The darkly malevolent, clandestine encounter in the alley... brains and blood splattered over the oil and soot-soaked asphalt. The lonely, forbrooding gleam of a flood-light was the only witness... witness to deadly commanding bark of the huge 45 caliber automatic... witness to the half-dressed police officers fugitively trying to dispel the evidences of their off-duty indiscretions, a bloody beer can tossed to one side. But the floodlight will never speak.

This grotesque incident robbed the Houston Gay Community, brutally and without warning, of one of its most valuable advocates and worker... stolen from us at the point of a gun... on the eve of our greatest day of jubilation and celebration, casting a deliberate pall over a parade and a victorious rally. Fred Paez, 27, the energetic organizer, the drill-master of the GPC office, the friend to many, was dead.

Left behind, in the wake of this murder (accidental or not), is a legacy of unanswered questions, hazy stories, missing parts of evidence, and doubtful conclusions. Too many questions to tabulate... too many to possibly ignore. There are questions enough indeed to render mythological, the purported police scenrio that has Paez the victim of his own "perversions" (sic), a sexual fantasy gone wrong... at the hands of a "butch" macho cop that unwittingly was made to be the other actor in this fatal fantasy trip of Paez's.

We who knew Fred are convinced that, given Fred's almost prudish (certainly old-fashioned) behind-closed-doors approach to assignments and his healthy over-riding respect for the awesome powers of law enforcement agencies (including the use and abuse of deadly force), it appears to us singularly doubtful that: (1) Paez would have made the moves the cops say he made, (2) would have in any way attempted to struggle with an officer... let alone one with his gun drawn. All the facts surrounding that horrible final solution of Fred Paez's life in the alley of the warehouse on Capitol Street... fairly screams at you that something is not right, something is very much wrong with the police-supported version of the story.

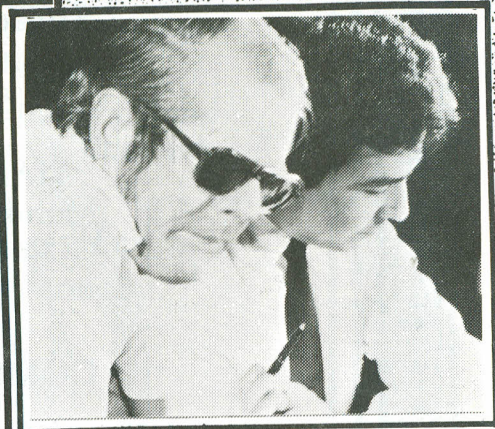
What is the kind of a man who would even attempt such a punitive punishment upon himself?

What would drive a man to perpetuate the tradition of a fool-hardy gimmick such as this?

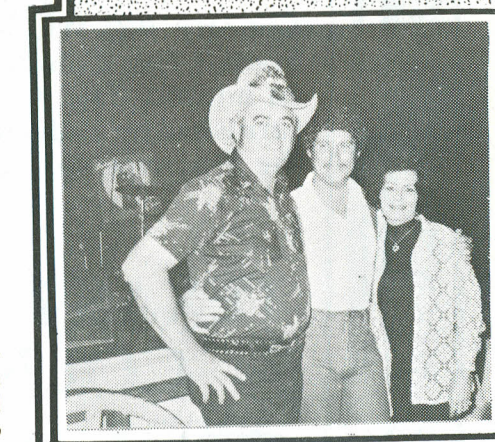
What such a man indeed?
