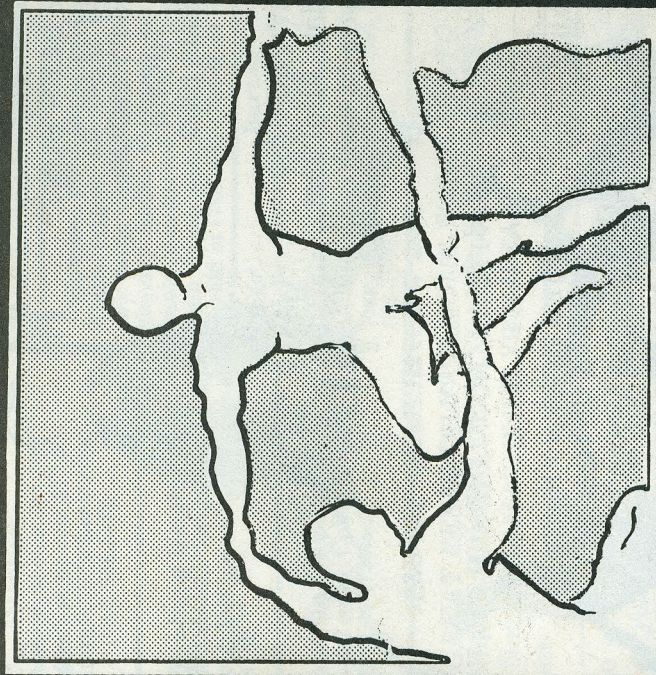


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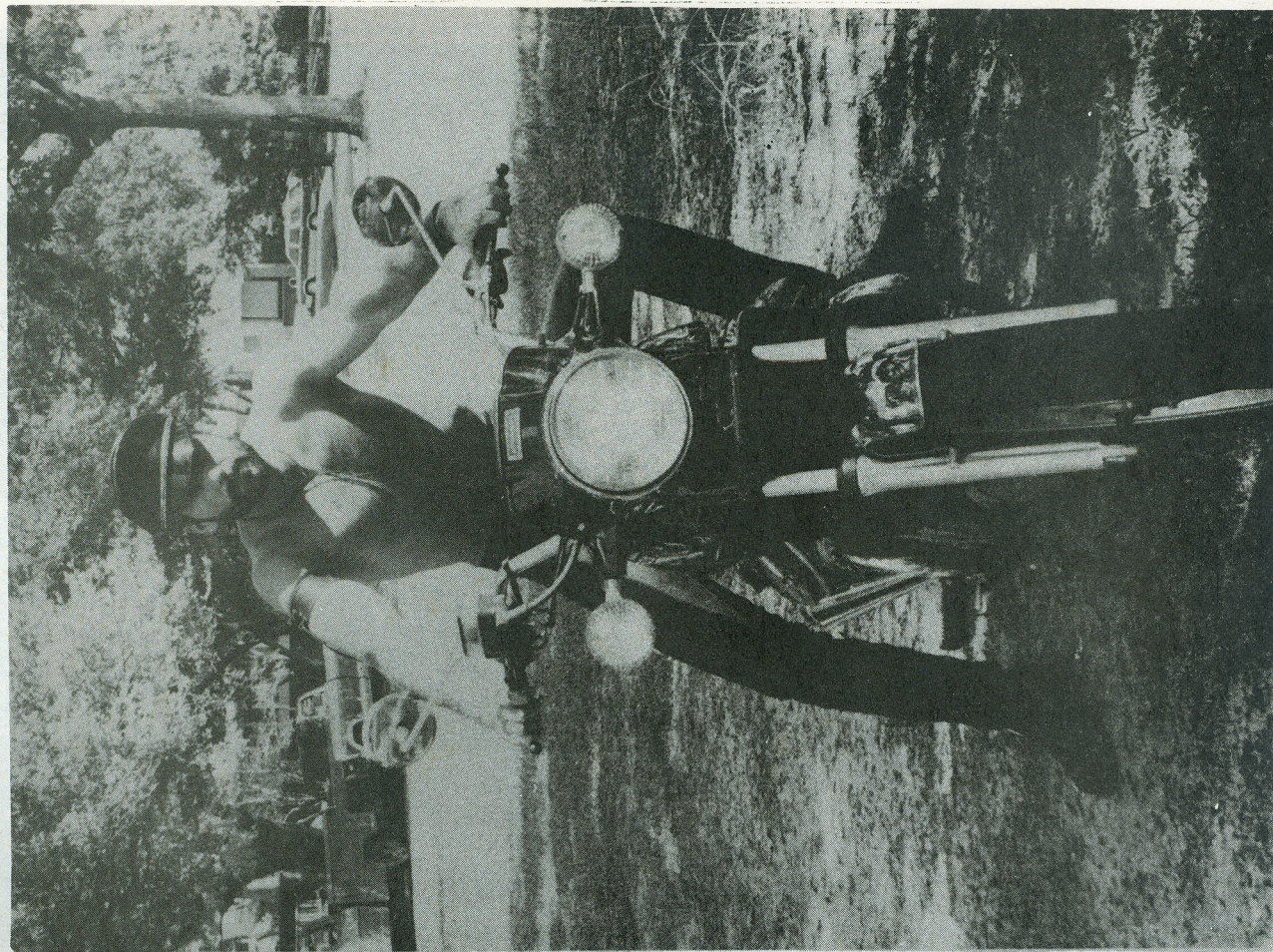
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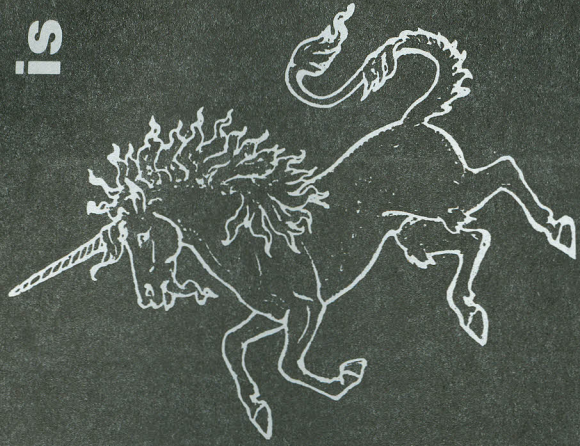
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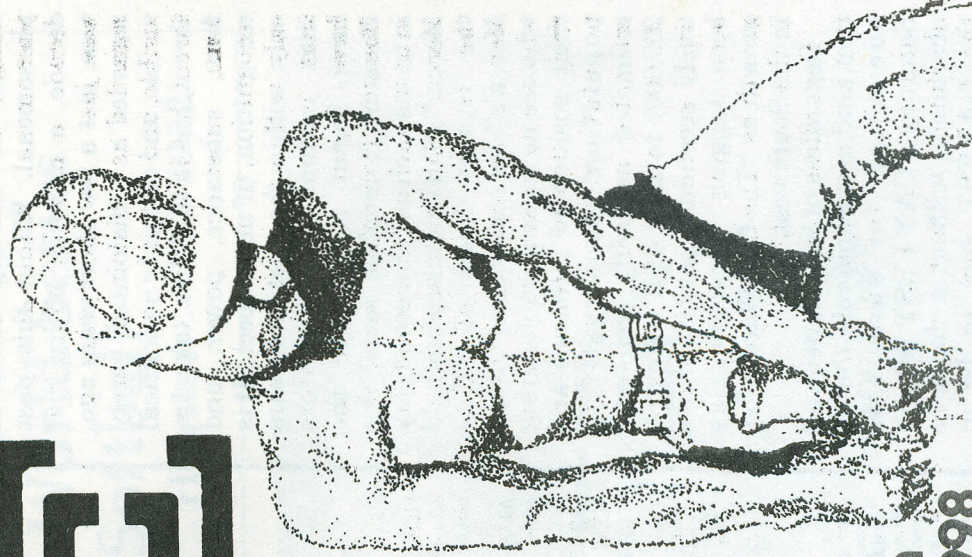
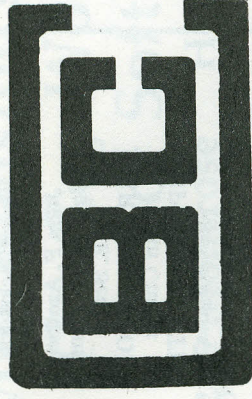
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## COMMENT

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## Bilge and Balderdash and Fags and Fairies

A homophobic reader of a Houston daily recently published a letter to impress the bigots of assdom by calling our Gay Pride Week "bilge and balderdash." (Both, of course, mean "nonsense.") But, madam, you're a bit confused; it's your letter that's b & b—not our Gay Pride Week; it's now a noble celebration of gay life. Indeed, in your letter it's difficult for a literate person to see the bilge for the balderdash; it's so pissy-minded. Guys and gals, does that not sound like another letter writer we've known? One whose homophobic b & b was especially vicious—outright lies often—b & b in a class all of its own?

Well, she's out of retirement—the "sweetheart of Montrose"—and at it again. Barney was so in hopes she'd taken her swansong to heart and fled. Remember? "The gays are trying to run me out of town" was her plaintive cry on TV that day more than a year ago, when she received a broadside, a no-holds-barred letter from Barney along with a verbal offensive from an army of Houston gays. She'd been especially vicious and silly, hadn't she? Had she made the leap into the pit of mad and kindred spirits, Barney wanted

to know. She'd been braying all over the media that she did not want Houston to become a "mecca for homos" now that she was getting it cleaned up—she also fights porn. Those months of golden silence—how sweet it was. Geneva, darling, old Barney's back, too.

Because no one hereabouts sounds off on the public record more than she, and no one has ever said less, Barney has become fascinated by her. She represents the unscaled Mt. Everest of human communication to him. Something's bound to penetrate her rocky crags some time. But when? What monumental force of intellect will be required? To begin to understand her verbal we must first get to **her** problem, however. Now, there's a challenge. Is it a mind wrought with bilge and balderdash? That's all that comes out of it, true. But I think it's far more deep-seated.

Maybe we threw out Freud before he'd been fully tested: Was it potty problems in infancy do you suppose, darling, that made you the way you are? Love is the norm for healthy humans—not your hate. Or did a male giraffe flash you on a visit

to the zoo during your early years? That could wreck an entire life, Freud's wisdom suggests. Freudianly speaking, that could even be the cause of Barney's "condition," mightn't it? Little Barney seeing a giraffe's and realizing he could never compete? . . . umm . . . With Freud you never know. On second through, darling, let's let Freud rest in peace. He knew precious little more about Barney's kind than you. It takes one to even begin to know. But we are concerned with you. You're the social problem.

Let's consider Geneva's recently published letter in which she states emphatically and categorically that homosexuality is not a matter of heredity. NO ONE, least of all Geneva, can make that statement based on current knowledge. Some aspects of gayness are congenital—we were born with them—but the exact mechanisms of transmission are too subtle for confirmation by present knowledge. The point is that Geneva is a LIE—so what else is new? But some pretty solid research indicates what all gays know is true: We are the way we are long before our awareness of our sexuality—we were taught nothing gay before we knew we were. Who, pray tell, "conditioned" us—our straight parents? (Geneva, if you're going to talk about Barney you will have to define your terms or he will define you.) Some

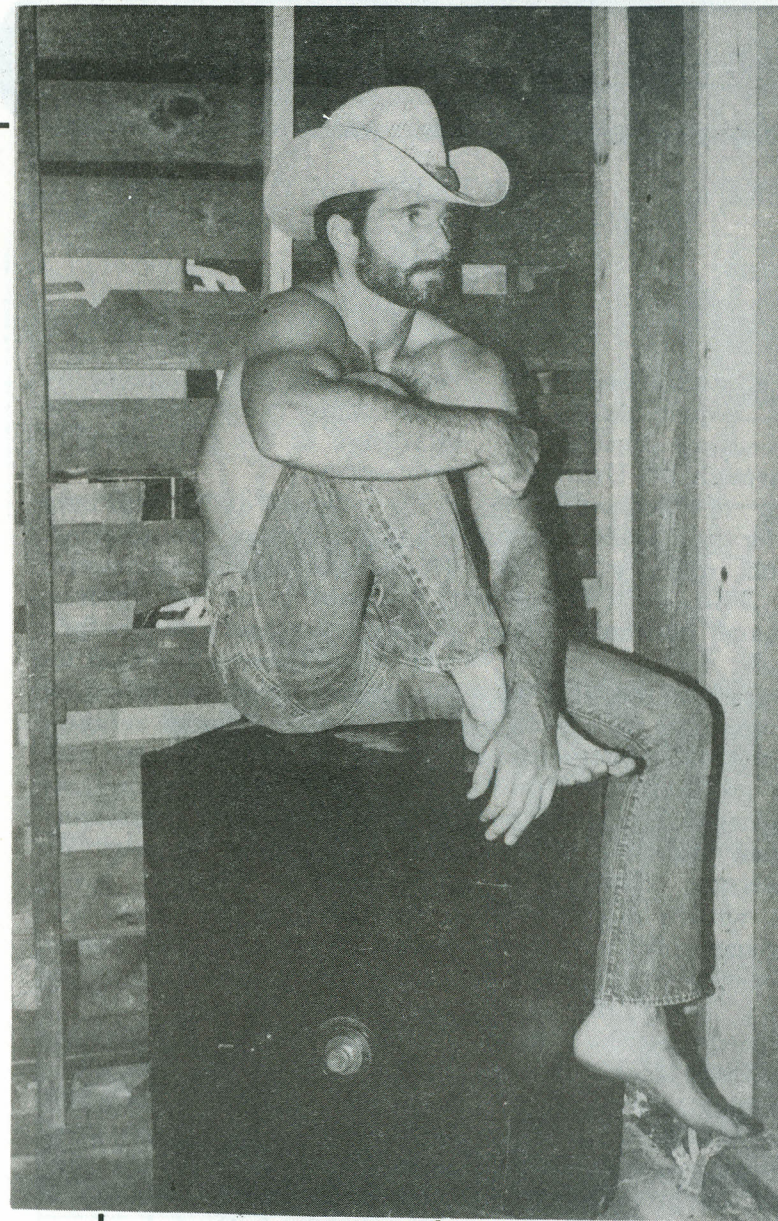
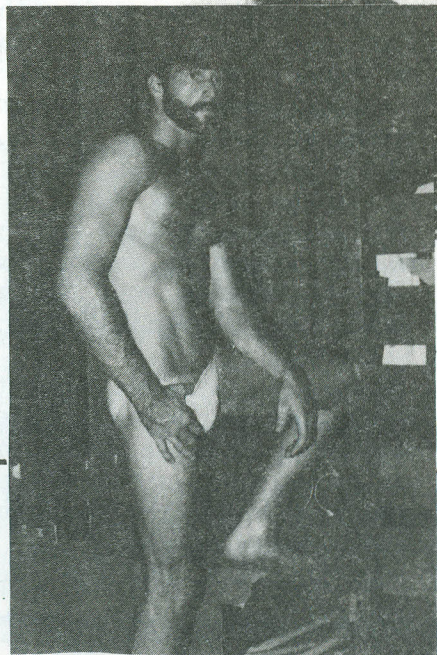
research indicates that the probable answer for many of us is in pre-natal development (but not necessarily genetics).

Alas, Geneva's partner of old is also back. It's the "nonsense" twins—Bilge and Balderdash—in encore. Though assininity has seen no two greater disciples, they are so dedicated to their hates that they are effective. Texas has its dubious porn law in large measure to the scare and hate tactics of these two (formerly the Citizens Against Pornography.) And they are dedicated to NO gay rights.

"The gay community is very insidious . . . It goes beyond individual rights—it undermines the concept of the family." Only an idiot or a hoodlum or a psychopath would put such filth on the public record, Mr. Walling. Most gays have nothing whatsoever to do with families—by God's will; we had no choice of our sexuality. The burden of evidence, sir, for your perfidious allegation is on you, an alleged "man of God." Hating in Christ's name is one of the most revolting attitudes known in the Christian world, for Christ's doctrine was but a word—"love". Learn it, Walling; I dare you.

Gays, our weapons against this attack are our pen to write legislators about the menace to our human rights and our vote to assure we have legislators who will represent **us**, as well.

## THIRTEEN GAY CUBAN REFUGEES ARRIVING IN HOUSTON GAY COMMUNITY

The gay community of Houston is responding to the appeal of the State Department, working through the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Churches, for the placement and assimilation of gay Cuban refugees. The gay Cuban refugees have not only been denied basic human dignity, rights and freedom in Cuba; but have been uprooted from native country, culture, language, and family. In addition they have faced ostracism and abuse from other Cuban refugees in the camps where they await placement, which has necessitated their segregation for their protection.

The gay community of Houston recognizes the appeal of the State Dept. to UFMCC as a unique opportunity with far reaching positive implications for the entire gay community. This is the first time a Federal Government Agency has approached an organization with a predominantly gay outreach for assistance.

The rapid, efficient placement and assimilation of these gay Cuban refugees, at present considered an embarrassment by much of the country, as well as the object of much miscon-

ception, fear and prejudice by the straight community, is the challenge of the Houston gay community.

The refugees arrive with only the clothes they are wearing. There is the need for provision of the basic need of shelter, clothing, food and a chance for a new start. There is the need for job opportunities and offers for transportation so the refugees will be able to become self-supporting and contributing members of the gay community and society in general. In addition, the greatest single initial need is for tutors and instructors to teach the basics of English as a second language; and for translators.

Classes in basic Spanish are being offered on Thursday evenings in the Fellowship Hall at MCCR at 7:30. There is an open invitation to the gay community. Classes will also be offered in basic English.

Meetings are being held, open to the entire gay community, for concerned members of the community to formulate planning, answer questions, enlist volunteers for the various aspects of the program, and facilitate implementation of the program. A Steering Committee

was formed at the meeting on August 18.

At the invitation of Arthur Cordova, president of the Gay Hispanic Caucus, Michael Oliver spoke to the group at their meeting on Tuesday, August 19, at 7:30 p.m.

Rev. Charles Larsen, pastor of MCCR, communicated the needs and informed those present at the Community Advisory Meeting held at the Flamingo Restaurant Wednesday, August 20 at 5:30.

Three hundred gay Cubans have been placed in gay communities throughout the

country to date, with a minimum of 400 still waiting in camps to be placed. Volunteer sponsors must be available and approved before they can leave the camps. Eighty gay Cuban refugees have been placed in San Francisco. Many of these are already self-supporting at this time.

Of the 13 arriving in Houston at this time, there are two couples. They will be housed by 11 sponsors already approved by UFMCC through which the program is being coordinated. Two of these are lesbians.

There is a need for more volunteers to be primary sponsors (with a critical need for sponsors for lesbians.) The responsibility for the sponsors is humanitarian. There is no legal responsibility involved. There is also a need for co-sponsors to assist the sponsors, and for volunteers to be "helping hands."

Volunteers will be available to answer questions, to give further information, and to accept your support between 6-9 p.m. Monday through Friday and between 8-5 p.m. Saturday and Sunday at 861-9149.

We invite your input and your aid in the unique opportunity that has been given to us to help other gay people in the quest for basic human dignity for which we all seek.

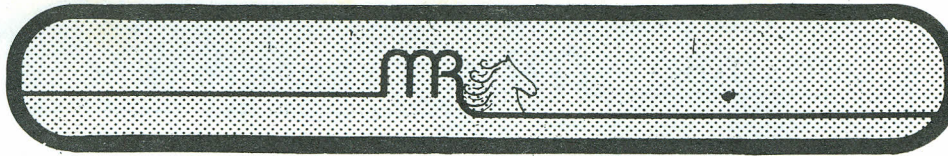

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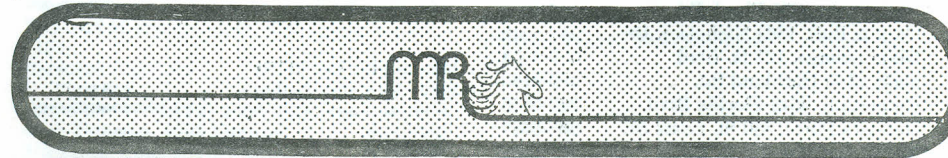
