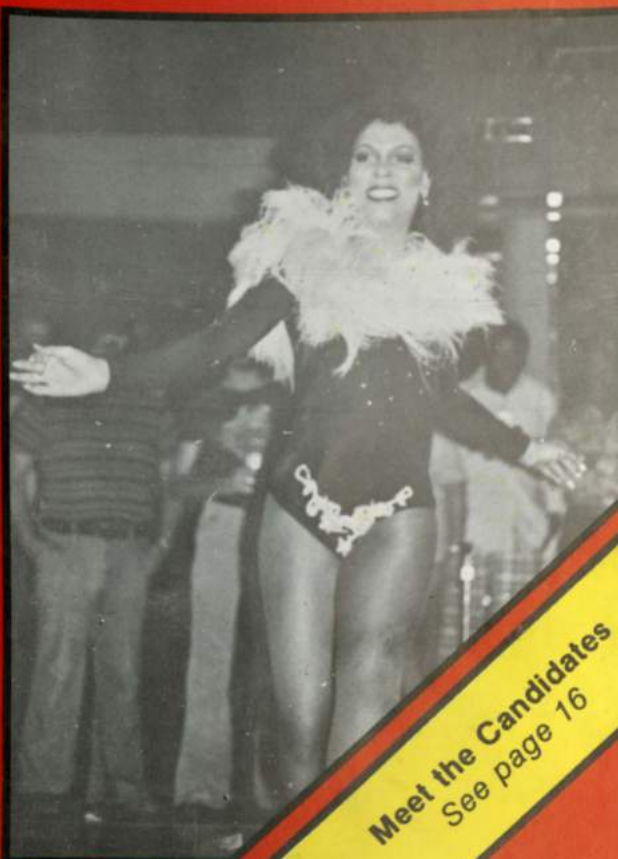

Town Meeting Workshops Announced

The Issues Committee for **Town Meeting I** announces a schedule of political action workshops to be conducted in preparation for the major event in the Astroarena on June 25. Three levels of participation are to be offered as an encouragement to wide-ranging inputs and in-depth analysis prior to final adoption of social-action goals by the Lesbian-Gay community on that date.

In addition to the submission of written comment, personal involvement may be offered at any of four Issues Workshops now scheduled for May 14-17. Persons who attend will be assigned to a small group which will generate as many statements of problems as can be defined within an hour. The results of this "brainstorming" will be tabulated during the second hour and the issues will be grouped into broad categories with the assistance of a Coordinator who guides participation. A sense of priorities will evolve from the frequency with which small-group participants identify the same problem independently.

The Issues workshop on Monday, May 15, will be at 2 p.m. The other three, May 14, 16, and 17 will be at 7:30 p.m. Sites will be announced via Community media next week, and on KPFT's **Wilde 'N' Stein** program Friday from 7-10 p.m.

The second level of public participation will occur the following week, May 21-24, when the issues are structured into proposed resolutions by participants

from the first series of meetings and persons who wish to join the process at that point. A Resolutions Coordinator will conduct the workshop and direct the results toward the Issues Committee, who shall publish the statements in a Workbook. This Town Meeting Workbook will contain the Standing Rules and Participation Guides for the June 25 event, as well as contact points for persons who wish to get involved at that time. Persons who pre-register for Town Meeting I will receive a Workbook by mail by June 12. All others will receive a copy upon registration. The third level of activity will be Participation Workshops to assist persons who want to debate the proposed resolutions or amend them during the June 25 meeting. These workshops will be conducted by a professional parliamentarian and the Resolutions Coordinators who have emerged from earlier workshops, on June 14 and 21, at 7:30 p.m., site tba. As a result of this series of political activity workshops, the Lesbian/Gay community of Houston will devise its own set of demands and priorities.

Additional modifications will occur during the proceedings on June 25, but now is the time to be involved in the total experience. Persons who want to take a major role in the deliberations on June 25 are invited to contact the Issues Committee by phone or letter. Coordinators for the series workshops are needed now. Gay Bar Threatened with Closing

The management of a local non-Gay establishment is circulating a petition among its patrons to have the liquor liscense of a neighboring Gay bar revoked. The petition, being circulated at **Theodore's** at 304 Avondale requests that the liquor license be taken away from **Dirty Sally's** because the bar is detrimental to the "moral decency" of the community.

A counter petition has been prepared for patrons and supporters of **Dirty Sally's** protesting the Theodore's petition. It states that none of the persons signing have ever "observed any conduct on these premises which would offend the public sense of decency" and suggests that the protest to the continuation of the permit was stated "in the interest of a business competitor who is seeking to subvert governmental processes, time and personnel to his own personal financial gain."

Looking Good - A Guide for Men, by Charles Hix, Wallaby, Pcket Books, New York, 1977. Soft cover \$5.95. (Available at Wilde 'N' Stein Books, 819 Richmond, Houston, Texas 77006. 713/529-7014.)

This version of **Looking Good** is the soft (plasticized) cover one; the hard cover version (at \$14.95, compared to \$5.95 for the current issue) had more than 100,000 copies sold.

The four basic divisions in this book on making the male human look good are - indeed - basic. They are "Hair", "Face", "The Body" and "Hands and Feet."

Written for the "larger community" male populace (at least, ostensibly), it nevertheless has the overtones - and undertones - of grooming which more often is associated with the Gay male who, traditionally, at least in the last several decades, has taken much better care of himself than his heterosexual counterpart.

The dead giveaway, however, is the use of the hunky male models to illustrate this "how-to" manual of self-care. They are in the genre of *After Dark*, *Blue Boy*, and *Playgirl*, which many of my fellow writers and reviewers have called "plastic." While I can't help agreeing with this judgement, I also can't help admiring the hell out of the sheer good looks (tho' as a photographer, also, I recognize much of it to be just excellent craftsmanship) of the

What to do with our hair (or if we don't have any), what style fits the reader best, what are the right ways of taking care of skin, scalp, body and limbs? What about exercise? How much? What about cosmetic surgery or hair replacement?

illustrated males, many of whom are just sex/gust gland-discombobulating individuals of the masculine *homo sapiens*.

Whatever, most are gorgeous as Antinous was supposed to be and, in fact, make me (and probably most others) feel as if I were short-changed somewhere along the line. The idea behind using such models has always thrown me. Basically, I think that the thought of the writers/ publishers/ illustrators *et al* is to make the reader aspire to the beauty we are beholding. On the other hand, though, the Olympian-heights type of male could well be counter-productive in that the reader may well succumb in despair at ever achieving such goals.

The answer, of course, is that we are all beautiful, each in his own way. Though possibly a cliché (and some would say "rationalization"), it is true that the real beauty is within...but that, too, needs to be developed.

That is another story, however, and **Looking Good** deals strictly with the outer, physical facade. And it does it very well.

As author Charles Hix says in his introduction: "There's no formula for looking good. The work is steady but not arduous. The most rigorous part may be training yourself to think logically about what you're doing (to improve your looks) and why.

Of course, keeping healthy is the REAL rule. That provides both the inner and outer glow which shows through as looking good, an aura, a feeling of confidence and, ultimately, that which this book is all about.

C.A. Tripp Speaks at Sexuality Workshops

Dr. C.A. Tripp, author of *The Homosexual Matrix*, will be in town this month (May 26 and 27) and is scheduled to make two appearances at workshops for professionals and the general public at the University of Houston. The May 26 workshop, titled "*Human Sexual Development - Regular and Exceptional*" will be a study of the elements that make up "the human sexual matrix." Among the topics to be covered will be "similarities and differences between male and female sexuality", "the role of affection in sex", "the 'resistance' characteristics of sex", "the art of the possible and impossible in sex therapy", "the nature and kinds of bisexuality", and "a backward and forward glance at social considerations."

Attendance of the May 27 Workshop, titled "*Human Sexual Development - Therapeutic Intervention*" is limited to 40 professionals.

Dr. C.A. Tripp is Director of Psychological Research Associates, Inc., and an independent sex researcher. His background includes nine years in close association with Dr. Alfred C. Kinsey.

The registration fee for the first session is \$25.00 (\$20.00 for full-time students) and for the second session is \$30.00. The workshops will be conducted between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

No G.P.W. in San Jose

The San Jose City Council last month adopted a resolution proclaiming the week beginning June 18th as "Gay Pride Week." Three weeks after the adoption of that resolution the Council, under what one San Jose official described as the "most terrific and hateful pressure I've ever seen" withdrew the resolution.

The council's action came after a seige of telephone calls and letters condemning its previous action in proclaiming Gay Pride Week. Opponents of the proclamation brought 1000 people, according to one San Jose City Hall source, to the meeting.

"The attitude in the chamber's that night," said this same source, who refused to be named, "was nothing more than one of hate."

San Jose mayor Janet Grey Hayes, who originally voted for the resolution, switched her position and voted for rescension of the measure. An aide to Hayes said the mayor had received over 200 letters and more than 300 phone calls protesting her support to the Gay proclamation.

"They were horrible, just horrible," Hayes' aide said of the phone calls. "We took a lot of abuse over this."

Hayes, according to the aide, had decided to stick by her original position supporting the proclamation but then found out the Councilman Al Garza, who had also favored the proclamation, was going to request the council to rescind it. Garza is running against Hayes for the mayoral seat in San Jose's June election. Hayes issued a statement following the

council's reconsideration saying she changed her position because it "caused more division in the community than I had originally anticipated. We simply must get on with the business of running the city."

Hayes' office reportedly reportedly called several Gay leaders in San Jose and contacted the National Organization for Women. These groups and individuals reportedly told Hayes that they "understood" why she could no longer support the resolution.

The council's action withdrawing the proclamation was greeted by a protest on the steps of City Hall.

Eulogy for Miles Kimmel

Myles C. Kimmel entered my consciousness as an articulate voice over the telephone, commenting on the matters of the day over the Wilde 'N' Stein Radio Program. All I knew of him at that time was that he was a companion to my friend Tom Richards. Almost every week, Myles would join the discussion on the air. His strong, well-stated opinions became a regular feature on Wilde 'N' Stein. He believed in the value of a community identity for Gay men and Lesbians. He was a strong supporter of Gay/Lesbian rights and a generous supporter of Pacifica Radio.

Some time passed before I visited Myles and Tom at home. Once there, I found a young man eager to share the stories of his life's experiences. He talked of being a young sailor, stationed in the Alutian Islands; of being discharged from the service for being suspected of being Gay. He talked of finding himself in a world that had already rejected him. He spoke often of his years paying dues in the grimy bars and hostile streets common to both our younger experiences.

He was an artist who worked a craft with his hands.

It struck me that Myles Kimmel and Ray Hill and 10's of thousands of other Gay men are not really separate people but all share the same experiences, the same discriminations, the same fears, the same joys, and the same concerns. We were brothers

before we knew of each other's existence. Myles Kimmel believed, as I believe, that all Gay men are brothers, or should be, and that with our Lesbian sisters, our friends and supporters, we create a kind of separate tribe.

Our tribe is often denied recognition. Many traditions are denied our tribe. The tradition of burying our dead is rarely executed by our Sisters and Brothers. The Non-Gay Non-Lesbian world steals our bodies and quietly buries them without mention of our life experiences. It is a horrible thing to deny a tribe the right to honor and bury its dead. A tribe with no funerals loses its sense of history and continuity. That we can honor the life and mourn the death of Myles Kimmel is an exercise in coming of age for our tribe.

Myles and I spoke of death; not his but mine. Mine seemed destined to be closer. Myles Kimmel did not fear or dread death, but spoke of passing as another facet of life. Myles Kimmel wanted to be honored by his tribe, remembered by his people. We have shared his joys, felt and consoled his pain, dreamed his dreams, and known his tears, and received and celebrated his love.

By Myles Kimmel's own desire, his mortal existence is ours to remember, ours to share and ours to learn from. His eternal existence belongs to God and does not concern us on this plain, except to note that Myles generated love and forgiveness in ample quantity and quality to be eternally rewarded.

Myles and I spoke of God's rewards and punishments. We agreed that God neither expected nor wanted to hear apologies from Gay men and Lesbians for their preferences. Neither is God concerned about how we manifest and apply our

preferences. God is concerned about how we treat one another, and in that respect, Myles was closer to being God-like than those who wear their faith like badges and carry their Bibles as weapons.

Mourn the death of Myles Kimmel. Weep at the loss of a young Rabbi who taught us of our own nature. Also celebrate that even in death, he also gave us the opportunity to bury our dead, an honor and a responsibility the living cannot grant us.

Perhaps among those who hear these words, there will rise a keeper of history, Mark well the date for on this day members of our tribe gathered to honor the life and mourn the death of Myles Kimmel.
