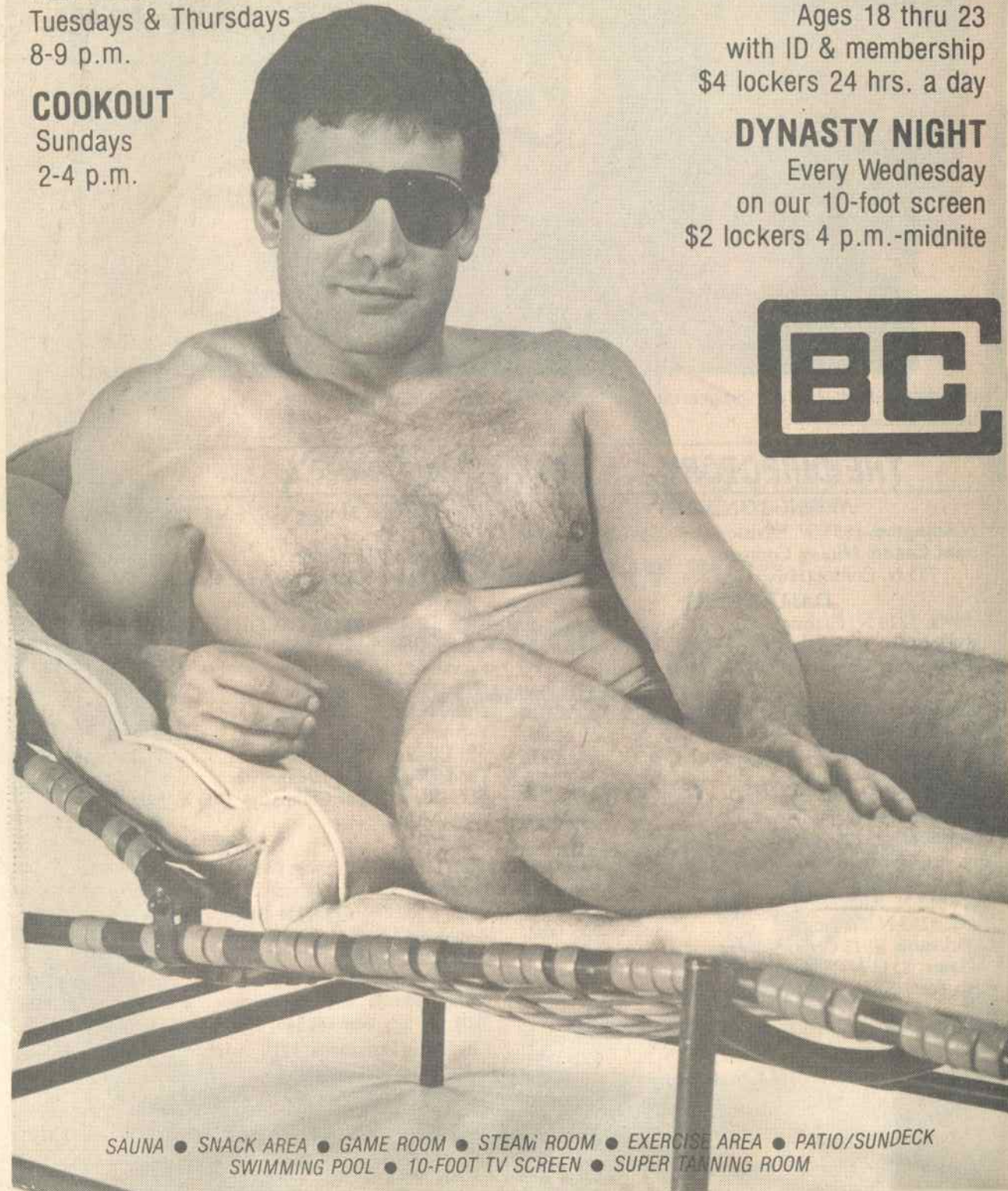

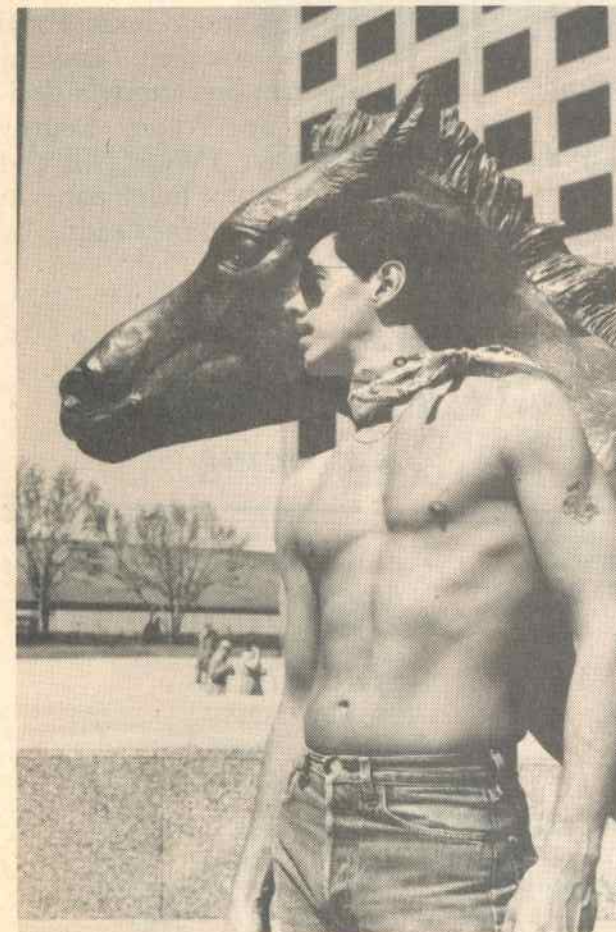

Nelson loses council bid

Dallas Gay Alliance president Bill Nelson failed to gain the needed support to win him the District 2 seat on the Dallas City Council in elections held Saturday, April 6.

Nelson faced incumbent Paul Fielding, along with hispanic leader Joe May and neighborhood activist Lori Palmer in a heated race for the seat.

Palmer had said she first entered the race because she agreed in principle with Nelson but felt he could not win because of his openness about his sexuality.

Nelson was opposed by some groups who saw him as a one-issue candidate, despite efforts by Nelson and his supporters to clear the record.

Nelson went down to defeat in the election, which will be decided in a run-off between Lori Palmer and Paul Fielding.

Supreme Court decisions provide two dubious victories

Two recent Supreme Court decisions have offered temporary victories of a sort to the lesbian and gay community, but have failed to provide the precedents needed to allow faster victories in lower tribunals.

The first victory came in the case involving the National Gay Task Force and the Oklahoma State Board of Education. Under an Oklahoma statute echoing closely a statute which failed in California, school teachers who spoke up in favor of gay and lesbian rights or who came out as a member of the lesbian/gay community would be subject to termination. When no teachers in Oklahoma were courageous enough to challenge the law, the National Gay Task Force successfully challenged the law as an unconstitutional violation of the right of teachers

to freedom of speech. The Oklahoma State Board of Education then appealed the case to the Supreme Court, where four justices voted in favor of the law and four voted against it, with one electing not to vote. The result of the tie vote is that the lower court's decision in favor of NGTF and freedom of speech remains valid.

In the second case, a Texas state university's gay student group retained the right to recognition granted by a lower court after the Supreme Court declined to hear the school's appeal.

The NGTF suit was the first case involving gay/lesbian rights to be heard by the high court in many years; however, as indicated by a press release from NGTF prior to the hearing, a significant goal of the suit, to obtain a favorable hearing which would stand as an unshakeable definition of gay rights as provided by the constitution, was not achieved in what almost amounted to a default judgment.

Texas gay men and lesbians's rights stand challenged in the near future in the Fifth U.S. Court of Appeals in New Orleans when the full court rehears the *Baker vs. Wade* case under which Judge Jerry Buchmeyer (who is also on the New Orleans panel) found Texas Penal Code Section 21.06, the so-called "sodomy statute", unconstitutional. Buchmeyer's decision was challenged by Potter County (Amarillo) District Attorney Danny Hill and subsequently held up by a three judge panel in New Orleans but later accepted for hearing by all nine members of the court.

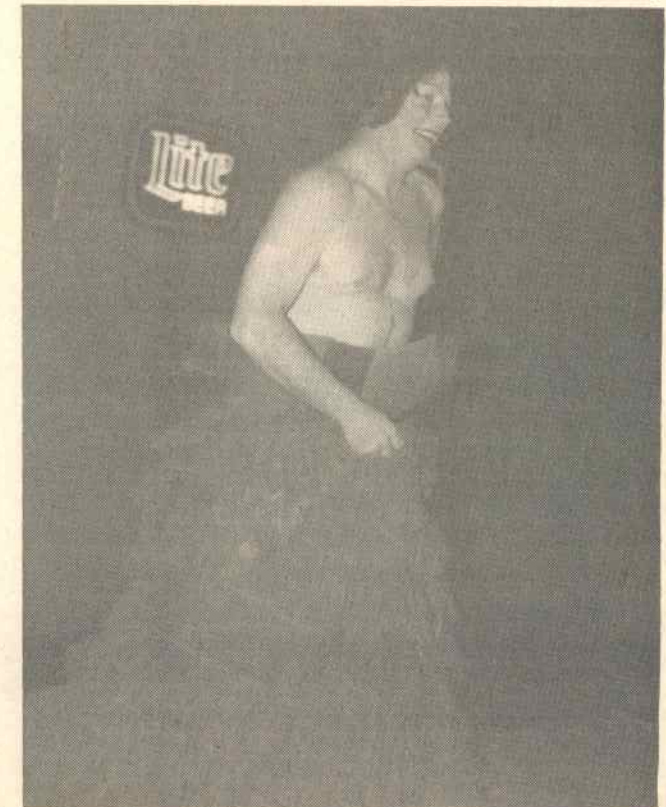

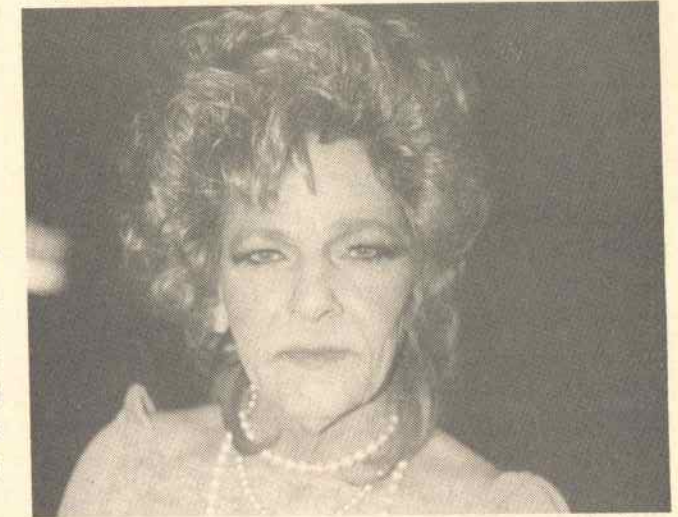
