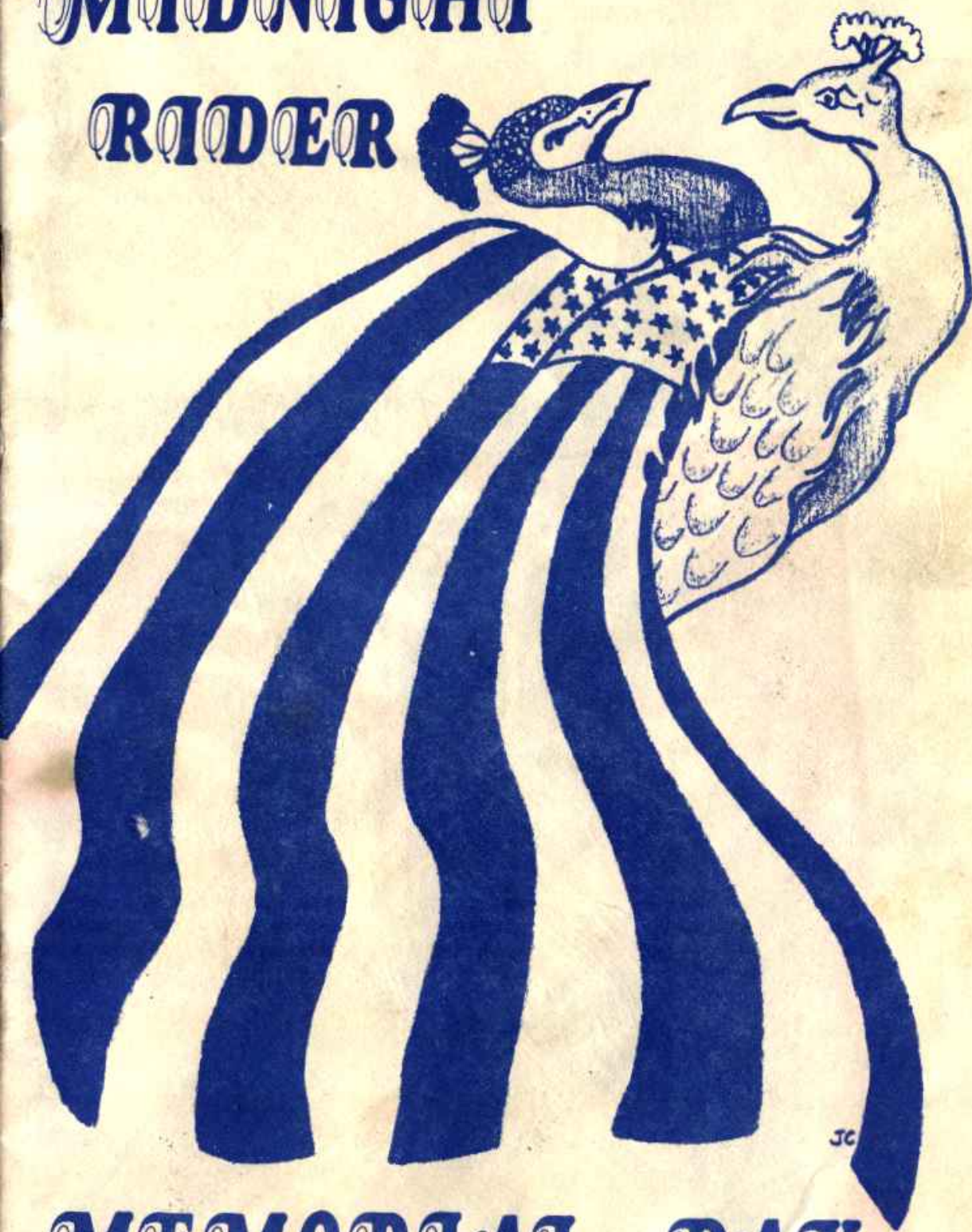

### News News news



WASHINGTON — The administration has forbidden government officials from inquiring into the sexual habits of employees or individuals seeking most federal jobs.

The directive also requires government to count, as work experience, service as an unpaid volunteer in gay-related civic projects. Examples would be such things as community task forces on problems of homosexuals, or service with a gay legal or medical clinic. Federal agencies already take into account volunteer service in other community activities when rating the experience of potential employees to determine their pay and grade level.

The new order covers most federal agencies and departments, who employ about 95 percent of the government's 2.7 million workers. Officials say the changes are in line with recent court rulings that have outlawed workplace discrimination against homosexuals and unmarried persons living together.

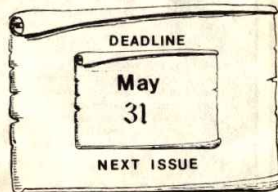
It has been an unwritten practice in many federal agencies (and private industry) to check on alleged homosexuals, and to deny them employment or promotion either on "moral" or security grounds.

The new order will make it illegal for agencies to inquire into non-job-related sexual, social or other customs of employees while at the same time forcing them — if the individual chooses to disclose it — to positively consider their service in recognized gay community activities.

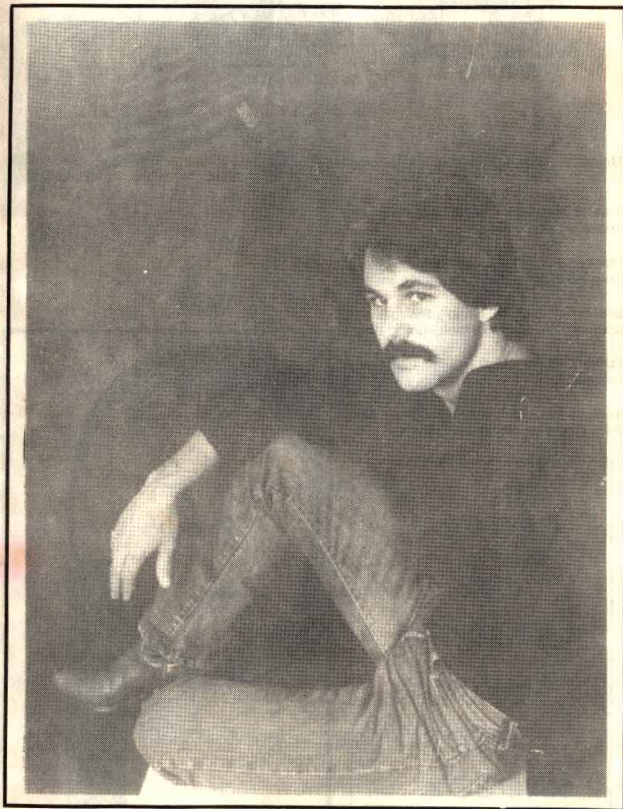

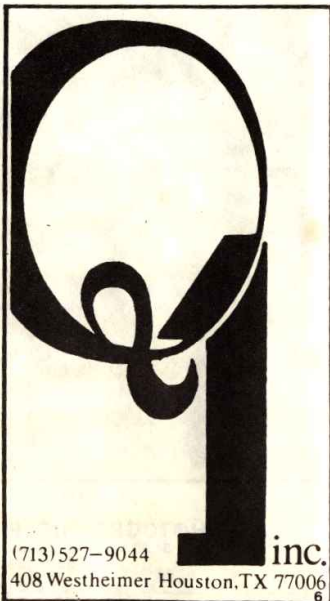

# BOOKS

GAY BOOKS  
by Barney O'Reilly

For any straight friends curious about the gay experience or any gays who merely like to read a literary treasure, required reading is **The Naked Civil Servant** by British author Quentin Crisp.

It's the best literary gay book to date and will probably be one of the few books of any literary genre from the 1970s to endure. The story has been dramatized for TV and shown in many countries of the world. It scintillates, outrages, titillates, entertains, elicits disgust, bravos, guffaws, and hisses. No one can come away from it unaffected, which is a good clue that something significant—or cathartic—was said.

**Kirkus Review** (one of America's most prestigious literary commentaries) was beyond the ethnic-like limits of the gay theme, and praised the book for its wit and humanity. It is a statement about the human condition in general. One would not call Crisp (nor would he I'm sure) "educated" in the formal sense. But what might otherwise have been a boring self-pitying wallow in oppression turns out to be a classic yet always witty study of coping with continual rejection—in this case, **object** rejection by virtually all but the mother who bore him.

He was rejected not only because of his open gay behavior, but also his extremely effeminate features. He could not hide the latter. This is **not** a gay condition per se—only a small minority of gay men, just as only a small percentage of straight males, are effeminate.

Crisp never went into "the closet" in an attempt to hide his gayness; he was ostracized for not observing this rule society demanded. The dilemma of hiding one's gay nature lest he be shunned has been the lot of gays in Western culture for centuries. It is one of the worst socially-conditioned and sanctioned blights.

For Crisp, the condemnation of his nature was devastating. A lesser man would not have survived; he proves himself of exceptional emotional strength. In retaliation for his rejection, he flaunted his effeminacy, mocking himself to the world. But society could only laugh at him and not at itself for its monstrous treatment of one of nature's creatures.

Open gay identification was not tolerated in England in Crisp's youth; it was "sinful" to be gay. The contradiction of blatant hate by a religion which preaches love has long been hard for gays to understand. Now, fortunately, that issue is largely behind us. The main exceptions are "Christian" fundamentalists of the sort Crisp encountered (and whom we in Houston know so well).

Crisp took the wrong road by lapsing into agnosticism, but one can understand why he gave up on religion. He is as he was born and he was rejected for it. He found work extremely difficult to obtain, and live in social isolation for many years. An immovable force (society demanding conformity) struck against the immovable object (Crisp's personal *different* human nature); neither budged an inch. But this exceptional man went beyond, lived his life to suit himself. Finding enough henna hair dye in the shortages of World War II became a major concern of his.

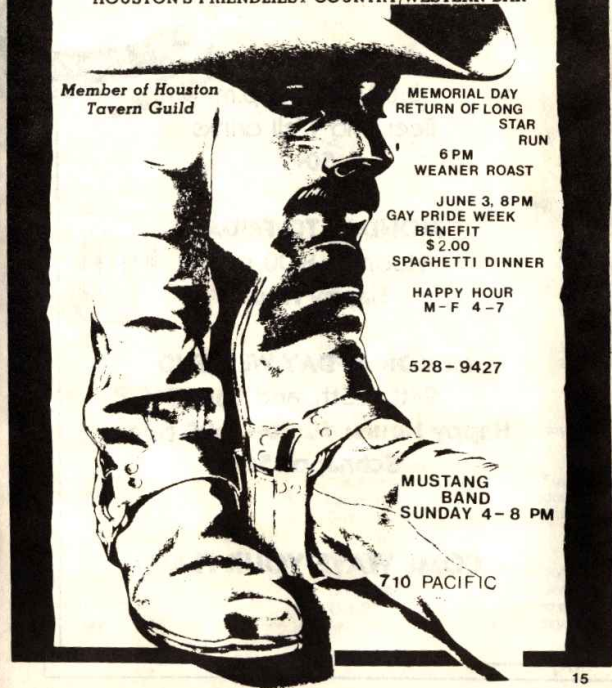

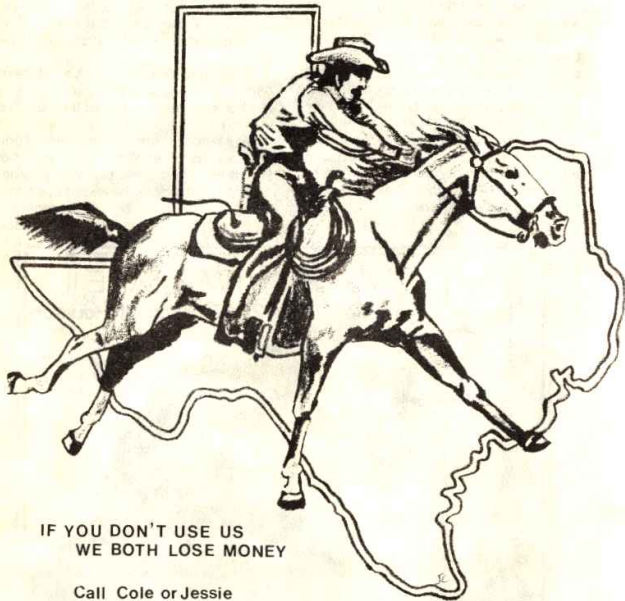
