Barney's World by Barney O'Reilly

I'm Gay.
So How Do I Get Somewhere
From There?

"Help!" That was little Barney crying out to himself at 14 or thereabouts. Mom and Dad weren't an awful lot of help. It wasn't their fault. They're straight. Little Barney knew he was normal, but it ain't easy being the only normal guy you know in eighth grade.

What a relief to little Barney to learn that there are at least two norms. It would have been awful to have so many—practically everybody Barney knew—unhealthy psychosexually. But "where do I go from here?" Nobody little Barney knew knew the answer—for him. Of course little Barney wasn't broadcasting the question—not in Houston.

There's still no roadmap—we're as human as anyone else—but today, thanks to the growing gay subculture, we have our own literature emerging. (And I'm not speaking about what's hidden in my top drawer.) Of course we all know that we now have gay literature, but that's as far as most of the gay community has considered the matter.

Gay theatre has grown into much more than old New York offerings like *The Boys in the Band* and *Women Behind Bars*—mainly what's been seen in Houston in recent years. Our friends in New Orleans have moved into gay theatre production in a manner thus far seen only in such culture-prone places as New York, California and London. In early August, an impressive program of four one-acts—three standards and one by New Orleans playwright—was produced in the French Quarter.

Theatre—like all other literary forms—not only entertains but tells us about life.

And the rapidly growing number of well written works by gays intended primarily for gay audiences and readers tells us about gay life. And for most of us that's the only roadmap available besides our own personal experiences. Barney knows that all gays are not as knowledgeable about themselves as they would like to be. The questions you ask Barney, the things you tell him on the phone indicate that you want to know more about gayness and gay life. "Well, Barney, you must know it all; you write about it." Now, guys, there are some things Barney cannot tell you that you ask him: the anxious young guy in love for the first time and with a hunk he wants to keep: "Who should do what to whom?" "How do I know he really loves me?" "He wants me to be his, but—" Okay, so Barney's been all those places, he still can't make decisions for you. What to do? If those are your only emotional problems you're normal and healthy! You need no counselor. The answers to those are whatever you want that's possible. But seeing and reading about gay situations helps you grow emotionally and make better decisions. Read a good book on gay life; go to a play or a gay movie (other than the 25¢ variety).

If you haven't read *The Naked Civil Servant*, repent of it. It is a sin. (Oops! Barney needs a rest. He's not only sounding like MM, he's making MM's words his very own. It's just that Barney's been hearing all those rumors about Moral Madness—MM—moving into Texas. It's getting to him.)

Quentin Crisp—the naked one—is an important gay writer and, kids, if you think you've been persecuted, check out that book. On second thought, it's not for kids; nor for Aunt Martha either. It's a tale of and for the hardy—and one of the best books, straight or gay, in the past dozen or so years. Who said "a queen is a queen is a queen"? Quentin Crisp never heard about it. I'd say he's unique, but then he's also exactly like every other queen you've ever met, too. What a life! What a witty, witty man.

One critic of gay literature early-on said that it's not gay without the gay bed. After what sounded like authoritative advice, Barney decided he'd better not try writing gay literature, though he'd been successful in the straight literary world. Being live in bed, that's one thing (O'lala); but writing about it—well... you

know Barney... bed scenes could be... embarrassing? Trite? (You ought to believe Barney.) Boring? Well, yes, boring. To Barney, sex is not a spectator sport. And if Barney got bored writing gay? Then I'd pity his readers—if he ad any left. And? Yes, you know Barney did. And? He's more readers than ever. How does Barney feel about it as a writer? C'est magnifique!

It's the viewpoint, however, that makes something gay—a gay telling a gay how it is with him. And Barney will give you a clue about the bed. I discovered that it's not much of a criterion—do straights spend every minute in bed in their stories? Then, why should we? It takes up so little of our time really—never mind how often. We're not very different, but the difference makes a difference.

Vive la difference!

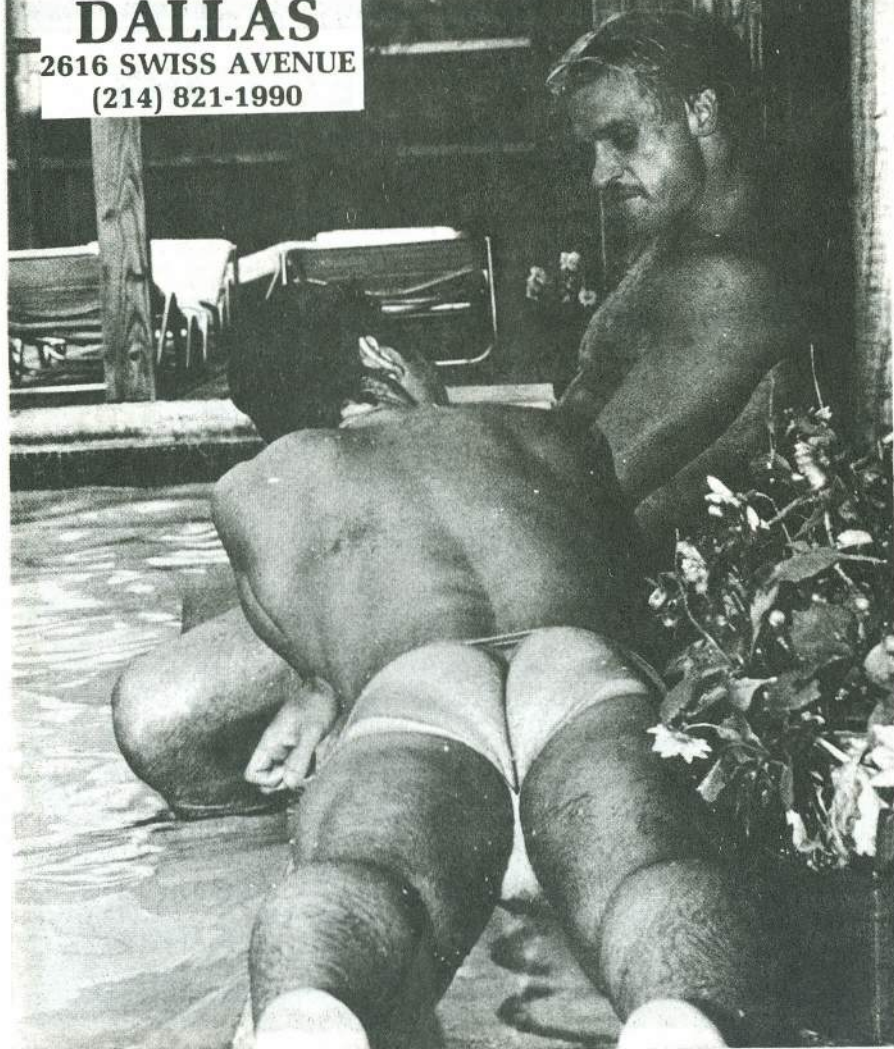
