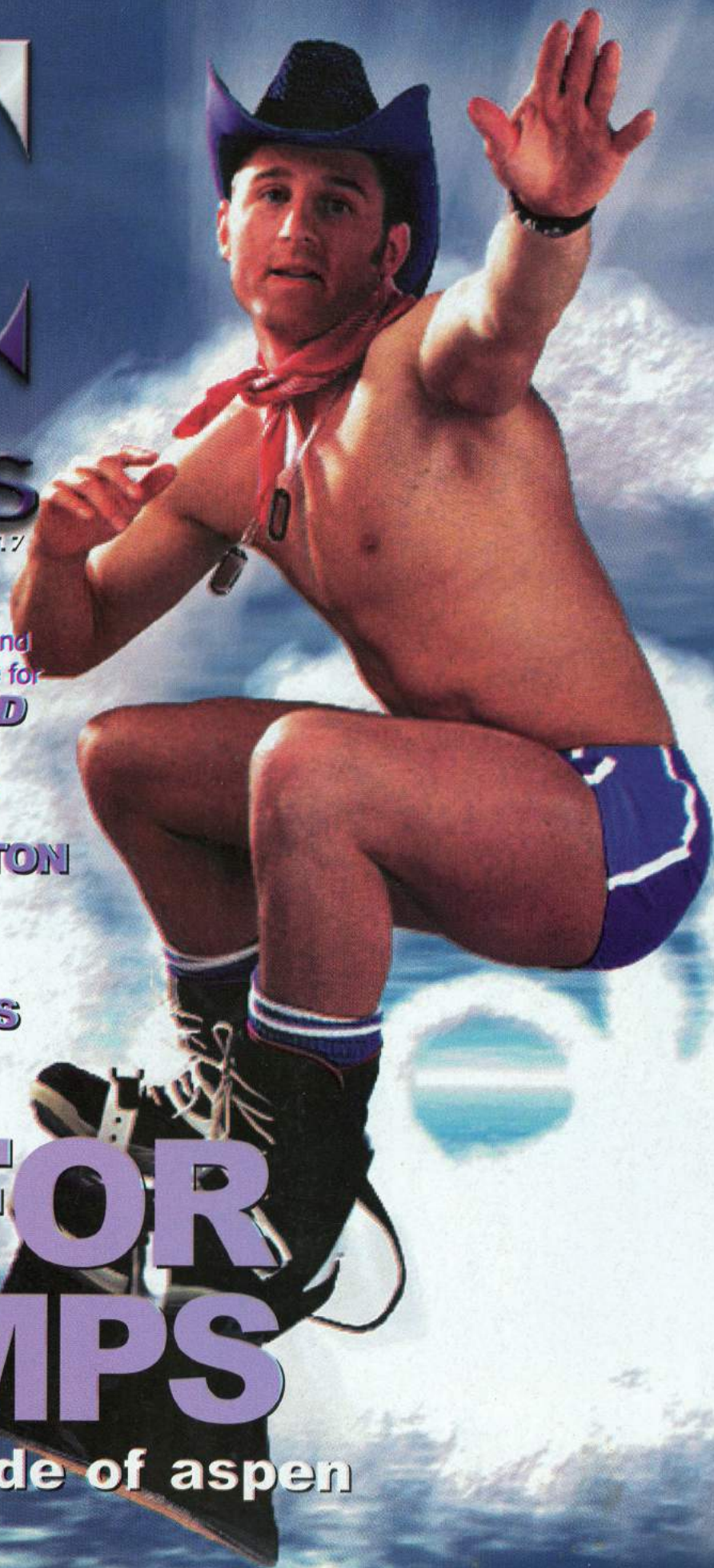

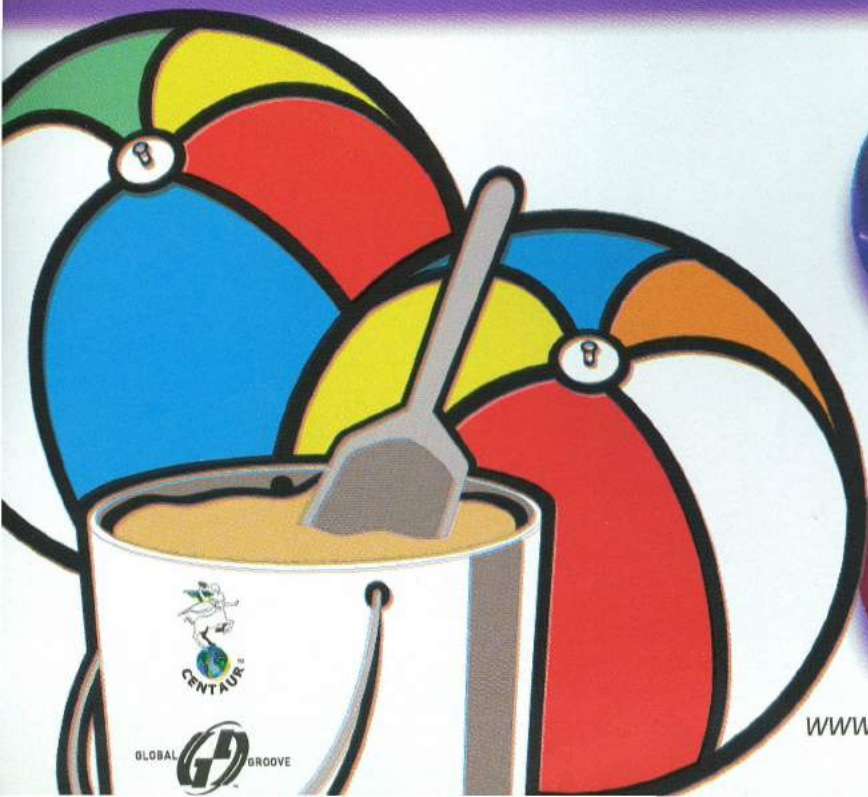

The Masters are back at work! And this time it's all about the new compilation that they have mixed for West End Records. That's right, Kenny Dope and Louie Vega have busted up a 2-CD set for the ever fabu and timeless West End label — *The 25th Anniversary Edition Mastermix*.

The set contains 21 remastered, re-EQ'd West End Catalog classics, seven of which have been remixed. When we say remixed, we don't mean chopped up and redone like most remixes are today. They have actually taken the masters and remixed for flawless sound quality. You'll find tracks like "Heartbeat" (Taana Gardner), "Do It To the Music" (Raw Silk), "Don't Make Me Wait" (NYC Peech Boys), "Is It All Over My Face" (Loose Joints), "Heat You Up" (Shirley Lites), "Keep On Dangin'" (Phase II) and a ton more, all mixed up in party fashion by Masters at Work.

The packaging is spectacular and the quality is second to none. And it's all due to the fierce West End diva, general manager "Andyman" Reynolds. Sister does know how to whip out a compilation! There will also be a limited edition vinyl recording coming on this stellar project in the near

future.

Ouch! What loveliness!

One of the best gifts I got for Christmas this year was *The Calling* CD. The Calling are a powerful new LA band that draws on its decadent Southern California roots to make their music defiantly upbeat and unsettlingly intimate. Fueled by the songwriting of guitarist Aaron Kamin and lead singer Alex Band, *The Calling* turns in one of the year's most auspicious debuts with *Camino Palermo*, their RCA Records premiere album. Produced by Marc Tanner, with eight tracks mixed by the legendary Chris Lord-Alge, the new album serves up hit after hit.

Of course you are more than likely familiar with the hit "Wherever You Will Go." But my pick from the album is "Could It Be Any Harder." If you like to span out and listen to some Alternative Rock, then this will surely be a clever addition to your collection.

One of my favorite pop singles of last year (and still today) is "Superman" by Five for Fighting. This is another spectacular non-dance album that's in very high rotation in my new mp3 player these days. (Yes, we're sporting yet another smart new toy from our Christmas stocking)

Led by the enigmatic John Ondrasik, Five For Fighting's debut album, *America Town*, broke into the Billboard Top 200 Album chart this past summer and has been steadily climbing (Currently holding at #73). Adding to this jubilation is the fact that "Superman (It's Not Easy)," the second single from *America Town*, is receiving significant airplay on several radio formats and has been added to more than 50 stations in the U.S. *America Town* is an ambitious and wholly satisfying work. It's not necessary to dig too deeply to hear sounds and melodies and instruments reminiscent of contemporaries like Dave Matthews and Ben Folds and classics like The Beatles and Elton John.

On the personal tip, I saw Ondrasik perform recently at Madison Square Garden. It was a Christmas show for the local radio station Z100. As he played his grand piano and sang "Superman," members of the NYPD and New York Fire Dept surrounded the upper level of the balcony with their families, carrying blue and red glowsticks respectively. As all this was going on they showed images of the WTC and the entire place was in tears. I've been a fan ever since. The album is amazing!

And that's the beats.

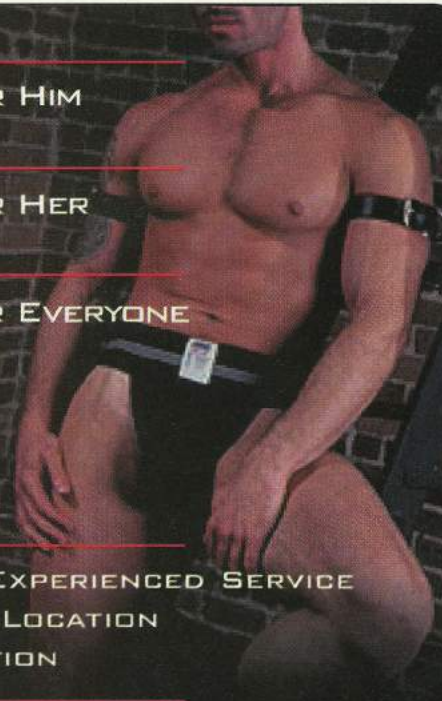

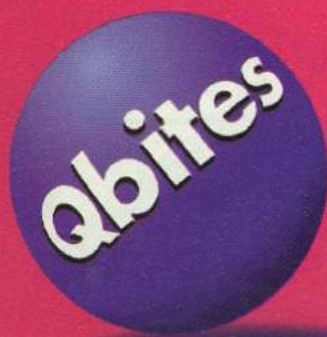
