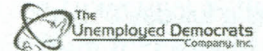

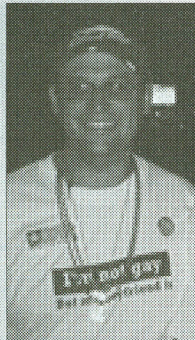

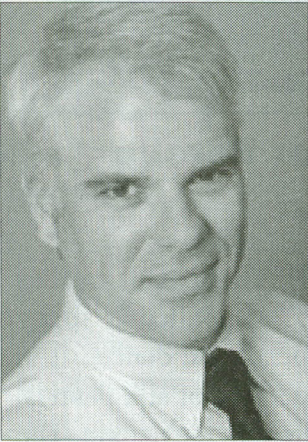

The 79th Texas Legislature just finished up 140 days of inactive - and often questionable - political thumb-twittling that resulted in only three major accomplishments: an overhauled state's workers' compensation program, adjustments to the obviously-broken Child Protective Services systems, and a proposed constitutional ban on gay marriage.

But figuring out a way to pay for Texas children's public education and an equitable means for lowering school property taxes just didn't seem to excite the Republican-led lawmakers. Nor was addressing the state's critical water problems, or addressing further limits that corporate money can play in elections. I guess the fact that GOP groups are in hot water for misusing corporate money in 2002 gerrymandering elections just didn't resonate with them.

No, our elected leaders showed they were much more interested in attacking gays and lesbians - again - and trying to regulate high school cheerleaders. And then Governor Perry not only picks Gay Pride week to stage his signing of the legislation that will put the gay marriage ban on the November ballot - in a church no less - he tells the Fort Worth Star Telegram that gay veterans returning from Iraq should leave Texas.

I'm so glad our elected officials have their priorities are in order.

# Booty Call

I love to people watch, and Austin's Gay Pride Parade gave me a great opportunity to do that. I saw some guys with big chiseled chests, bulging biceps, huge triceps, and ripped abs, but I was also shocked to see how many of these same guys couldn't fill out a nice pair of cargo shorts.

Last month, I addressed what could be done to get that summer six-pack, but apparently a lot of us need to work on our booty as well. What would I recommend you do to create a butt that gets noticed (touched, pinched, grabbed...)? One word - squats.

If you only have time to do one exercise for your legs and glutes, make sure this is the one. No other exercise gives you more "bang for the buck" than squats.

If done correctly, this one exercise can work out your glutes, hamstrings, quadriceps, abdominals, and lower back. That's more than half of your body at one time! Best of all, you don't need to lift a lot of weight to see and feel the difference. Try doing four sets of 12-15 repetitions and see if your butt doesn't feel a little firmer.

How do you do them?

**Use a bench.** Before you start to squat, make sure you have a sturdy and well-padded bench behind you. This will give you peace-of-mind in case you lose your balance and start to fall backward - as well as a way to gauge how low you are squatting.

**Lead with your butt, not with your knees.** The squat movement starts from your hips - not your knees - and you move backward, not forward. Your hips should push back to the bench while your knees stay over your heels. (I have most of my clients start sitting down on the bench with their knees at a 90 degree angle so they can visualize the down position of the squat).



## Speaking of Fitness

**Keep your upper body from leaning forward.** As you learn to squat by pushing backward, the natural tendency will be to have your upper body lean forward to counter-balance your hips. Avoid this bad form and keep your shoulders back and chest up. Try holding a weighted bar (use it like a cane) to help you balance as you squat.

**Put your hands behind your head.** This will help keep your chest open and your upper torso from leaning forward. It will also force you to balance better.

**Take a wide stance with your feet.** A wide base of support will help you balance, and it will open up your hips so that you may squat deeper. The lower you can squat, the greater the number of muscles that you will activate.

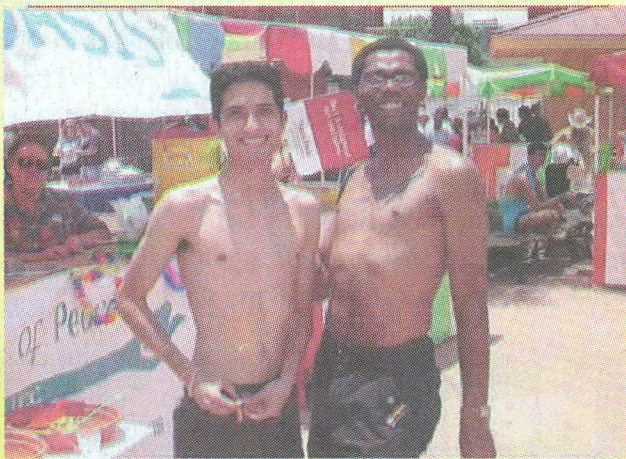

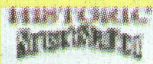

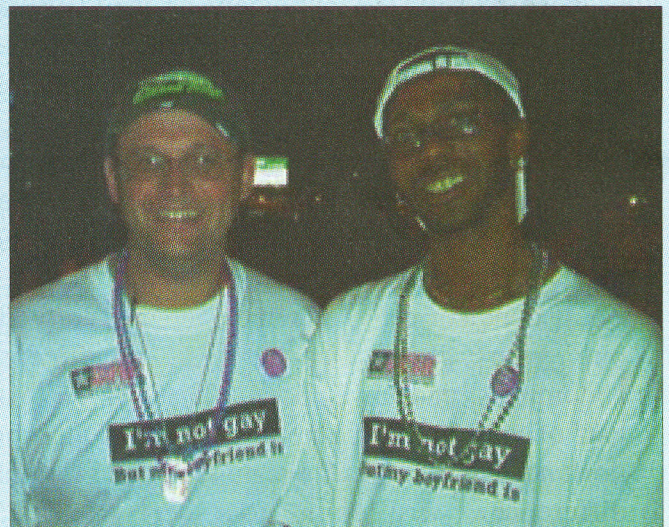

The annual Pridefest San Antonio celebration takes over the historic Sunset Station near downtown San Antonio on Saturday, June 18th, from noon and 8 p.m. Events scheduled include a first-ever gallery art show, live music, vendor booths, local organization booths, a health fair and other events.



"The event will be opened formally with religious services and the American Veterans for Equal Rights color guard and the activities will not stop for the rest of the day," said Ron Clarke, Pridefest spokesman. "This entire day will be fun, entertainment and event filled. Our organizers have worked very hard with our sponsors to assure that there will be entertainment for the entire duration of the event."

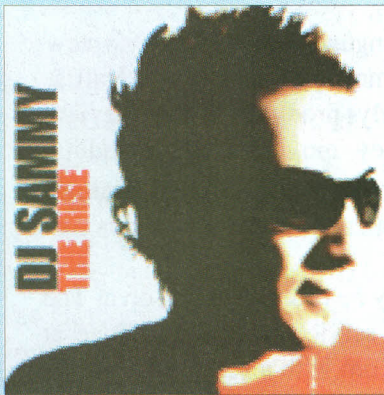


# GROOVE LINES

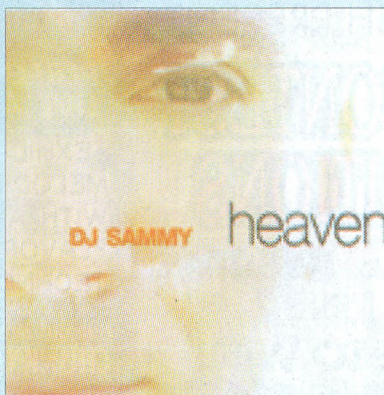

The single "Heaven" - a cover of a classic Bryan Adams hit - made to Number One overseas and Number Two here in the states. The album was in the Top 10 in more



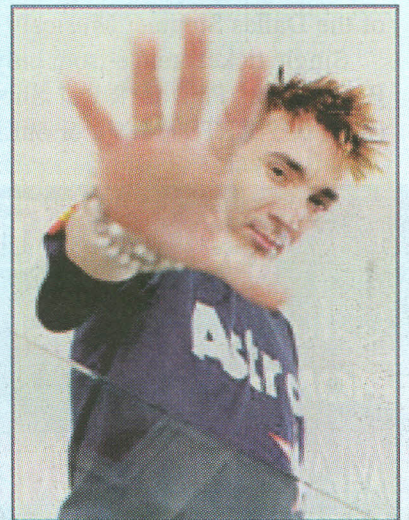
than 25 countries worldwide. His cover of the Don Henly smash "The Boys Of Summer" went to Number Two in both the U.K. and the U.S.

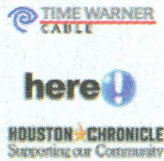

## Wedding Cake Liberation Event Addresses Gay Marriage on June 16th

In conjunction with the Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby (LGRL) meeting to be held in San Antonio in June, the Alamo City GLBT community takes on the anti-gay marriage amendment debate with the Wedding Cake Ceremony and Consciousness Raising. The satirical event will be held in the Joan Grona Gallery at the Blue Star Art Complex, 1414 S. Alamo, from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.

"The beautiful and talented Martha Oestreich has asked me to join her in planning a LGRL event in San Antonio," said event organizer Gene Elder and HAPPY Foundation Archives Director. "We decided that June would be a good time to gather our community together. We need to get everyone

on the same page with this new marriage amendment battle."

At 6:30 p.m., speaker Randall Ellis, Executive Director of LGRL, will address attendees. Then at 7 p.m., author Toby Johnson will preside over the Cutting the Wedding Cake Communion Ceremony and Harry W. Haines will lead the "congregation" in singing his Texas premier performance of *The Breeders Anthem* - sung to the tune of *Ode to Joy*.

"We think that people who reproduce don't get enough credit in this society," Haines said wryly. "So we have dedicated *The Breeders Anthem* to all human body parts used in reproduction,

regardless of sexual orientation, gender, marriage status, hygiene, and so on."

"The wedding cake has become the chosen method of protest against the Marriage Amendment in Texas," Elder said. "Never has battle tasted so good, or a wedding cake been so fierce."

Toby Johnson is a renowned author of several books on homosexuality and religion. He and his partner of 21 years, Kip Dollar, are the first male couple to be registered as Domestic Partners in the state of Texas.

In an event organized by LGRL in 1991, Dollar and Johnson applied for marriage licenses in Travis County. They were reluctantly refused by County Clerk Dana DeBeauvoir, who used the event to make a public declaration of support for then legislation to delete references to gender in the state's marriage laws.

Two years later, Dollar and Johnson again went before Ms. DeBeauvoir; she happily issued them a Declaration of Domestic Partnership in Travis County in what was - at that time - a major political victory. Johnson will speak about his experiences during the Wedding Cake event.

"In the end, what this will do is improve the power of our community," Ellis said. "For the next five months this will be an issue that will be talked about constantly. The more we talk about this issue, the more people will realize marriage equality is not a scary thing."

On Friday, June 17th, LGRL will host a lunch with Ellis at Madhatters, 320 Beauregard, at 2 p.m. Seating for the event is limited.

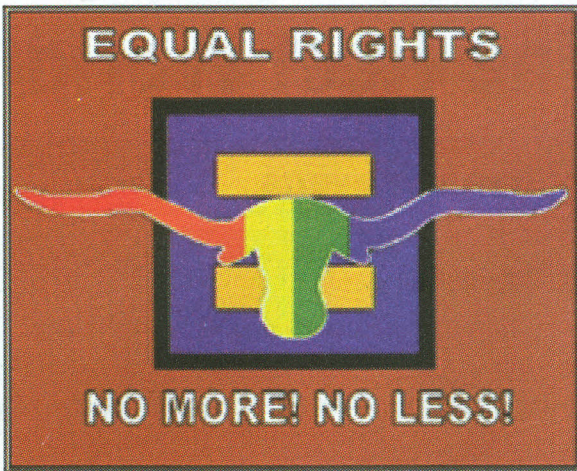

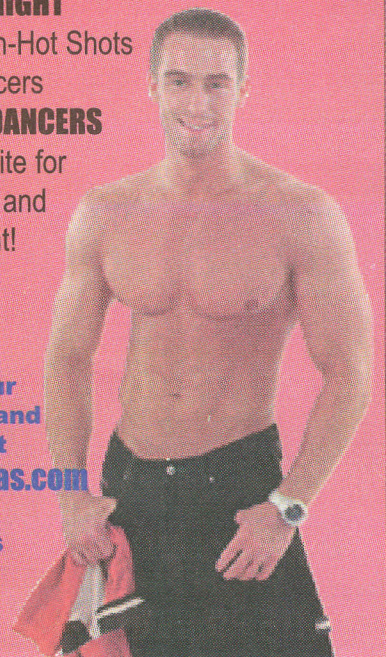

### Pitt and Jolie Are Hot Targets in Mr. & Mrs. Smith

Grade: B+

As the summer begins, the blockbuster movies keep rolling in. We've already experienced smash hit films such as *Star Wars: Episode III - Revenge of the Sith*, *The Longest Yard*, *Madagascar*, and *Cinderella Man*. And as we look forward to the rest of the summer, there are still a number of huge films that will be gracing the silver screen: *Batman Begins*, *War of the Worlds*, *Fantastic Four*, and *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*.

Now as particular battles occur in the previously mentioned films, none of them match up to the conflicts of marriage. From Doug Liman - the director that brought you *The Bourne Identity* and *Swingers* - comes an action-packed face-off between husband and wife, who use heavy artillery and explosives to solve their problems instead of marriage counseling.

But everything comes out in the open when both of their missions collide while trying to eliminate the same target.

The only problem is that the agencies they work for are against each other. Now both John and Jane are given 48 hours to assassinate each other, otherwise their agencies will kill them both. For assistance, John turns to his colleague Eddie (Vince Vaughn - *Be Cool*, *Dodgeball: A True Underdog Story*) and Jane turns to her coworker Jasmine (Kerry Washington - *Ray*, *Against the Ropes*). As the two sides try to eliminate each other, both John and Jane realize that their marriage is more important than their careers and they will do anything it takes to stay alive.

*Mr. & Mrs. Smith* is both funny and witty as it is clever and suspenseful. This film kicks some serious butt, and it has everything you're looking for in a movie: action, comedy, action, suspense, action, romance, and of course, action. Both Brad and Angelina steam-up the screen in this ultimate battle of the sexes. Director Doug Liman formulates the film to be like *True Lies* meets *War of the Roses*.

And the great thing about this movie is that you enjoy every minute of it. Every summer, moviegoers look forward to films that give them an escape from reality and keep their attention. *Mr. & Mrs. Smith* does just that; it's entertainment ignited. *Mr. & Mrs. Smith* is one hour and 59 minutes and rated PG-13 for sequences of violence, intense action, sexual content and brief strong language.



# Batman Begins

## "Batman Begins" Where the Previous Films Should Have Started

Grade: A-

He's back! Batman finally returns to the silver screen with a dark and sinister story that dives into the depths of how it all began. After watching the original *Batman* film franchise spiral into a pit of destruction - including an even worse spin-off of the beloved character Catwoman - it seemed as if hope was lost for the infamous Caped Crusader. Now after eight long years of anticipation, the Batman franchise returns under the helm of director Christopher Nolan (*Insomnia*, *Memento*) with a story that explores the origins of the Batman legend and the Dark Knight's emergence as a force for good in Gotham City.

This time around, Christian Bale (*American Psycho*, *Reign of Fire*) plays the billionaire playboy Bruce Wayne, who has been imprisoned in a Bhutanese jail after immersing himself in the criminal underworld. After witnessing his parents gunned-down as a child, Bruce blames himself for his parents' death and is tormented by guilt and anger, which fuel his desire for revenge.

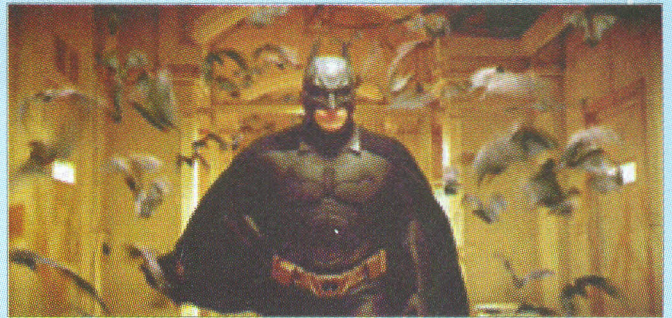
After being released from prison, Bruce is summoned by Henri Ducard (Liam Neeson - *Kinsey*, *Kingdom of Heaven*), who trains him to master the physical and mental disciplines that will empower Bruce to fight the evil he vows to destroy. Soon Bruce finds himself seeking counsel with the dangerous but honorable ninja cult leader known as Ra's al-Ghul (Ken Watanabe - *The Last Samurai*).

Bruce returns to Gotham City seven years later to find it overwhelmed by crime and corruption. Meanwhile, Bruce's childhood friend - and now Assistant District Attorney - Rachel Dawes (Katie Holmes - *Pieces of April*, *First Daughter*) can't convict the city's most ruthless criminals, because the justice system is being run by a notorious crime boss named Carmine Falcone (Tom Wilkinson - *Girl with the Pearl Earring*, *Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind*).

Rachel also has to deal with Dr. Jonathan Crane (Cillian Murphy - *28 Days Later*, *Cold Mountain*), a prominent psychiatrist who is the head of Gotham's Arkham Asylum mental facility. What Rachel and

Bruce don't realize is that Dr. Crane has developed a toxin allowing him to tap into and unleash his patients' worst fears. As his alter-ego, the hideously-masked Scarecrow, he uses terror and paranoia as weapons against them.

With the help of his trusted butler Alfred (Michael Caine - *Austin Powers in Goldmember*, *Secondhand Lions*), a detective sergeant named Jim Gordon (Gary Oldman - *Hannibal*, *Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban*), and Lucius Fox (Morgan Freeman - *Million Dollar Baby*, *Unleashed*) - his ally at Wayne Enterprises - Bruce Wayne unleashes his awe-inspiring alter-ego: Batman, a masked crusader who uses strength, intellect, and an array of high tech weaponry to fight the sinister forces that threaten to destroy the city of Gotham.



I have to say this movie was amazing! Christopher Nolan did an amazing job showing the audience how it all began, why Bruce Wayne became Batman, and what we were missing (and wanting) from the previous Batman films. *Batman Begins* delivers a very dark side to our hero's past and shows us how he acquires the skills, tools, and technology to create his intimidating alter-ego. Christian Bale brings a very aggressive and animalistic nature to Batman and makes us realize that Batman is actually a human superhero without superpowers. One thing parents should be aware of is that - just like *Star Wars: Episode III - Revenge of the Sith* - this film is not meant for young children. The action scenes are pretty violent and the film is very dark and brutal.

However, *Batman Begins* has revitalized the franchise, spawning two future sequels that are sure to be just as action-packed and story-driven as this film. *Batman Begins* is two hours and 20 minutes and rated PG-13 for intense action violence, disturbing images and some thematic elements.

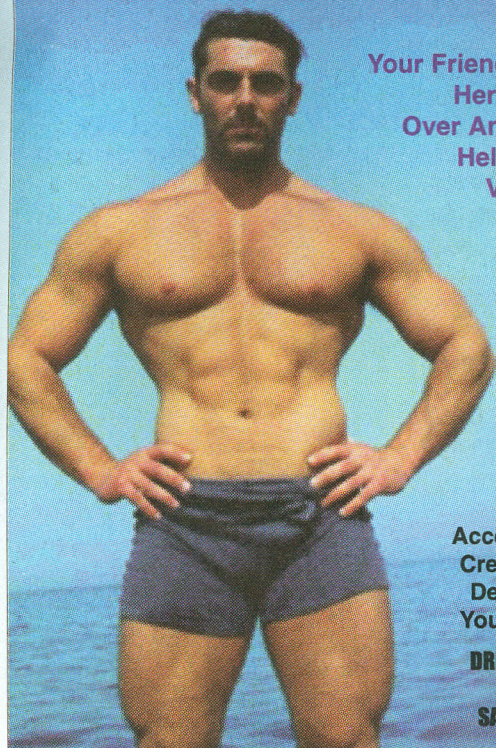

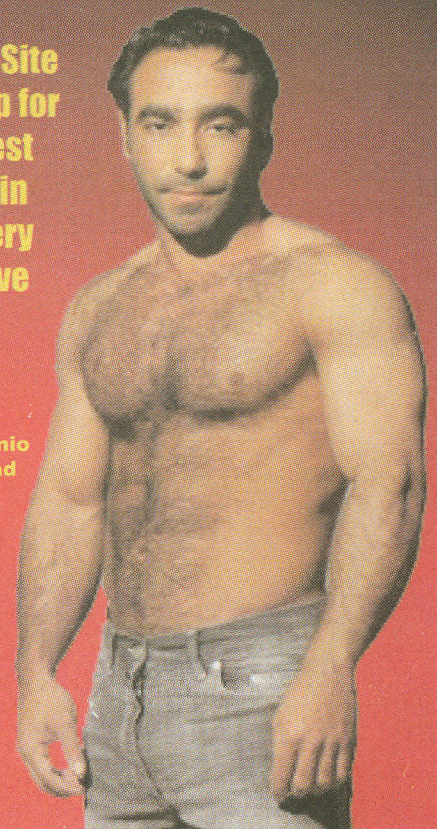
