

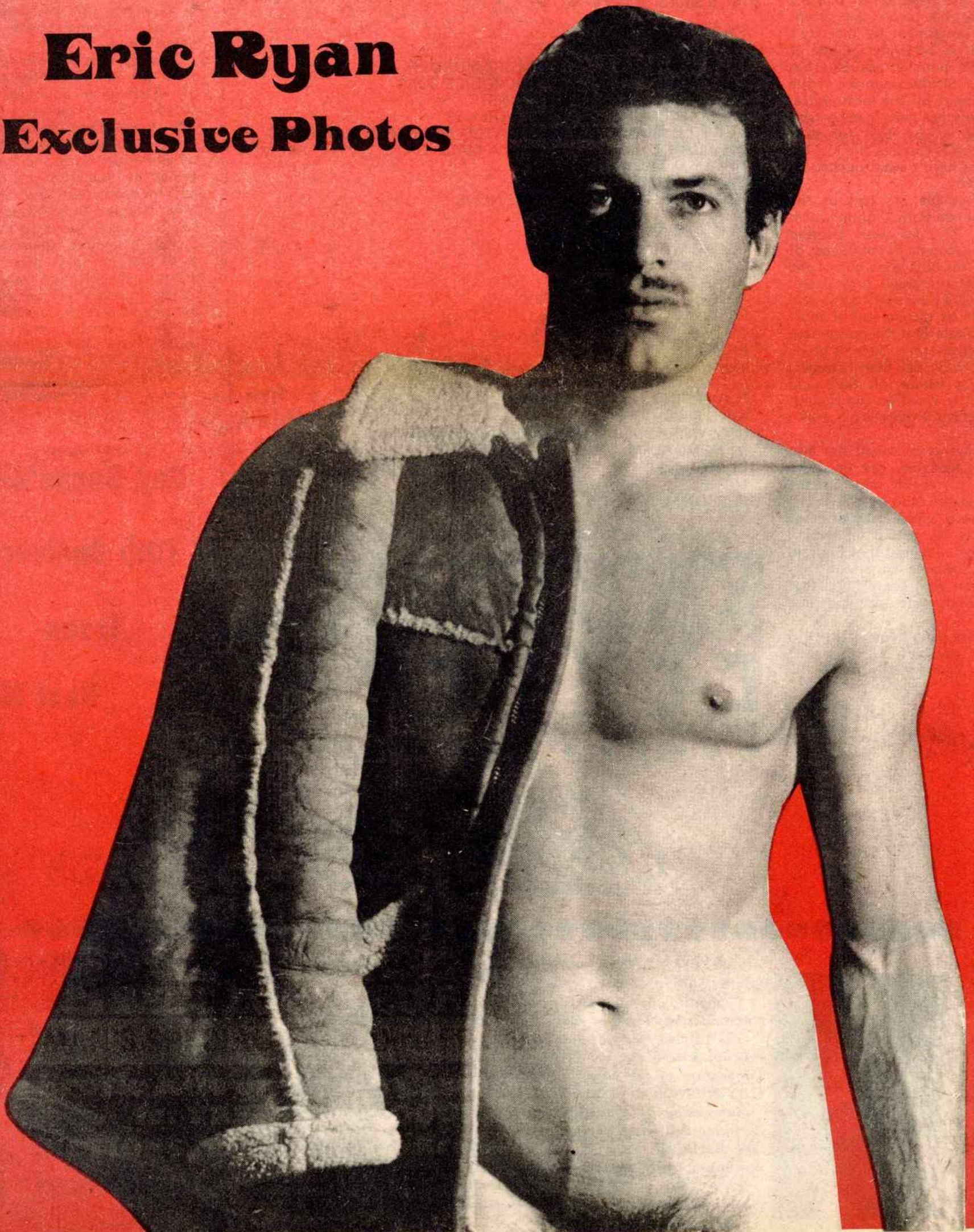

The San Diego Gay Community has been the recent target for harassment by the city's vice squad. A bartender at one of San Diego's popular gay bars has told a GAY SCENE reporter of the bar harassment by the local police. He said there has been many arrests of patrons in gay bars for such simple things as caresses and kissing. The charges haven't even touched on sexual activity.

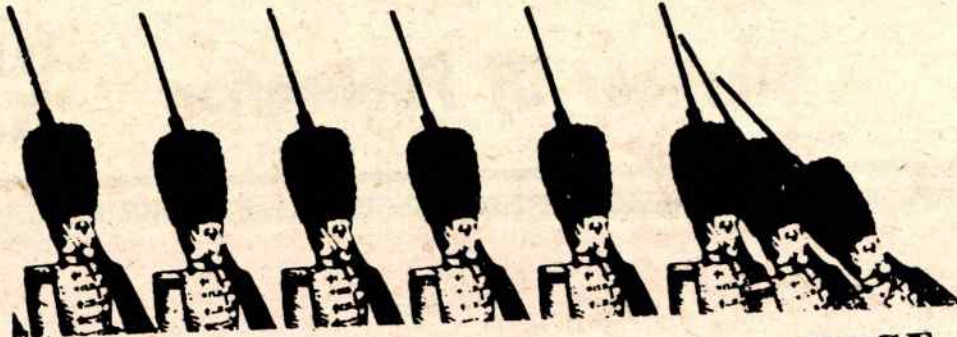
There was the big raid of the Fourth Avenue Bath Club in which a number of men were arrested along with a couple of employees of the club. This bust grew out of the objection of the club's orgy room.

Although these cases are expected to be thrown out of court it's unfortunate that the police have nothing better to do, such as going after real criminals, than harassing gays. It's a waste of time and money, not to mention the anguish suffered by those who were arrested.

The Denver vice squad has also been busy harassing gay bars and baths. In a recent raid on the Ballpark Health Club by 6 officers, patrons were given citations for alleged acts of public indecency. The manager was told that the raid was made because of phone calls from women who complained that their husbands were spending time there.

There have been frequent visits to three local gay bars but no arrests have been made - only lots of ID checks.

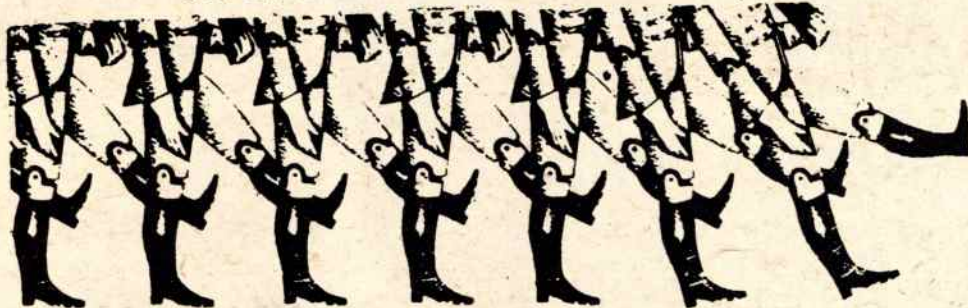

Hopes Guilty Of Danzinger Murder

Brooklyn, NY - After deliberating for more than 5 hours, after a 6 day trial, the jury returned a guilty verdict against Richard Hopes of the May, 1978 murder of Peter Moore Danzinger, a real estate investor who lived at 138 State Street.

After his arrest last May, Hopes confessed to having stabbed Danzinger, his employer for the past 11 years. The defense said that the stabbing resulted from a struggle following an argument and was not premeditated.

The prosecution said that Hopes had attempted to take money from Danzinger and in the ensuing struggle, the stabbing resulted which would be classified as a "felony murder."

The jury convicted Hopes on 2 counts — intentional murder and felony murder. They also convicted him on 2 counts of robbery, but the judge said he would consider setting

aside the robbery verdict, which would be included in the felony murder charge.

Hopes will be sentenced on May 4, 1979 and could get 15 years to life.

Hopes, who is 33, is a known hard drug user with several arrests on his record. He confessed to having beaten Danzinger with an iron and heavy pot prior to stabbing him. The Kings County medical examiner testified during the trial that no evidence of these blows was found on Danzinger's body. Death was caused by 2 stab wounds, either of which could have been fatal, the medical examiner said.

Peter Danzinger had been a business partner with Allan Kalenberg for some 20 years in Brooklyn Heights, NY. They owned property here, in East Hampton, NY and in Puerto Rico. Mr. Kalenberg resides most of the time in Puerto Rico.

San Francisco Gays Seek Police Jobs

Over 300 gays have requested information on how to apply for jobs as police officers, according to a report from the Gay Outreach Program.

Avowed gays are denied employment by every law enforcement agency in the country except in San Francisco, where 12 gay deputies are members of the sheriff's department.

Les Morgan, who spent 5 months distributing leaflets to gay bars and organizations as head of the gay recruitment drive, said he thought they would be doing well "if we get even 2% of the new hires."

Thirty-year-old John Abney, who joined the Sheriff's Department 18 months ago is an open gay and one

of the candidates for job as cop. He came out in 1973, after moving to San Francisco from New Mexico.

In a recent interview Abney asked not to be photographed and says that he doesn't believe in flaunting his homosexuality.

"I'm not an 'avowed' gay, wearing my heart on my sleeve. I'm openly and honestly gay. If someone asks me, they'll get an honest answer. But I don't run around offering the information. Homosexuality isn't my religion. It just happens to be my sexual orientation. Making a cause out of being a homosexual cop isn't going to advance the cause of gay liberation. Being a good cop will."

Assassination Trial Begins

San Francisco, Cal. - The trial of Dan White, 32, the former City Supervisor charged with the assassination last November 27th of Mayor George Moscone and Supervisor Harvey Milk has begun.

White, a former cop and fireman

honored for acts of valor, has admitted invading the City Hall officers and killing both men with a .38-caliber gun. If convicted, White could receive the death penalty because the victims were public figures.

Lesbian Couple Become Parents

Bobbi and Lynn of Oakland, California were both born in the same charity hospital in Louisiana, but they didn't meet until 20 years later. They are both lesbians in an interracial relationship.

Thanks to artificial insemination they are the proud parents of a baby girl named Sparkle Christel, who is now 4 months old. Lynn's brother was the donor.

The story of Lynn and Bobbi's quest to become parents was told to Judie Telfer of the Knight/Ridder Newspapers.

Lynn, who is white and Bobbi, who is black, said they couldn't bear the thought of Bobbi having sex with a man to become pregnant, so they decided on insemination.

They discovered that the doctor's fee was \$50 for each insemination until Bobbi could become pregnant was more than they could afford.

After reading about insemination they paid a male friend to provide the semen and they performed the insemination themselves to no avail.

Then their luck changed when Lynn's brother agreed to donate the semen. They found a clinic where a kind nurse taught them about the correct procedure for insemination.

After 3 inseminations Bobbi became pregnant.

After attending natural childbirth classes together, the couple were ready for the big event.

When the baby was brought to Bobbi, she said in front of the nurses who didn't know of Lynn's and her relationship, "Gosh, Lynn, she's white just like you."

When asked why Bobbi became the mother instead of Lynn, Lynn said, "Bobbi knows how it feels to be a mother, but being a butch, there's no way I would ever be able to have a baby."

Verrill Murderer Implicated In Unsolved Cases

Paul Bateson, the convicted killer of Addison Verrill, has been sentenced to from 20 years to life.

The case's prosecutor told the court that Bateson had boasted to an acquaintance that he had killed other men. According to witness Richard Ryan, Bateson told him that he liked to kill and that he had dismembered the bodies of other victims, put them in garbage bags and threw them into the Hudson River.

During the past 2 years 6 bodies

have been found in the Hudson River. The mutilated bodies, all unidentified, began turning up at 3 month intervals beginning Christmas, 1975. The former laboratory technician has been named as a suspect in these slayings.

However, there is no direct proof against Bateson in these murders.

Bateson is convicted of killing Verrill, a 36-year-old Variety film critic, on Sept. 14, 1977 in Verrill's apartment at 2 Horatio Street, NYC.

Why Can't A Fellow Take A Male Date To The Prom?

Cumberland, R.I. - Special to GAY SCENE - Paul Gilbert created quite a problem when he asked permission of school officials to bring another boy as his date to the junior prom at Cumberland High School.

Paul asked for a hearing before the School Committee after the high school principal denied his request. However, Paul's father asked the committee to cancel this permission after the news became known all over the country.

Paul said he was very nervous attending class for the first time since accounts of his request were published.

Discussing the reaction of fellow students, Paul said: "They were yelling and screaming, practically the whole student body. Every class I went to, people stopped to look at me. They asked me for my autograph. It was kind of sick."

Paul is an avowed gay and felt it was only natural to attend the prom with another male. After asking around, he found Ed Miskevich

agreeable to being his escort.

The School Committee said they have decided against the granting of a hearing to Paul on the advice of its attorney, Superintendent Robert G. Condon said.

"This has nothing to do with the homosexual situation," Condon said. "All we are doing is abiding by the request of the parents with respect to a minor child."

Condon added that the student council and most of the student body oppose Paul's request.

Charles Noice, a representative of the National Gay Task Force in Rhode Island, is working with Paul to help him get permission to go with Ed.

"It's very clearly discrimination. He's not being allowed to go with the date of his choice."

Noice said he believes this is the first case in the U.S. of a gay asking to go to a prom with a male escort. He cited dances for gay college students as being relatively common.

GAY MOVEMENT NEWS

FEDERAL GAYS RIGHTS BILL — A bill to protect gays against discrimination in housing, employment and federally assisted programs has been introduced into Congress by Rep. Henry A. Waxman and Rep. Ted Weiss. The bill is co-sponsored by 38 other members of the House of Representatives. Weiss was the initial sponsor of the New York Gay Rights bill when he was a member of the City Council there.

G A A / N Y D E N O U N C E S VOELLER-BIGOT DEBATES. The Gay Activists Alliance has denounced Bruce Voeller for his scheme to enrich himself and the avowed enemies of gay people. Dr. Voeller, through the Royce Carlton Agency, is sending ads to gay groups asking that they sponsor "debates" between Voeller and any of several well-known anti-gay bigots. The groups which are being solicited

for these debates are not being informed of the fact that for every debate they pay for, the bigot gets a share of the money. Voeller gets his money, the agency theirs, and, by giving money to their enemies, gay people contribute to their own oppression. On the ad material which is used to solicit gay money for these debates, Voeller's former presidency of GAA is cited as a credential. This may suggest to some that GAA approves of or participates in this nefarious scheme. The GAA wants it known that they not only do not support it, but they denounce it.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR HEPATITIS TESTING. Over 700 gay men have enrolled in the Hepatitis B Vaccine Program. A thousand volunteers are needed to fill this free program, which aims to evaluate the new vaccine and thus provides an opportunity for New York City are gays to protect themselves against this sexually transmitted disease. Free blood testing clinics to determine hepatitis B status, at a greater than 60% present or past infection rate in the gay community, only one-third of all who come to the test are still vulnerable to hepatitis B and need the vaccine, are held regularly at the New York Blood Center and the Gay Men's Health Project, as well as by invitation at various gay organizations. B R Y D O N — N E W CO-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF NGTF. Charles F. Brydon, 40, assumed the post of co-director on April 9, replacing Dr. Bruce Voeller. He brings a wealth of movement experience to the position. Most recently, as founder and co-chair of Citizens to Retain Fair Employment, one of the major organizations opposing Seattle's anti-gay initiative 13, he helped lead a winning campaign to defeat the measure in the Nov. election.

Mr. Brydon has had a distinguished career on both the national and local levels. In 1976, he joined the board of directors of the National Gay Task Force, and has served as a member of the executive committee and, with Kay Whitlock, as current co-chair of the Board. At NGTF's White House Conference on Gay Rights with Pres. Assistant Midge Costanza in

1977, Brydon presented a paper on discriminatory policies in the Defense Dept.

Brydon was active in Saettle's gay movement in 1974, founding one of the city's largest & most influential gay organizations, the Dorian Group, and serving as its president until 1977. In his leadership role with Dorian and CRFE, Brydon has been interviewed extensively by the Seattle media and has emerged as one of the city's best-known and respected gay representatives.

Brydon's interest in women's concerns is reflected in his service on the Seattle Women's Commission and in his successful efforts as president of the Dorian Group, to encourage a restructuring of the organization to include male and female co-presidents as means of promoting equal visibility and participation for men and women. Brydon was born and raised in

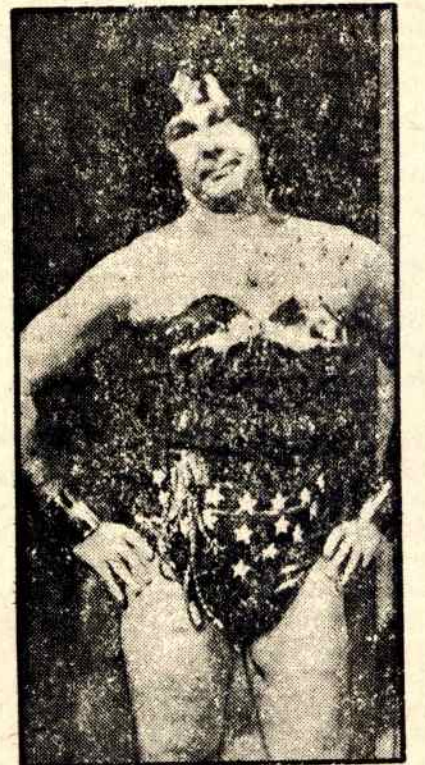

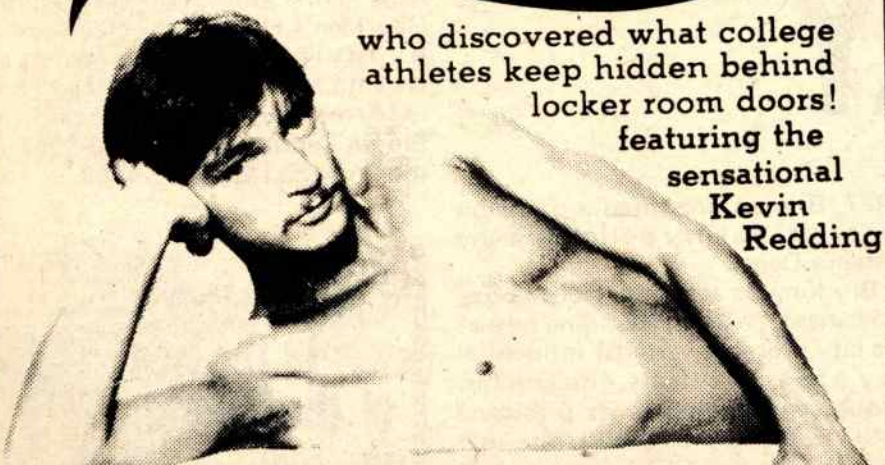

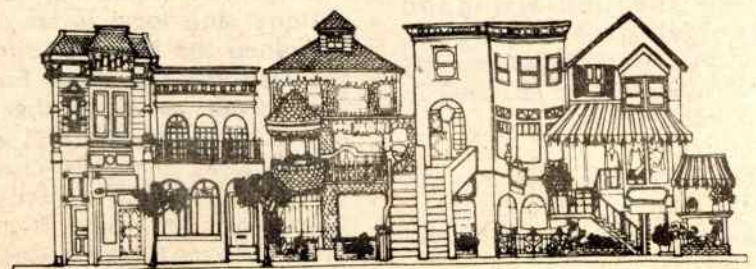

Old Movies Found

Oscar Winners



Over 500 reels of vintage movie film has been found in the frozen tundra behind the Yukon's only legal gambling hall.

Produced between 1903 and 1929, the films include the only known surviving print of "Polly Of The Circus," a 1917 silent starring Mae Marsh and a 1915 Lionel Barrymore feature, "Wild Fire."

Beginning in the early 1900's movies were shipped to the Yukon to entertain the miners of the gold rush days. Because the shipping cost back to the states was too high, the films were just discarded, winding up at the bottom of a skating rink behind Golden Tooth Gerty's gambling hall in Dawson. There they lay until last August when workmen uncovered them while clearing a vacant lot.

Today these films are being restored.

Robertson's life according to Raymond Serra, who wrote and is starring in "Manny," a play in 11 scenes being presented at the Century Theatre.

Robertson's life is very serious business to Mr. Serra and even though he is devoted to the actor his life doesn't add up to an interesting evening in the theatre.

Mr. Serra does look somewhat like and sound like Robertson (You see him as "The Boss" on the Boss Restaurant chain TV commercials), but his play becomes tedious with very little laughter.

D.D.'s WORLD

The Gay Men's Health Project located on Grove Street in Greenwich Village has been providing free VD and Hepatitis tests for a few years now. Taken at face value, the service appears to be invaluable, especially for gays who have reservations about going to a public health service center where they treat you like a number in a butcher shop. The Project is clean and modern and the volunteers are friendly and cordial. I decided to use the service so I could see first hand how good they were. My personal experience was quite unfavorable in that their testing showed that I had contracted an infection even though my personal physician had tested me and found the exact opposite (clean and pure for another 3 months). I questioned their lab procedures and they admitted that they were part of the Public Health Dept. and used the government labs. My doctor had told me that with all of the thousands of specimens that such projects send to the lab each week, the service could only afford to use one test instead of two, as most reputable labs use. When I confronted them on this point, I was told to return for retesting but I declined. A friend of mine, who had taken the hepatitis test, had originally been told that he had no immunity and was told to report for the first of 3 injections. When he reported for his first shot, he was told that a mistake had been made and that he did have immunity. I also met a gay doctor who related a similar horror story to me involving the Project. He had been told that he had hepatitis and was quite upset. He decided to go to the clinic to confront the staff there. When he got there, he was told that a mistake had been made and that someone with his last name but a different first name had the disease. The Project was lucky they were not sued. I would recommend to my fans to avoid the Project and go to the Public Health Center on Mon. nights on St. Mark's Place as the center is extremely sympathetic to gays and, in fact, reserves Mon. nights for gay men only...Received a loveable note from Tom Fulbright who now lives in Maryland to the effect that he appeared in the original "Whoopee" and "Sunny" at the New York Amsterdam Theatre. Tom was disappointed in the current revival of "Whoopee" as the

original had live horses, a chorus of 19 boys and 36 girls and Ruth Etting, between acts. Well, costs have gone up and times have changed...I had to put my beloved cat of 13 years, Madge, to sleep on March 5 as she had developed a tumor. I still have her boyfriend remaining, Clive, also 13 and named for an ex-lover of mine. I decided to have Madge buried at the Pet Memorial Cemetery in Wantagh, NY. It's a beautiful place with lots of pets of famous people buried there...Watch for my next column for a sardonic report on the sexual identity of 37 children raised by homosexual or transsexual parents...News of Cherry Grove. The In-town Cocktail Party held at the G G Barnum Room was fabulous to say the least. NEWS BRIEFS

Cal. Governor Bans Gay Discrimination

Sacramento, Cal. - Gov. Jerry Brown has issued an executive order banning discrimination against gays in employment with government agencies under his control.

Recently, Brown backed legislative proposals aimed at

banning employment discrimination against gays in the state. Since these proposals remain stymied in committee, he acted independently of the legislature to ensure that gays would suffer no discrimination in employment within the executive branch of state government.

Gacy House Gay Rights Levelled For Hartford

Chicago, Ill. - The home of suspected mas killer John Gacy was leveled recently and the property ultimately will be graded in the "hope the neighbors will eventually forget the horrendous crimes" that occurred there, authorities said.

Gacy, 37, a convicted sodomist, was suspected of killing 33 teenage boys and young men. He was arrested in December, 1978.

Hartford, Conn. - The Hartford City Council voted 6-2 recently to override Mayor George Athanson's veto of an ordinance barring discrimination against homosexuals.

The measure, which takes effect immediately, also prohibits discrimination against former criminal offenders.

Brazil's Gay Newspaper

Rio de Janeiro - "Lampino" is the name of Brazil's new gay newspaper. The paper's name means "lantern," but it was also the name of Brazil's most famous bandit, a northeastern cowboy who established himself as a macho in the national folk lore.

"We named it Lampino to enlighten our way and to help us get together and fight for a place in this macho society," said Aguinaldo Silva, the 34-year-old journalist who edits the paper along with a staff of 11 volunteers.

Silva says that although homosexuality isn't a crime in Brazil, it might as well be, with discrimination against gays worse than in many other countries. Brazil

is a police state with the local police having broad discretionary powers in dealing with all elements of society.

Actually, there is a duality in the view of gays in Brazil. There's their big 3-day carnival every year when the gays take part in the colorful parades.

Just a couple of years ago, Celso Curi, a 27-year-old editor with a Sao Paulo newspaper, introduced a gay rights column in the newspaper. Not only was he fired from his job, but the government filed a suit against him for "gathering abnormal human beings."

Brazil remains a country where the Iberian tradition of machismo is strongly entrenched.

Baby Clothes For Dads

San Francisco, Cal. - Florence Burdine is a little old grandmother who sells adult-sized baby clothes to people who get off on that kind of thing during sex.

She admits that her customers are a bit weird, but says: "When you see a 40-year-old man in a baby dress, daintily holding out the edges, and you see the look of ecstasy on his face, it makes you happy. A good man's hard to find, so who cares if he's got a little quirk."

You said it!

Wanted: Man To Father Child

Denver, Colo. - Carolyn Myer placed an ad in the newspaper here which says: "Single professional woman, 34, interested in meeting intelligent, healthy male for purpose of becoming pregnant. No financial obligations, although open to discussing relationship if desired."

Within 2 weeks she said she received more than 200 letters and she is now talking it over with some of the men.

Walter Now Wendy Troopers' Arresting Tale

Thirty-nine-year-old composer Walter Carlos, who created the 1960's largest selling classical album, "Switched-On Bach," but dropped out of sight in the 1970s, revealed in the May issue of Palyboy magazine that he is now Wendy Carlos. He had a sex-change operation in 1972.

Albany, NY - There were more than 687,000 arrests by State Police last year.

One of the most amusing was the case of the 6-foot-two weightlifter dressed in feminine attire whom troopers removed from the ladies' room theatre. When asked what he was doing there, the man replied: "What was I supposed to do, use the men's room?"

Key West Backlash

Key West, Fla. - In an article by Ron Alexander for the New York Times, he cited an ad placed in a local newspaper by the Rev. Morris Wright, the minister of the Key West Baptist Temple on Stock Island in which he called for the county commissioner to "help bring back some of the uniqueness of the Key West and the Florida Keys way of life."

"If I were the chief of police," wrote Wright, "I would get me a hundred good men, give them a baseball bat and have them walk down Duval Street and dare one of these freaks to stick his head over the edge of the sidewalk."

"That is the way it was done in Key West in the days I remember and loved," he continued. Female impersonators and queers were loaded into a deputy's automobile and shipped to the county line."

This ad outraged many Key West natives, including gays and the newspaper eventually ran a disclaimer.

Gone are those days, Rev. Wright!

Not So Grand Opera

San Francisco, Cal. - Jose Sarria, the leading diva of the revived Black Cat Opera Company has opened his spring season of grand opera at Chez Jacques, with "Faust."

The female impersonator, whose operatic homicides include garbling the program notes, singing all the major roles in whatever language comes to mind and insulting the audience between high c's, will sing 5 other operas on subsequent Monday evenings.

Marvin Witness Sues Michelle

Santa Monica, Cal. - Actor Richard Doughty, who was a witness for Lee Marvin, has filed a \$3.3 million libel and slander suit in Superior Court against Michelle Marvin and her attorney, Marvin Mitchelson.

Doughty, 34, said that Mitchelson had falsely accused him of perjury in his testimony and that

both the lawyer and Michelle had falsely implied and suggested that he was gay.

Doughty testified behind closed doors at the trial that he met Marvin and Michelle on the Pacific island of Palau in 1969 when he was a member of the Peace Corps. He said he has sexual relations with her more than 25 times.

Cinemattachine Problems

San Francisco, Cal. - On March 10, 1979, the owner of the building which houses the Adonis Book Store, Cinemattachine, 7 Committee and the Mattachine Society, Inc., was served papers from the office of D.A. Joseph Freitas which called for an "abatement of public nuisance," namely the operation of the private film club.

On 5 occasions in 1978, according to affidavits from two officers of the San Francisco Police Department Vice Squad, visits and observations in the cinema premises disclosed "lewd conduct"

prohibited by the California Penal Code, namely masturbation and oral copulation within the confines of the club and cinema. The management has called for a cessation of any activity by club members which could be considered a violation of the statutes cited above. The week-end live shows have been cancelled.

An attorney has been retained and preparations are going forward to prove in court that the club is private and that conduct within it is protected by the Consenting Sex Acts Law (the so-called Willie Brown Law).

Patrick Is Homecoming Queen

Statesboro, Ga. - Georgia Southern College students have elected Patrick Fetter, 20, as their 1979 homecoming queen.

To a mixed reaction from the gym crowd of about 4,000 persons, Fetter dodging a few eggs, accepted

a plaque from College Pres. Dale W. Lick.

Fetter, who is 5-foot-nine, then presented his escort, Janette Stephenson, who is 6 feet tall.

"A big part of my support came from freshmen women," Fetter said.

"SONG NIGHT IN THE CITY"



"Song Night In The City," a potpourri of songs both old and new with incidental dancing, has just closed after a four-week showcase run at the Westbeth Theatre in Greenwich Village. This glittering presentation was created, designed and directed by John Braswell, a real triple threat in the theatre. Karen Manno, who produced the musical, was also in charge of musical direction.

The selection of songs was varied so that you were transported back into your memory of past experiences at dance bars, school hops and discotheques. And yet this production was elegant with the cast bedecked in top hats and tails, white face and glitter. Braswell had carefully rehearsed the group so that each number flowed smoothly to the next. In fact, this perfect flow often prevented the audience from applauding the cast's earnest efforts.

The physical setting was truly unique with the pianist situated in the middle of a round stage with strung lights, stars, a mirrored ball high over head and occasion smoke oozing out from behind the piano. The band was quite good, although at times, too loud, sometimes drowning out the performers.

The show opened and closed with



the not too familiar song, "Cooking Breakfast For The One I Love" which Fanny Brice sang in the 1929 film, "Be Yourself." The cast's rendition of this song was spirited and lively. I had invited the director to bring his cast to my apartment in Feb. at which time I screened the film so that these young people could see and try to master the 1920's style of performing. Due credit was given to my editor who owns that rare, vintage film.

The entire cast was excellent. They were: Hillary C. Bailey, Bill Barnes, Katherine Frazier, Karen Manno, Jonathan Rosen, Carla Salla, Camille Tibaldeo, Suzanna Topping and Dan Hurim. Performers who especially impressed me were Jonathan Rosen and Camille Tibaldeo.

Since this production may reopen for a regular run, it behooves all who enjoy a good evening of music and dance to be on the lookout for it.

"ZOES BOOK"

Zoe tells her story to a female writer about some very influential artists and writers who she knew intimately in many ways. When Zoe describes her information as vital containing great literary potential as well, she convinces the writer, who is at first doubtful and skeptical, to partake in the venture of composing something that the world may read about. Relationships, frustrations and thoughts are revealed among these talented people and as the story progresses, the writer becomes emotionally involved undergoing changes with each new phase.

This is a book about bisexual, not gay people, who while entangled in complexities with each other are influenced by and act according to and respond from social pressures, rather than their emotional and actual beliefs. We see that if we live this way we have a good chance for unhappiness and frustration during and after the ordeal and might have to risk starting all over again; but by then it could be too late for a new beginning. We witness the various concessions that women make to men and how they deal personally with them for appearances, even if women are preferred or exclusively desired.

Zoe meets Julia in boarding school where she develops a crush on her. Zoe begins as the stronger of the two but is much more emotionally involved than Julia in matters of love. As just Julia's plaything, Zoe accepts any crumbs Julia tosses her way. The relationship lacks real substance and eventually Zoe realizes its limitations and learns to accept them.

Women are taught not to be ultra serious towards each other - the way they were supposed to behave with and feel for men. Julia de-emphasized Zoe's importance by only being close during bedroom sessions. Zoe is Julia's sex object before and after marriage, even with Julia's hubby's approval. Julia's hubby, Edward, had originally intended to end up with Zoe but married Julia because she was willing to marry him. There is no



real or emotional basis for the union which only serves as a convenient arrangement proving the falsehood that opposite sexes only must be together. Julia doesn't look around enough for the male of her choice but chooses who she is most familiar with. Ironically though, later on Edward resents Zoe for criticizing him and making him aware of his shabby, childish and sadistic treatment towards Julia. Edward dislikes being advised on how to run the business of marriage, yet welcomes Julia's brother, Giles when he questions hubby about his relationship with Julia. These two men have always had a strong bond, one they never shared with women, and they never feel they have to keep their affairs with each other and the other men a secret from Zoe the way she chooses to do with hers to them.

It is upsetting to see that Julia and Zoe never live as lovers or even pals without the presence of men who they only force upon themselves. They are never given the chance to see if they are more than bisexual which was then viewed the same way gayness was. Love is not the dominating force of the story so you may be angrily affected as I was.

Gail Pass writes in an original fashion where she only quotes Zoe and the other characters, but not anything the author says.

You must read on even if you get bored as you will want to know what finally does occur—mainly what happens with Zoe and the writer aide. Because the end was so disappointing and confusing I didn't derive the same type of, or any benefits at all, as I might if things had turned out differently. Of course these are only impressions and I could be wrong, so if I have missed any points, then you, the reader may advise me once you have completed the book, if you understand the book's conclusion.

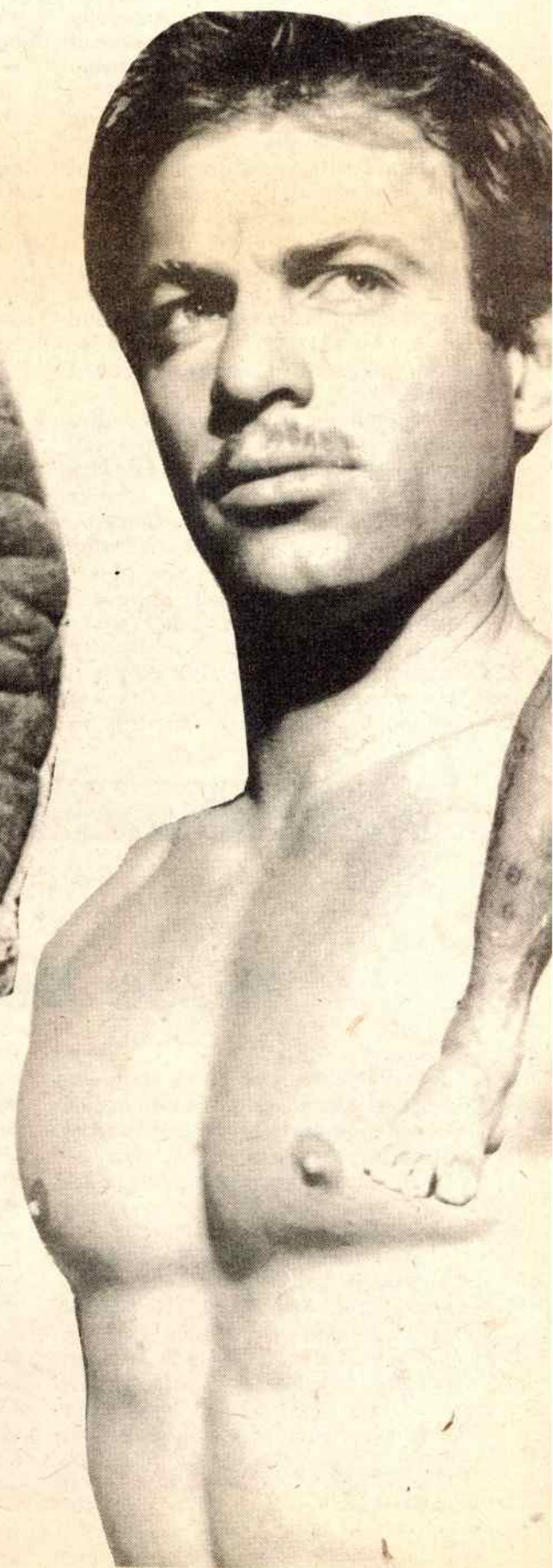

"Nude bathing has been no problem for us over the past 10 years," said Sheriff's Lt. Richard Platt.

He said that visitors at the county's two nude beaches have been more than 90 per cent male. Complaints by passerby have been minimal for these beaches — Tunitas Creek Beach and Gray Whale Cove near San Gregorio — because they have limited access and are somewhat secluded by cliffs, Platt said.

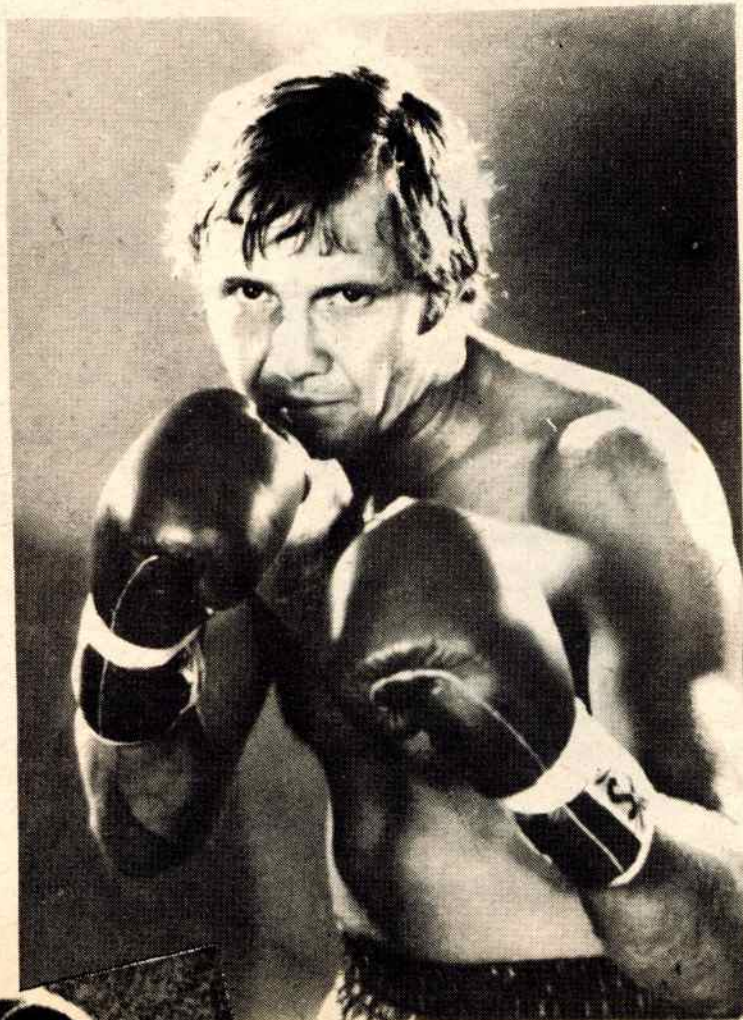

THE CHAMP

MGM PICTURE

"The Champ" is an old-fashioned sentimental movie that's a real tear-jerker. I found it disappointing.

The big problem is the ludicrous script which drags on and on, especially the first part of the film. Faye Dunaway looks both chunky and dowdy in those awful Theoni V. Aldredge clothes that are very outdated. And she's not right for the role of the sophisticated Miami 70's fashion designer. Finally, this far from one of Jon Voight's better screen roles.

The best performance in the film is by Ricky Schroder, the blond, blue-eyed, freckled-faced, 8-year-old from Staten Island, who cries buckets of tears in the film.

A model who has appeared on TV commercials, Ricky is making

his film debut in the role that brought fame to Jackie Cooper 48 years ago.

Wallace Beery received an Academy Award for his performance of the over-the-hill prizefighter who makes a comeback in the 1931 classic directed by King Vidor. The film established Cooper as a major child star.

The new version, directed by Franco Zeffirelli, is set in the backstretch community of a race track in Florida. Jon Voight is Billy Flynn, the ex-boxing champion working as a horse handler. Ricky Schroder is T.J., his son who idolizes his dad. Dunaway is Billy's ex-wife who has remarried and become famous an international fashion designer.

The film has a weepy ending with Billy getting beaten to a pulp as he fights to make his son proud of him while winning the money for that little home for the two of them. But he loses as he dies after the fight. You may want to bring an extra handkerchief along if you're the type who cries at movies.

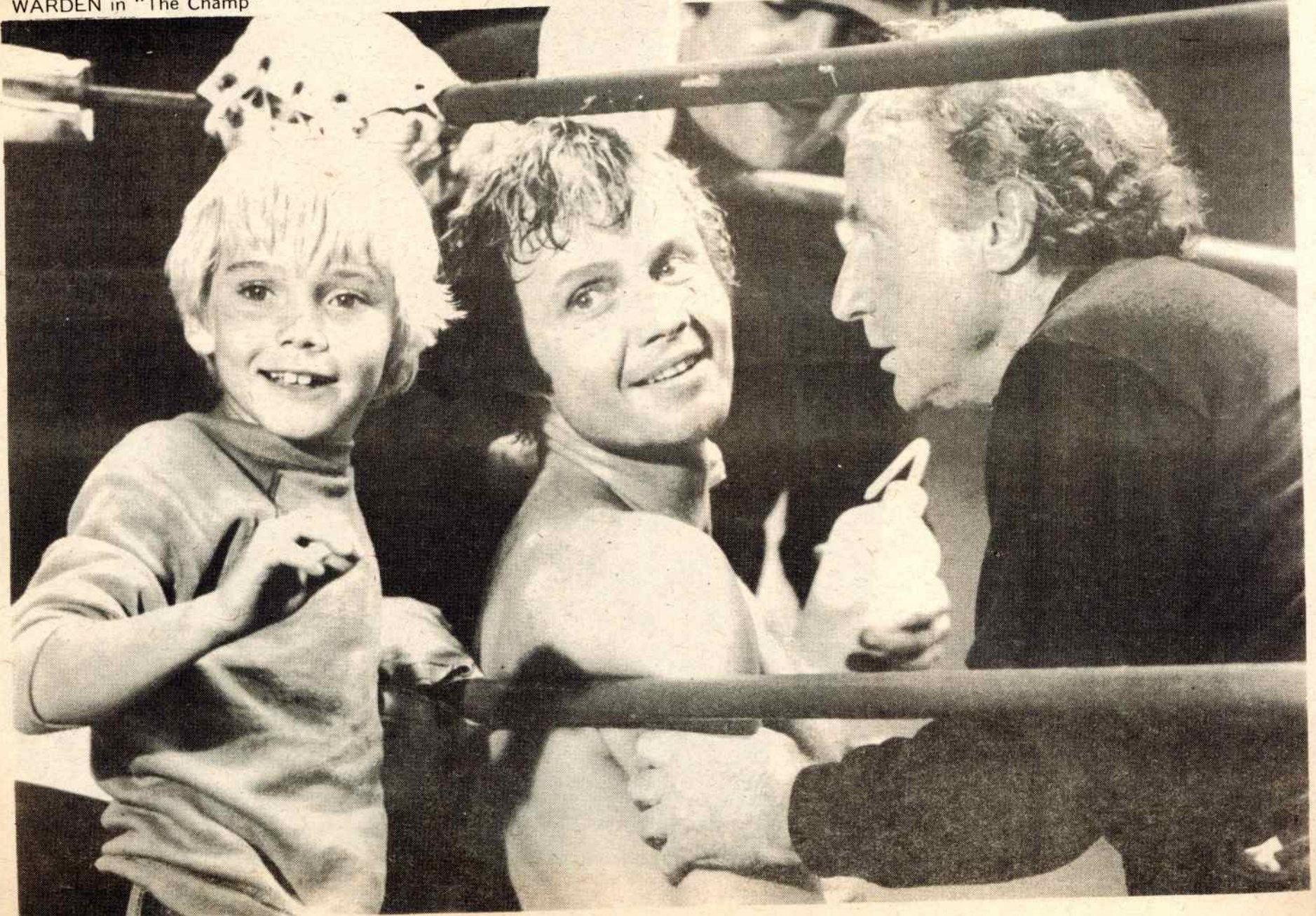
A PERFECT COUPLE

film, "Jesus Crist Superstar," I guess they're OK, but they dominate the film to the point that you often lose the main story line.

Also in this group are Heather MacRae, Tomi-Lee Bradley and Steven Sharp. The two women play lesbian lovers, one of whom gets pregnant (by accident) by Bobbi, who's gay. They're elated over the idea of becoming parents and expect to keep the baby.

Tom Dooley and Marta Heflin are the perfect couple who find each other through a TV dating service. Both are excellent in their respective roles.

There are some witty scenes between the couple as they get to know each other, almost lose each other, and finally end up together in the final scene.

Dooley is the son of a wealthy "Old world" Greek family. He's 45 and still dominated by his father. Heflin is a rather plain-looking girl and one of the singers with the "Keepin' 'Em Off The Streets" group.

Altman was so impressed with Dooley and Heflin when they appeared in his film, "A Wedding" that he and Allan Nicholls (one of the "Wedding" collaborators) began working on a script for them. When the filming began in June, "A Perfect Couple" had evolved into the form of a "contemporary musical" with original music performed by the rock group and the Los Angeles Philharmonic. The film was shot on location in the Los Angeles area, including the Hollywood Bowl.

In a delightful spoof of the Bela Lugosi 1931 classic, "Love At First Bite" has a lot of funny scenes. After being evicted from his Transylvanian castle, Count Dracula and his faithful manservant Renfield (Artie Johnson) travel to New York in search of his true love, top fashion model Cindy Sondheim (Susan Saint James).

The zany Cindy falls for Dracula after he bites her on the neck. On their second date he bites her again. Three bites and she becomes a vampire! However, this is a nice Dracula and he leaves it up to Cindy

to decide if she wants that third bite.

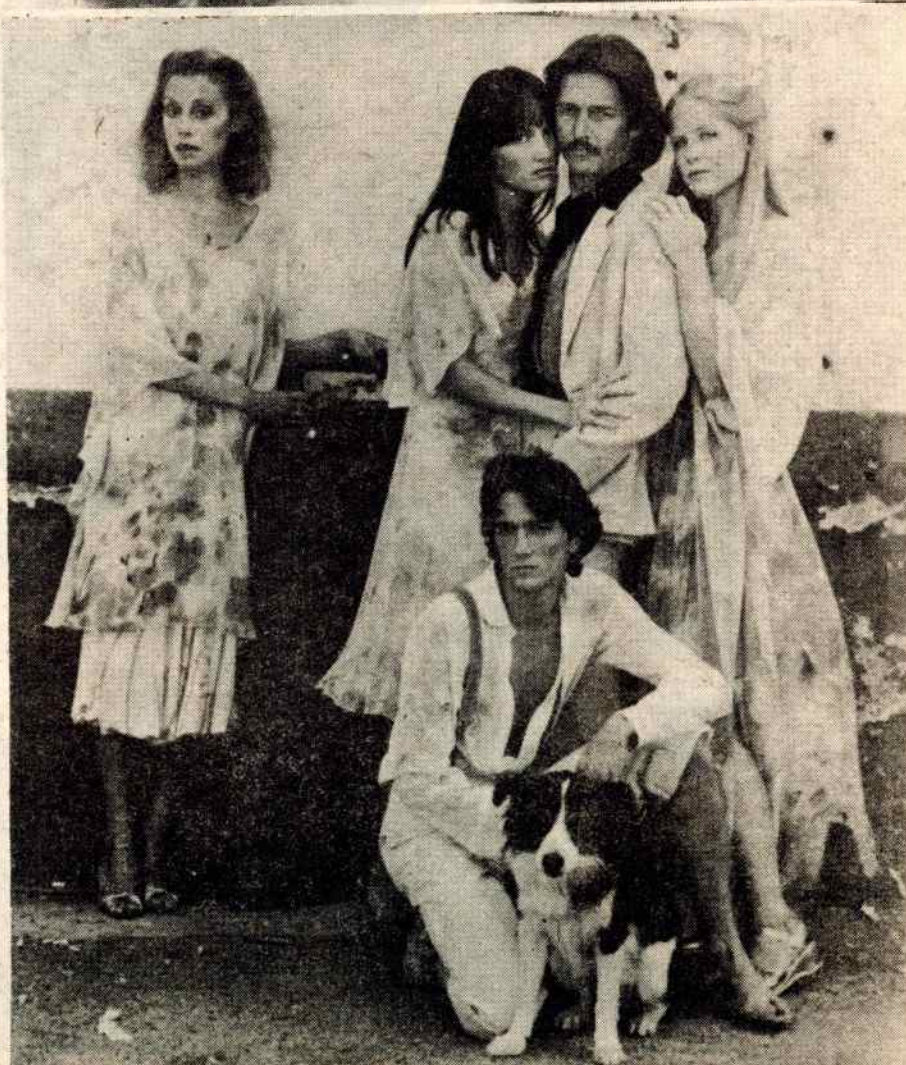

Freund and David Wolf and producer by Anthony Jones and Grania Gurievitch, it's an interesting documentary that could stand some cutting. For my taste there was too much footage on the basketball courts.

Under the direction of Peter

Powell and Robert Elfston, the photography is excellent as the viewer is treated to a look into the very different family lives of the two young men.

Brian Walker is a real charmer at 17 — when he grows into manhood he's going to break a million hearts!

New Yorker Films Release
Running Time: 110min.

Young Australian director Phillip Noyce has taken newsreel footage of two decades and combined them into a story of newsfronters who love film, news and each other. The film is set against the panorama newsreel events from a clip of Chico Marx with a group of men playing and singing "Waltzing Matilda" to Richard Nixon, from war-time crooners to rock and roll, from singing dogs to devastating floods, from Olympic races to cold war politics.

It's an interesting concept and was the surprise hit of the 1978 Cannes and New York Film Festivals. The film features the 50's newsreel footage with the 70's dramatized film. Phillip Noyce says

that they were able to match the wide-shots with their own close-ups of the crowds, they blew up photographs of some of the original footage and were able to match the people, costumes, decor, contrast and texture of the film so perfectly that the people from the casting agency who cast the extras couldn't tell when they were seeing original footage or new footage.

BLUE PERFUME

Artemis Film

"Blue Perfume," written, produced and directed by Charles Vienna is a hilarious film. Unfortunately, it wasn't meant to be a funny film.

Billed as an English-American co-production, the main part of the film was shot in London, the orgy (closing scene) in NYC.

The film opens with a bang — sex bang, that is, but ends with a thud. It's all about a new perfume — Fragrance 69 that ad manager, John, is promoting. John's wife is found murdered and later that night, before her body is even cold, he's screwing model Dawn Star (don't you just love the name of porno stars?) and laughing it up, it's all terribly British, you know and

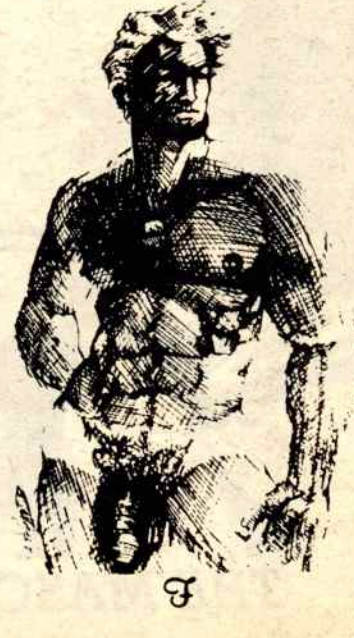
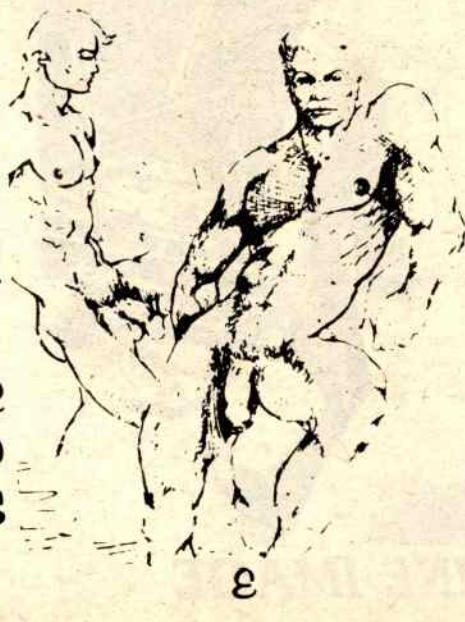

From a technical standpoint the photographs of Carl Van Vechten are not good. His lighting often is unflattering, as well as the angles he has caught his subjects. The backgrounds are busy, busy (ornate tapestries, materials, flowers, flags, books, prints, etc.) which take away from the subject. I'm amazed that so many famous people sat for him. I thought actors, actresses, etc., were too vain to allow themselves to be presented in such realistic photographs.

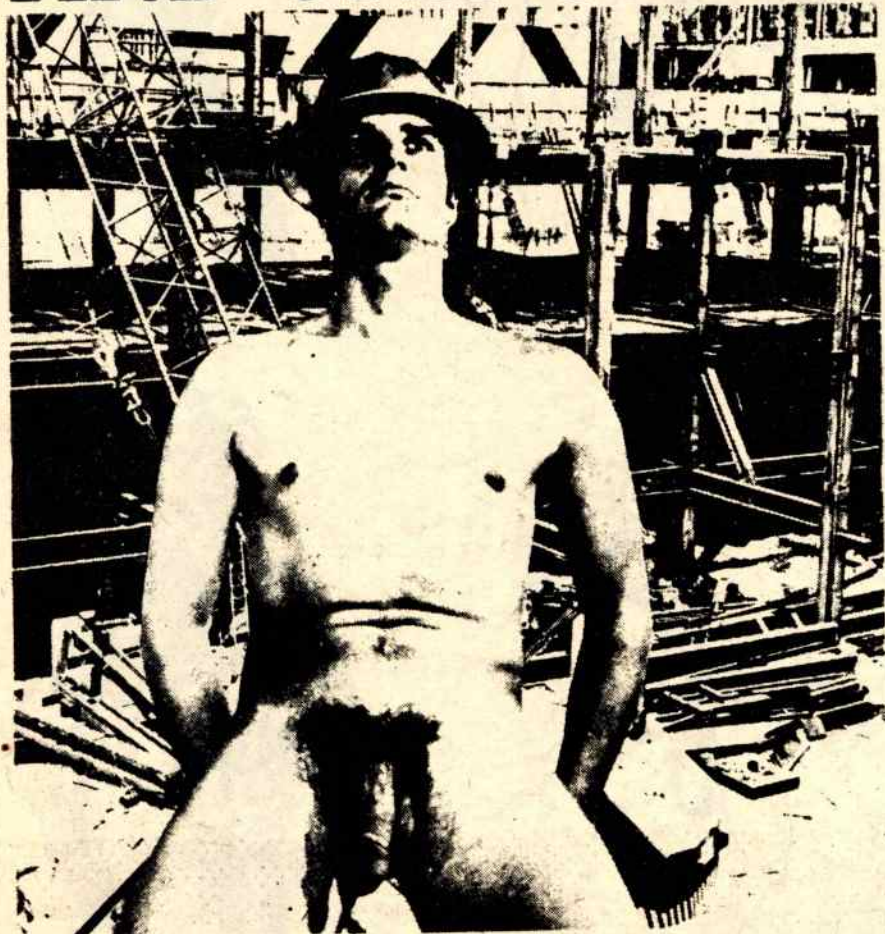

**Gay Worker in Westchester
 Keeps Security Clearance**

Through the intervention of New York Civil Liberties Union, Westchester chapter, an openly gay worker at a company that supplies electronic equipment to the Dept. of Defense has been allowed to retain his government security clearance at the "secret" level.

Harris L. Kimball, the attorney who handled the case stated that he knew of only two other cases in the country in which an openly gay person had been permitted security clearance by the Dept. of Defense.

This case is particularly unusual in that the worker — who is male — also admitted to occasionally smoking marijuana.

The case arose in Jan., 1977, when the worker was arrested at the U.S./Canadian border while returning from a Canadian vacation for the unauthorized possession of amphetamines. His arrest was reported to the Defense Industrial Security Clearance Office of the Defense Logistics Agency of the Dept. of Defense, which then

conducted an investigation.

During the investigation, the worker admitted both that he was gay and that he smoked pot.

DISCO subsequently concluded that he should be denied a security clearance because his "continuing acts of sexual perversion and drug abuse are indicative of his propensity to follow the dictates of his own conscience regardless of the possible consequences."

He was then asked to appear for an interview at the Office of Counsel of the Defense Logistics Agency, at which time he turned to the CLU for help.

During the course of the interview, the worker declared that because he was openly gay, he was not subject to blackmail.

According to Kimball, the assertion helped lead the Dept. of Defense's Screening Board to the ultimate conclusion that the security clearance was "clearly consistent with the national interest."

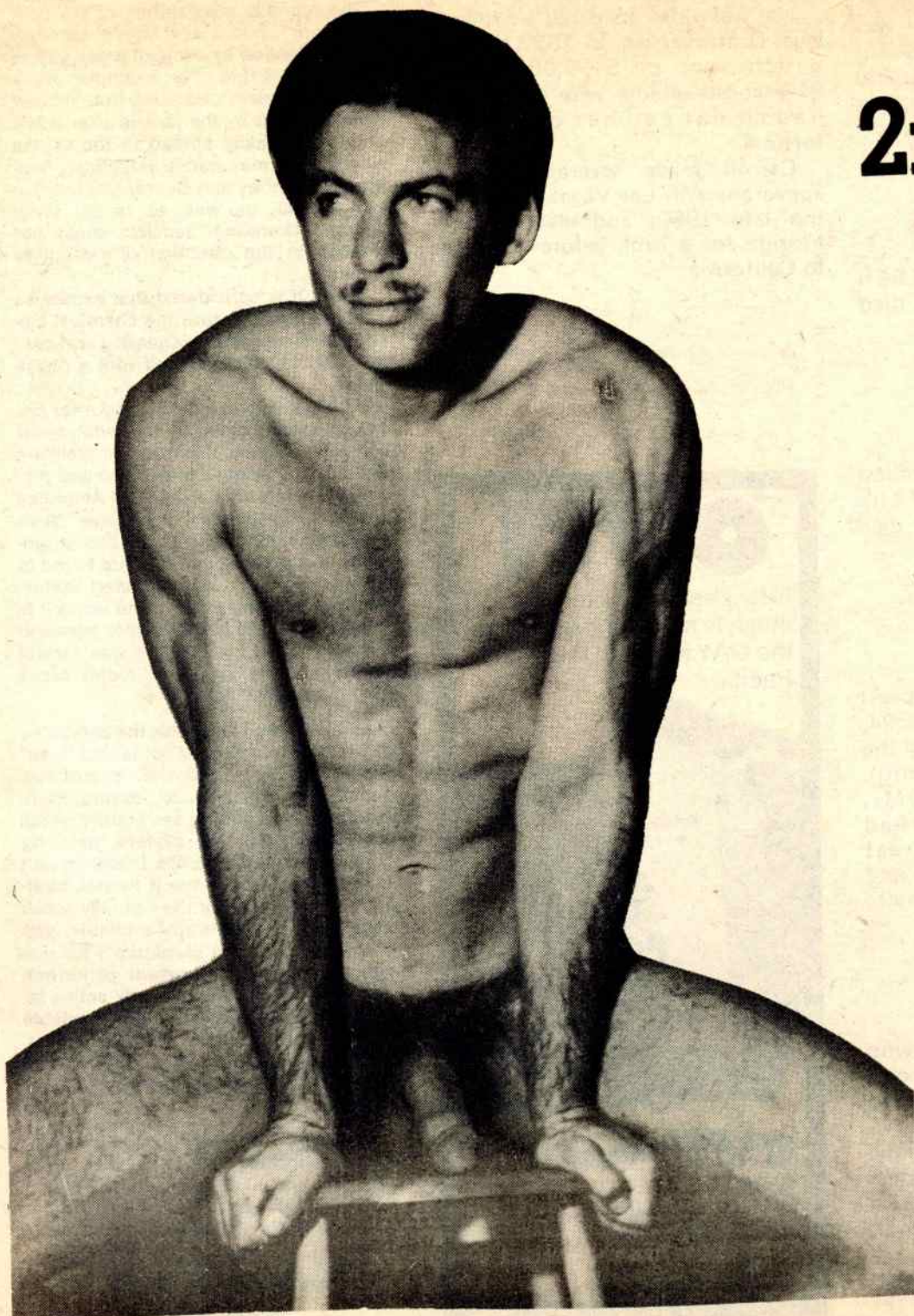

In Memoriam



Morton Sussman

Morton Sussman, designer of Mollie Parnis fashions, died March 26. He was 47.

Ivan Black

Ivan Black, a press agent for Broadway and Off-Broadway Theatres and many night clubs for more than 40 years, died March 25. He was 75.

Mr. Black gave Sam Mostel the name Zero. Performers who he helped gain public attention include: Lena Horne, Hazel Scott, Imogene Coca, Charles Mingus, Patti Page, and Josh White.

Mr. Black represented Cafe Society, the Village Gate, Gregory's and Five Spot.

Edgar Buchanan

Edgar Buchanan, one of the best-known character actors in films and TV, died April 4. He was 76.

Buchanan, best known in recent years for his role as the garrulous Uncle Joe in the TV series "Petticoat Junction," also appeared in "Cade's County" and more than 80 feature films.

Among his films were: "Shane," "Donovan's Reef," "Texas" and "Penny Serenade."

Buchanan was born in Humansville, Mo., March 20, 1903, and moved with his family in 1910 to the back country of Oregon.

Staats Cotsworth

Staats Cotsworth, stage, screen and radio actor, died April 9. He was 71.

Among his stage appearances were in "Macbeth," "Othello," "Richard III," and "Inherit The Wind."

He appeared in "Abe Lincoln In Illinois," and Maurice Evans' production of "Macbeth" on TV.

On radio his most popular program was "Casey, Crime Photographer." Other radio shows were "Front Page Farrell" and "Manhattan At Midnight."

In 1936 Mr. Cotsworth married Muriel Kirkland, an actress who died in 1968. Several years later he married Josephine Hutchinson, who survives him.

Nino Rota

Nino Rota, composer, died April 10. He was 63.

Mr. Rota was the composer of Fellini's film music and of the love theme from the film "Romeo and Juliet."

Gordon Parks Jr.

Gordon Parks Jr., the filmmaker who directed "Superfly" and three other men were killed April 3 when their plane crashed as it was taking off on the outskirts of Nairobi. He was 44.

Parks was the son of Gordon A. Parks, the photographer, film director, author and composer.

Parks arrived in Kenya 3 months ago and set up his own film company. The 4 men were on their way to a camp near the Tanzanian border for shooting on "Revenge," a low-budget adventure film that was to be the first production of Parks' new company.

Born in Minneapolis, Minn., Dec. 7, 1934, Gordon Jr. attended the American School in Paris after a tour in the U.S. Army in 1956-57.

Norma Brustein

Norma Brustein, an actress and teacher at the Yale School of Drama, died April 9. She was 50.

Ms. Brustein had the leading role in the Yale Theatre's production of "The Seagull," which finished its run in New Haven recently. Before coming to Yale she appeared on TV and Off-Broadway. She founded the Tempo Theatre in New York and taught juveniles there.

Ethel Harper

Ethel Harper, known to millions of Americans as Aunt Jemima, died April 3. She was 75.

Ms. Harper appeared in "The Hot Mikado" and "The Negro Follies" on Broadway.

She was also one of the 3 Ginger Snaps, a singing group that toured Europe and became well-known in many countries there.

During the 1950s she became known as Aunt Jemina in Quaker Oats' advertising campaign pancake mix.

More recently Ms. Harper was involved with the County Girl Scout Council in Morris County, N.J. and was the host of a radio talk show in Dover, N.J.

Matt Connolly

Msgr. Matt Connolly, San Francisco's "waterfront priest" died April 10. He was 64.

Matsu Yoshikuni

Matsu Yoshikuni, Japan's oldest woman and a survivor of the Hiroshima atomic bombing, died April 11. She was 109.

Charles Greenfield

Charles Greenfield, a civil engineer, died April 12. He was 94.

The only surviving member of the Cooper Union and Polytechnic Institute's class of 1912, Mr. Greenfield built the first road between Little Neck and Great Neck, L.I. and helped design and build the Coney Island boardwalk.

Ida Rolf

Ida Rolf, the biochemist who developed the technique of body massage known as "rolfing," died recently. She was 82.

Dr. Rolf developed her technique in the 1930s, but it didn't become widely known until the 1960s, with the blossoming of the human potential movement.

Rolfing is an often painful technique in which the rolfer

manipulates the body's muscles in an effort to smooth and lengthen them. The rolfer also puts pressure on the connective tissues in the body, trying to reshape the tissues.

Dr. Rolf taught her technique in a small house on the bluffs of Big Sur.

Herbert Dunn

Herbert Stanley Dunn, who played in about 100 of the silent Cisco Kid films from 1913 to 1915, died April 14. He was 87.

The son of an Irish sea captain and Algonquin Indian actress, Mr. Dunn was born in Brooklyn in 1891. He made his stage debut at the age of 3 with his mother.

He was property master of Columbia Pictures from the mid-twenties until his retirement in 1957. Bing Crosby once called him "the kind of prop men."

John Carroll

John Carroll, actor who played the title role in several Zorro movies, died April 24. He was 72.

In 1956 Carroll became the first actor to receive a percentage of his films' gross. He came to Hollywood in 1928 as a race driver.

His films include: "Rio Rita," "The Marx Brothers Go West," "Angel In Exile," "Sunny," and "Susan And God." "Flying Tigers," which he made in 1942 with John Wayne, was the story of his best friend, Beau Sangster.

He gave up his film career during World War II to serve as an Air Force pilot in North Africa, where he broke his back in a crash.

He was later involved in several legal controversies. In 1959 he paid a settlement of \$176,000 to an 81-year-old widow who claimed he had romanced her out of her fortune.

Carroll made several nightclub appearances in Las Vegas, Nevada in the late 1960s and also lived in Florida for a time before returning to California.

Efforts to treat VD out of existence have failed. Therefore we must learn to practice VD PREVENTION through personal hygiene. For better health here are some highlights from our booklet—

Page 2: The Sexually Active Male
Careful washing after sex will reduce the possibility of catching VD.

The germs that cause syphilis and gonorrhea, as well as some other sexually transmitted diseases, are sensitive to soap and water. Wash before sex for hygienic purposes.

Immediately After Intercourse:

Soap genitals working a bit of soft mushy soap into urinary opening. Rinse. Repeat procedure. Then urinate (which may sting). Extended exposure or delay before washing diminishes the effectiveness of this preventive measure.

Washing is doubly important since even in the absence of VD, other sexually transmitted germs can cause infections such as NGU (non-gonococcal urethritis) or NSU (non-specific urethritis).

If lubricants are involved in the sex act, use water-soluble preparations that will wash away. Do not use an oil base that can leave a film to trap germs.

Note: The foreskin that covers the head of the penis may trap germs which can cause infections. Therefore, special attention should be given to washing the uncircumcized penis.

With the development of vaccines against gonorrhea and syphilis, personal hygiene remains necessary to prevent other sexually transmitted diseases. For example: a gonorrhea vaccine will not prevent approximately half of the reported cases of male urethritis which are not gonorrhea.

Page 3: Some Aspects of Personal Hygiene for Male and Female

Some infectious germs which are commonly found in the lower digestive tract may be transmitted from the rectum during certain sex activities. Also present may be parasites which cause gastrointestinal disorders if swallowed (anal-oral route).

The mucous membranes of the genito-urinary system are highly susceptible to infection by some of these germs from the rectum. For example: As a result of careless cleansing from rectum toward vagina by the female after toilet, germs are easily spread to the vagina where they may cause infections, and from which they may be transmitted during vaginal, as well as rectal, intercourse. Therefore, females must not cleanse in the direction of rectum to vagina.

Today it is considered that excessive douching may disturb the chemical balance of the vagina. Frequency and content should be discussed with a physician.

Personal hygiene before and after sex can be greatly aided by the bidet, a low bathroom fixture, designed to facilitate washing for disease prevention and proper cleansing after toilet. The American public, unfortunately, has never been adequately informed as to the advantages of the bidet, and it is not found in homes or hotels in the United States, whereas in many parts of the world it is widely used and significant to personal hygiene. Good hygiene requires careful washing of genital and rectal areas before and after sex.

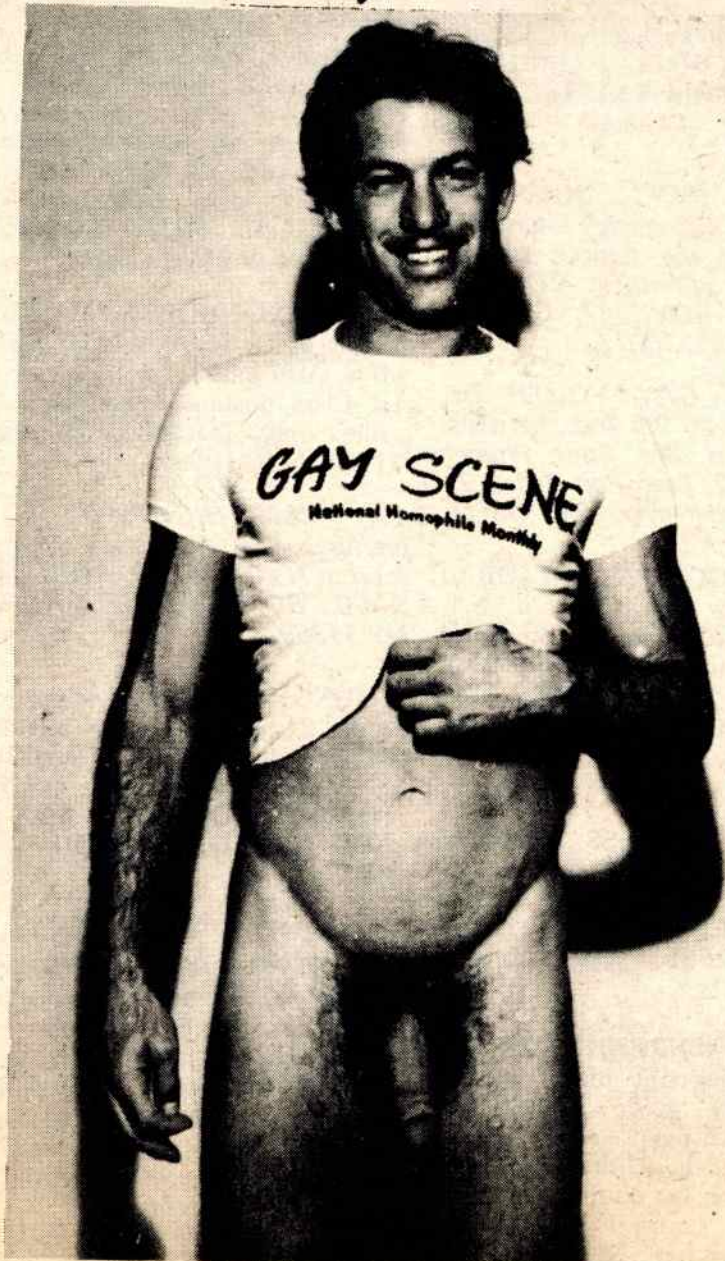

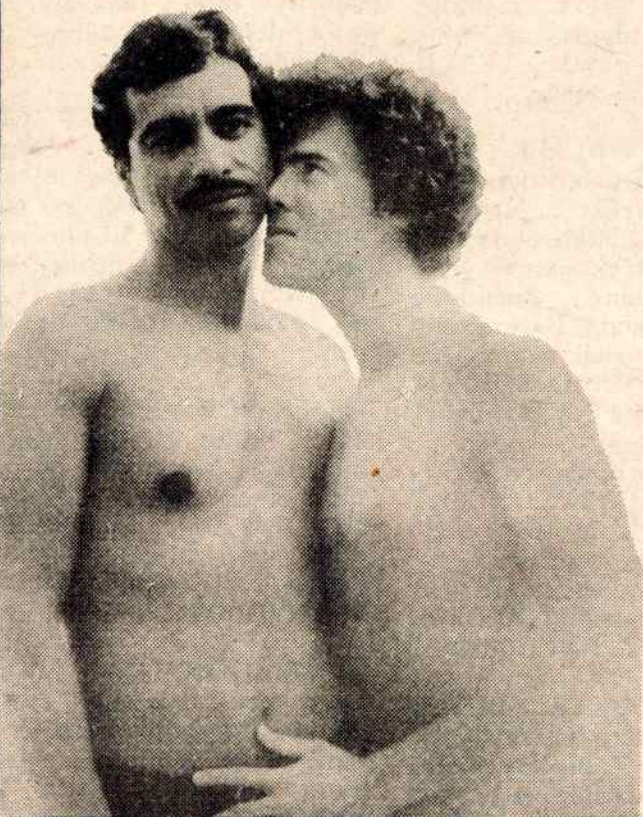
