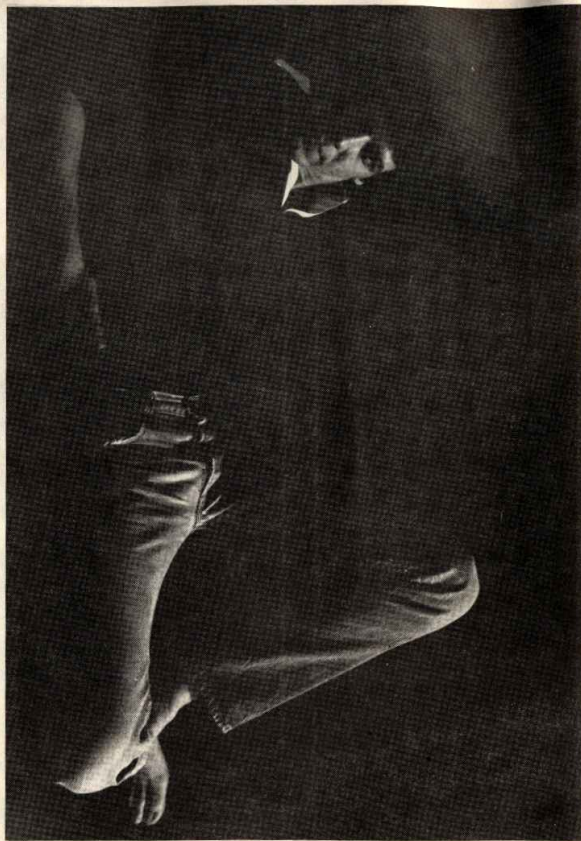

AVOID TOO MUCH SODIUM

Table salt contains sodium and chloride—both are essential elements.

Sodium is also present in many beverages and foods that we eat, especially in certain processed foods, condiments, sauces, pickled foods, salty snacks, and sandwich meats. Baking soda, baking powder, monosodium glutamate (MSG), soft drinks, and even many medications (many antacids, for instance) contain sodium.

It is not surprising that adults in the United States take in much more sodium than they need.

The major hazard of excessive sodium is for persons who have high blood pressure. Not everyone is equally susceptible. In the United States, approximately 17 percent of adults have high blood pressure.

Sodium intake is but one of the factors known to affect blood pressure. Obesity, in particular, seems to play a major role.

In populations with low-sodium intakes, high blood pressure is rare. In contrast, in populations with high-sodium intakes, high blood pressure is common. If people with high blood pressure severely restrict their sodium intakes, their blood pressures will usually fall—although not always to normal levels.

At present, there is no good way to predict who will develop high blood pressure, though certain groups, such as blacks, have a higher incidence. Low-sodium diets might help some of these people avoid high blood pressure if they could be identified before they develop the condition.

Since most Americans eat more sodium than is needed, consider reducing your sodium intake. Use less table salt. Eat sparingly those foods to which large amounts of sodium have been added. Remember that up to half of sodium

intake may be "hidden," either as part of the naturally occurring food or, more often, as part of a preservative or flavoring agent that has been added.

TO AVOID TOO MUCH SODIUM

- Learn to enjoy the unsalted flavors of foods
- Cook with only small amounts of added salt
- Add little or no salt to food at the table
- Limit your intake of salty foods, such as potato chips, pretzels, salted nuts and popcorn, condiments (soy sauce, steak sauce, garlic salt), cheese, pickled foods, cured meats
- Read food labels carefully to determine the amounts of sodium in processed foods and snack items

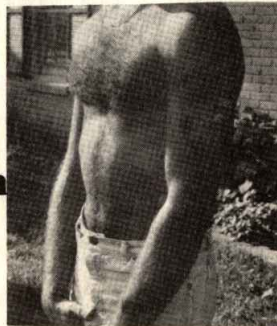

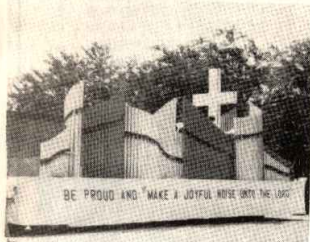

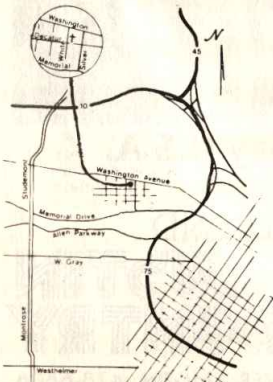

**AT THE CHURCH

DEE LAMB,
BILLIE STOFFEL,
AND MCCR

On August 3, 1980, at 10:45 a.m., Metropolitan Community Church of the Resurrection, 1919 Decatur, will hold a special service of celebration to license Exhorter Dee Lamb as a professional minister within the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches. During the service Rev. Lamb will be installed as assistant pastor of MCCR, and will be delivering the sermon.

Invitations to Rev. Lamb's licensing and installation have been sent to all churches within the South-Central District of the UFMCC. The district includes the states of Texas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, Arkansas, and part of Missouri, and has 13 church groups.

Rev. Lamb and her spouse, Billie Stoffel, first attended MCCR in March, 1975. Both became charter members when MCCR was chartered as a full church on April 20, 1975.

After several months of faithful attendance, Rev. Lamb became aware that God was calling her to an active ministry within MCCR. She responded, after a long candidacy period, by becoming a deacon under the Rev. Jeri Ann Harvey, who was at that time pastor of MCCR.

Through her service as a deacon, Rev. Lamb realized that her ministry for God should be a lifetime commitment. She petitioned the Board of Directors of MCCR for a change in her status and became an exhorter, or student minister, in 1977.

During the time that Rev. Lamb has served as an exhorter, she has worked full-time as a registered nurse, reared four children, taken a heavy course load of classes by correspondence and attendance at San Jacinto Junior College and the University of Houston, and has performed the rigorous duties of an exhorter in MCCR. She has also maintained a successful relationship with her companion of over seven years, who serves as Church Treasurer and Vice-Moderator of the Board of Directors of MCCR.

Rev. Lamb and her spouse have participated in the growth of MCCR from



a group of about 35 people renting a storefront building at 2020 Waugh Drive to the present membership of 350, who worship in the building purchased in March, 1979. Both have been instrumental in guiding, encouraging, and leading the congregation, and have selflessly given thousands of hours to the church in worship services, business meetings, work crews, social activities, cleaning parties. . . all the diversities of church life.

Rev. Lamb designed, implemented, and is currently directing the parish families program within MCCR. Parish families are geographical sub-divisions within the greater Houston area, and are used to promote closer fellowship and peer support among the members and friends of the church.

After meeting the stringent educational and experiential requirements set by the UFMCC, Rev. Lamb was recommended for licensing by the Rev. Charles W. Larsen, present pastor of MCCR. In order to be approved for licensing, Rev. Lamb first had to take and pass a ministerial proficiency test required by the UFMCC. Rev. Lamb made a composite score of 94 (out of 100) on all sections of the test, and was ranked in the top five percent of those tested.

From two rather timid women who first crept into a tiny church, Dee Lamb and Billie Stoffel have become two of the shining lights of MCCR. The licensing ceremony will be a triumph and a celebration for both of them, as well as a joyous declaration of pride by MCCR into of our own people who have achieved together an arduous and wonderful goal.

MCCR invites all people to be with us Sunday, August 3, 1980, at 10:45 a.m. to share in the celebration.

Equinox Theatre's "Razzle—A Musical Revue by Scott and Vivian Holtzman," is misbilled. It is a razzle (presumably the first half of a "razzle-dazzle," defined by Webster's as "a state or event of confusion and bewilderment"). But it is not "by" the Holtzmans.

The show is a pastiche of a few new songs by the pair, and a WHOLE LOT of very old, generally tired songs which have been produced, sung, danced, staged and played better elsewhere.

fresh and well-performed entertainment, one wonders what got into the BBQ sauce at George's. For this is not the theatre's style at all.

Motivation has gone out the window. Marilyn Myers (a great singer and good looker) is made to walk up the SR stair of Trudy Sween's smart set, only to walk down the SL stairs. People wander about, leaning against the walls, groaning about lost love and mother. Lyrics are repeated endlessly, until the audience wants to scream from tedium.

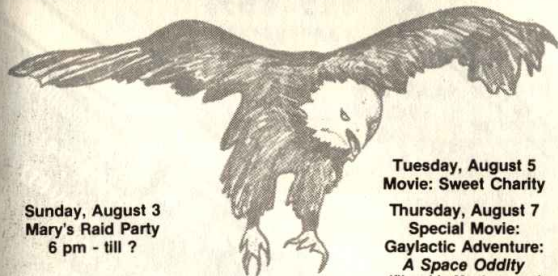

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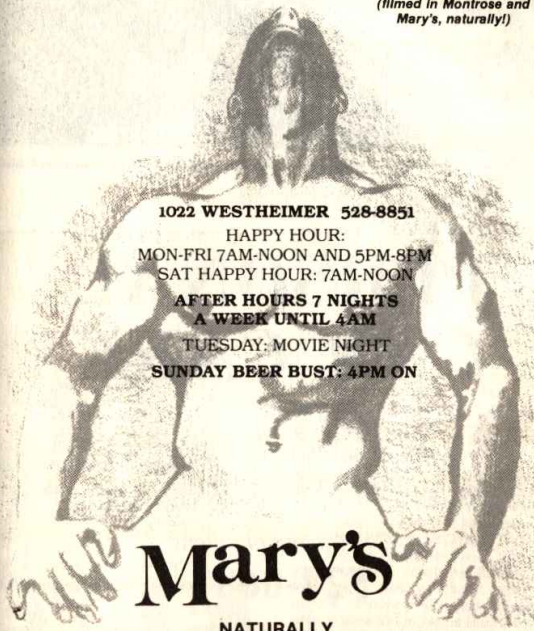
