping hand" and participate in the study. If you are not eligible, yet know of friends who are, please pass on this information. 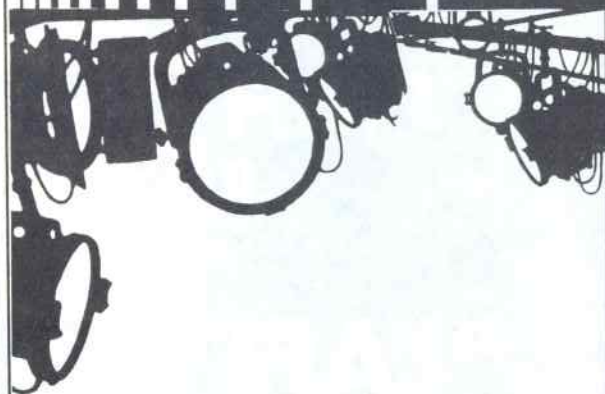

INTERVIEW

Born in Bradenton, Florida, Tiger Lil began an active interest in the field of female impersonation at the young age of 15. Tiger began entertaining audiences at 16 years old under the name "Michelle." Two years later, Tiger was hired at Atlanta's Onyx Lounge, and a fier a year and a half she became show director, choreographer, and seamstress for this popular club. Tiger Lil will be starring in a special at Numbers disco on Sunday, June 24th, at 4 am. Called "Tiger Lilies in Bloom," the show will be dedicated to all local gay bar employees.

CRUISE: Was your image different when you first started female impersonation?

TIGER: Yes. I was super bricks.

CRUISE: Did you initially adopt comedy as your area of entertainment?

TIGER: I've always been wild. I never took the glamour part of drag seriously. That's what made it so easy to be hooty.

CRUISE: Why don't you take the glamour aspect of female impersonation seriously?

TIGER: Because there's so much competition in that field. Everybody wants to be a beauty. And it's really much easier to make people laugh if you're able to do it.

CRUISE: Why are you so superb at comedy?

TIGER: Well, I think it starts from being able to accept everybody for what they are, and make fun WITH it instead of AT it. And it creates an understanding between me and the audience, and they can appreciate little gestures that they can relate to that are amusing and considered by them to be comedy. Comedy is easy for me to do because I can laugh at a lot of things rather than be hurt by a lot of things.

CRUISE: Why did you live as a street hustler for a period of time?

TIGER: As a means of surviving. Also, I didn't know enough about the gay

bar business and didn't appreciate the show business enough to want to be in that field. I felt that street life was very easy. It was about as laid back as you could get just to go out and make the money that you need to get by without trying to be grand and have everything. And I liked that lifestyle because it cut out a lot of the hassles that young people have to go through here in Atlanta.

CRUISE: How many times have you been arrested for street prostitution?

TIGER: Too many. Quite a few times.

CRUISE: Have you stopped entirely now?

TIGER: Yes, I've stopped street hustling. But I always appreciate a man with money.

CRUISE: Why did you leave The Onyx for a while?

TIGER: To venture out into Atlanta so that a lot of people who didn't go to The Onyx could see me. The only place I wanted to go was the showplace of the south, the Sweet Gum Head. And when I had the offer to go there, then I just decided to venture out there. And I got a lot of exposure doing it. I learned a lot about the goods and bads of the entertainment field. I enjoyed working at the Sweet Gum Head very much, because it proved to me that I was appreciated by other kinds of audiences.

CRUISE: How would you compare the audiences at the Sweet Gum Head and The Onyx?

TIGER: You have on "the great gay way" a lot of mixed-up young gay people that like to party and have a good time. At The Onyx, most of our clientele are the settled types. They are everyday working people who come to spend the money they make where they don't have to be important or stand out. At The Onyx, they can just go and enjoy what they see. People can come and be comfortable and not worry about whether they look flawless and things like that. That's the difference between "the great gay way" people and the midtown people.

CRUISE: Do you hold any specific philosophy about entertainment?

TIGER: Atlanta is a very hard town to be good in, because there are so many people who want to perform, and there's so many people trying. I've been entertaining the Atlanta audience for four years, and for them to still appreciate what I do makes it worth being in it. And that's why I'm still doing it. I hope in the future I'll be able to create new and exciting things, and more funny things.

CRUISE: There appears to be a lack of peffiness and more of a sense of morale in The Onyx cast. Why did you feel this is true?

TIGER: The reason why we don't want to say anything bad about other entertainers is because we don't want anyone saying anything bad about us, especially when we work hard, too. And I feel that any entertainer who is out there working on a stage in Atlanta doesn't need or deserve criticism from the other entertainers. I don't like being a nasty person. Our

cast has proven that by working together, you can achieve more.

CRUISE: What do you feel will be the results of this current trend in Atlanta to clean up the streets of gay hustlers and gay pornography?

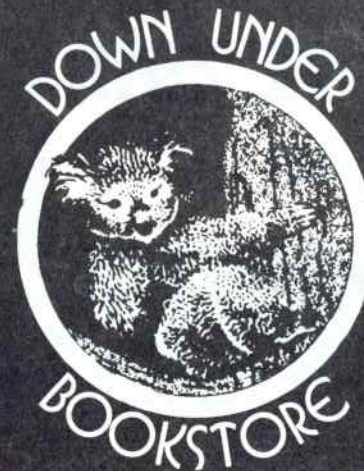
TIGER: I feel the results will be very minor, just like the prostitution that flared up here. All it did was draw more prostitutes here, and I feel that by putting shows like "Boys For Sale" on TV, hustlers will be drawn from every state. If anything, it's going to draw to the problem. Then they'll drop it like they dropped the prostitution. They're not being as serious as they could be anyway, because the gay people in Atlanta do spend their money.

CRUISE: How much longer will you be a female impersonator?

TIGER: I hope for a long time. I enjoy what I'm doing. I've been doing a lot of numbers for the past three years, and every time I do them, they still go over. I love Atlanta because it was the first place where I felt free to do what I wanted on a stage. □

During the week ending May 26, 1979, WXIA, TV Channel 11 ran an indepth series about teenage male prostitution called "Boys for Sale". During the Thursday night segment of this series they spent several minutes showing photographs of the office of Cavco Inc. While they attached a disclaimer that "As far as they had been able to determine, Cavco Inc., was not involved in printing child pornography", the inference was clear that Cavco was involved in both child pornography and male prostitution, and that the GAY Community was somehow responsible for the problem of teenage male prostitution. A strong editorial followed on Friday night which called on aroused citizens to help stamp out boy prostitution. On Monday, June 4th, three members of the CRUISE staff were arrested and charged with the sale and distribution of obscene materials. Obviously the County Solicitor's Office felt they must do something in answer to the call to "clean up this problem" and CRUISE was the most visible target. Most of Atlanta's Gays were outraged by the series and feel this is a time for the Atlanta Gay Community to unite to fight this persecution. The Gay Community Committee for CRUISE has been organized to raise money to pay the legal expenses involved with defending the CRUISE staffers that were arrested and to study the legal actions that may be taken against Channel 11. 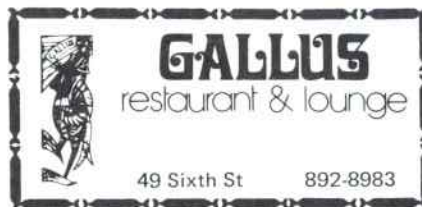

I Cover The Dryfront by Rascal Davis



There are disadvantages that a writer must seek to overcome to gain the type of recognition (read: limelight) available to performing artists. The first being, of course, that the writer generally conducts his art in a space not suited to an audience. In fact, his working space is often not even suitable to himself. He therefore forgoes the exultant enthusiasm of immediate audience response. There are, even, several occasions in which the writer, once finished with his piece, does not want to have it exposed to the public. But that is eccentricism, and not a point for generalities. The writer suffers the guiding hand of director, firmly and quietly leading

him through the stages of a performance. He has no costumer to adapt his visage to that most appropriate to the image he seeks to convey. And there is no choreographer beating out time and pace to make transitions move swiftly, meaningfully or gracefully. Yes, it is without trick mirrors and velcro that the writer finally completes a piece worthy of presentation. The very act of becoming a serious (or, should I say, working) writer is very difficult. It becomes a test of his selfishness and ego to believe that locking himself into solitude for the purpose of recording thoughts and facts is a worthwhile occupation. There

are no auditions where the writers assemble to demonstrate their deft ability at a typewriter or gains feedback concerning the clever-quotas of his favorite bar notes. And never in the history of authorship has there been a tale of a Hemingway or Fitzgerald who suddenly could not perform so the understudy, some young newspaper hack or hallmark poet, was given the chance for overnight success and stardom.

The only similarity lies in the opportunity to have the art seen by others, if that desire exists. The actor trudges down Audition avenue, hoping for the important break. The dancer stretches and tears his body hoping to compete with the others vying for the single opening with a major company. The singer scales down the possibilities of a band to work with. The writer dutifully keeps his journal up to date, interviews interesting people, makes short stories from his dreams, and makes clever notes on the latest trends only to have them pile up next to his stacks of rejection notices from magazine editors and book publishers.

The playwright faces an even more terrifying future in selling his plays. He must convince not just an editor for space in a regularly published magazine, but a producer to not only pay him for the work, but to also supply a theater, a cast, their costumes, the lights, a director and enough promotion to try and earn back his investment. In these days of closely watched pennies it is not an easy thing. That is why the Atlanta New Play Project is a wonderfully inventive and encouraging idea.

Organized in the spring of 1978, the New Play Project has grown to eleven theatre companies, nine of which will be presenting two performances of a new "work-in-progress" during the two week project. These new works may be by playwrights living in the Southeast, company developed, or some other version of new theatrical

exploration. The presentation of these works may take the form of a staged reading or a full production which is experimental in nature. In-depth discussions of these works are an integral part of the project and will be conducted by guest moderator Robert Crawford, theater consultant and former Chairman of the Theatre Panel of the National Endowment for the Arts.

Participating in this year's Project, beginning June 15 and lasting thru June 29 are the Academy Theatre presenting **NYNY**. Ezra Wittner's play deals with personalities in conflict at an old newsstand in New York. Also entered by the Academy is **Sharpshooter** by Cory Brynum, set before the Battle of Gettysburg during the Civil War. It centers on the relationships and premonitions of men involved in mental conflict. Wittner and Brynum are both Atlanta playwrights.

As its presentation the Alliance Theatre has chosen to present a staged reading of a new play by Atlanta playwright Lesley Havard. The emphasis of this "non-production" will be on the script. It will be considered an unfinished work at the onset of rehearsal period and it will go through rewrite as it is explored with its actors, director and dramatizations.

Both Our Houses by Jim Peck is chosen by The Imaginary Theatre. It is a suspense play about deliberate and accidental murder; about the impotence of modern religion and about the reality of evil close to home. On the Chinese calendar 1965 was the year of the Snake. 1965 was also the year of increased American bombing of Vietnam, more American troops involved in direct combat, the beginning of the peace movement, the murder of Civil Rights workers, and the rise of women's liberation. It is the essence of the year that the Just Us Theatre has sought to capture in **The Year of the Snake** and its toll on a middle class Black family.

Lowery Among the Immortals by Thomas E. Fuller, this years selection by the Peachtree Walk Theatre was selected from among the scripts read in the New Playwrights Readers Theatre. The play deals with the life and times of one Thaddeus S. Lowery — poet, playwright, and professional neurotic. Lowery's world is explored in a free-wheeling excursion headed by his psychiatrist, his best friends, the UN Security Council, and a small medieval army. All these people are concerned why he's stopped writing plays and started writing pomography.

Eddie Willinsky's **Rapid Transit** will be directed by Edward Billups III as People Survival Theatre's entry this year. **Rapid Transit** takes the audience on a journey through moving sets, video screens with sights and sounds of the world of **Rapid Transit**. Dancers move in and out of the scene as a look is given to the lives of those trapped in the endless circle of the **Rapid Transit**.

Power No. 9 was conceived by Gerald Irvin, faculty member of the Proposition Drama School. The play moves in a ludicrous style from the point of real-life situations and characteristics it's people set in the confines of a symbol-filled bus, constructed to give the audience a full view of the future.

Theatre Atlanta Off Peachtree will present two one-act plays by Claudia Noble, a playwright from Tallahassee, Florida. **The Real Truth Abot Oatmeal** and **Blood** explore the almost surreal conditions of insular lives, and display an age range from 12 to 80 years old.

A one-hour theatre event by, about and for women, **Red Composition No. 1**, will be the Theatrical Outfits offering. This collaborative project is based on the life experience of women; using autobiographical material of the performers and their parents and grand parents as well as historical, autopological, sociological and literary sources.


