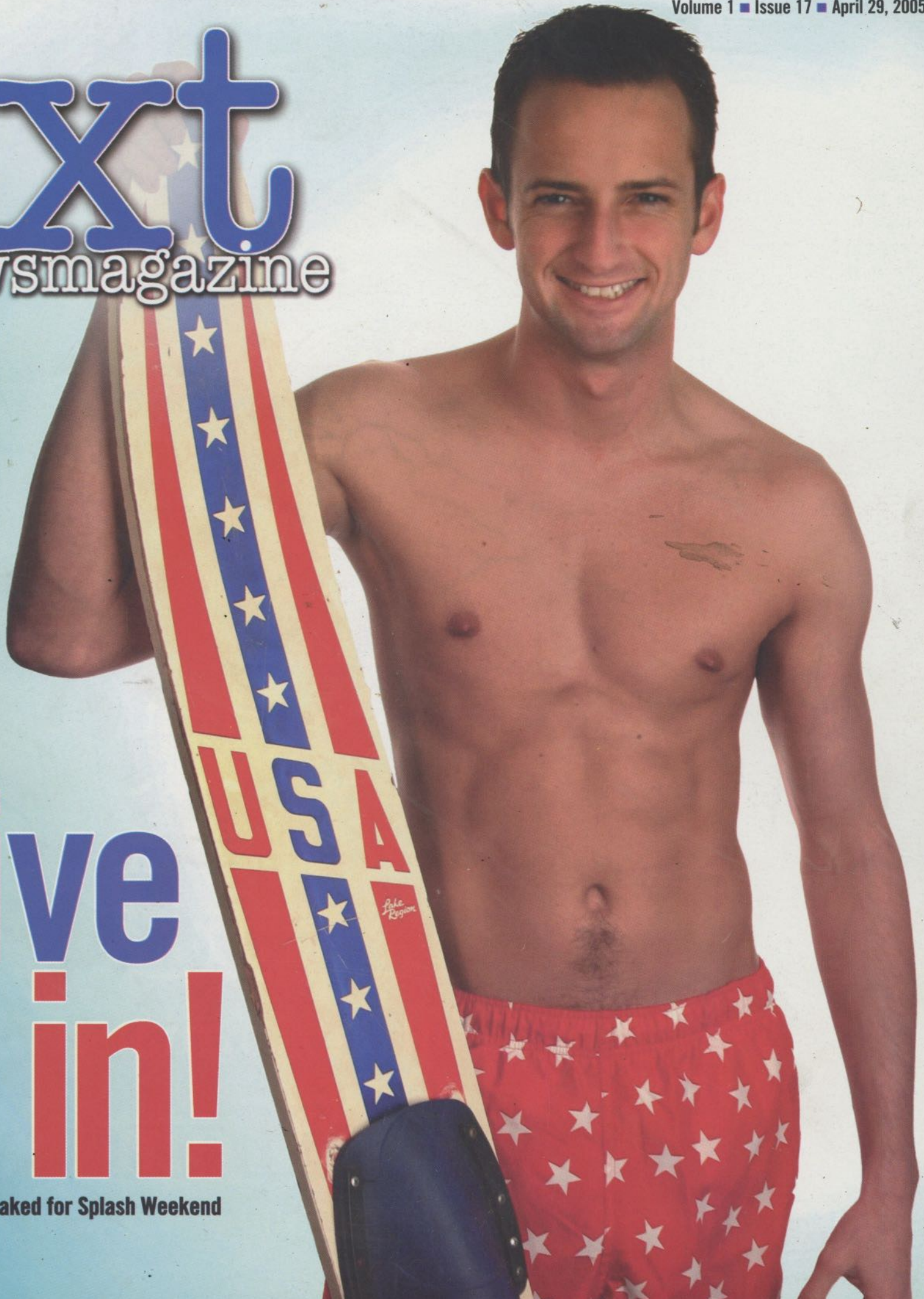

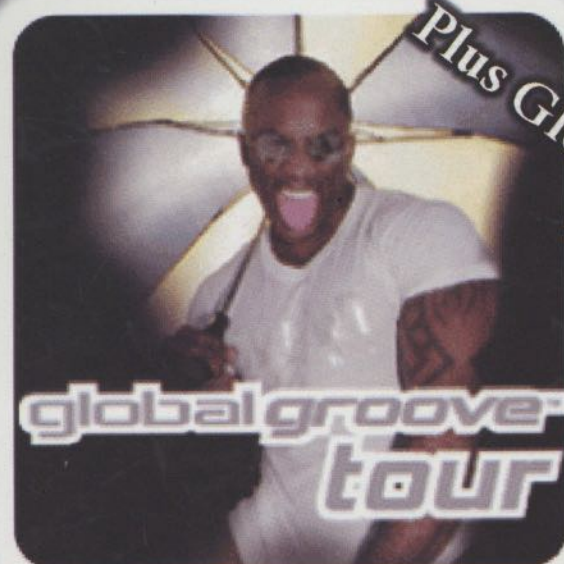

PFLAG-Dallas launches \$20,000 advertising campaign with billboard, newspaper ads

The Dallas chapter of Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays has launched a \$20,000 advertising campaign that includes a billboard and ads in *The Dallas Morning News*.

The advertisement will be posted on a billboard at I-35 and Valwood Parkway for viewing by passengers in vehicles traveling south into Dallas. An estimated 110,000 vehicles pass the spot daily. A suburban location was chosen because coordinators believed that residents in outlying areas were less likely than Dallas residents to know about PFLAG.

The billboard will feature a rainbow with PFLAG's Web site address and phone number and the message, "Be careful who you hate, it may be someone you love."

The same ad ran in *The Dallas Morning News* on April 22, and it is scheduled to run in May, June and July.

This year, money raised at the semi-formal dance will be donated to Amigos Volunteers in Education and Services, the Greater Houston GLBT Chamber of Commerce educational fund and GLOBO's scholarship fund.

GLBT-interest radio program moves to Saturday morning from Sunday time slot

The long-running GLBT radio show, *After Hours: Queer Radio with Attitude*, has a new time slot, according to co-executive producer Chris Arasin. No longer scheduled in its venerable early Sunday morning time slot, *After Hours* will now be broadcast early Saturday morning, 1 a.m. to 4 a.m. on KPFT 90.1 FM.

According to Arasin, the move was made in order to consolidate the KPFT's public affairs programming to better maintain consistency in the schedule.

The new schedule goes into effect on May 7. Galveston listeners may tune in to the program at 89.5 FM.

A constitutional complication

Chisum reattaches wording to include civil unions, but amendment faces trouble

The Texas Legislature has been making national headlines for the last ten days, distinguishing itself with two major attacks on Lone Star gays.

In the most recent riposte, the House voted Monday to pass a resolution that would send a constitutional amendment banning gay marriage to the November 2005 ballot. The proposed amendment defines marriage as the union of one man and one woman, and also would prohibit Texas from recognizing "any legal status identical or similar to marriage."

Last week's House vote on a bill to reform the state's Child Protective Services division included a last-minute

AUSTIN amendment that requires foster parent applicants to list their sexual orientation, and then disqualifies those who are gay or bisexual. The amendment also calls for an annual review to remove any foster children from the care of same-sex parents.

The subsequent reaction to the amendment was almost uniformly negative. Governor Rick Perry called the provision a distraction that could "bog down" the underlying legislation, while the bill's Senate sponsor, Republican Jane Nelson of Lewisville, said the amendment "may present challenges both legally and practically." According

to Randall Ellis, executive director of Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, newspapers across the state have editorialized against the amendment, and he is "cautiously optimistic" that the language will be dropped from the final version.

The final version will emerge from a ten-member conference committee divided between House and Senate members. The committee is being named as this issue goes to press, and should get to work soon.

The ban on same-sex marriage, containing the additional restrictions tacked on by author Warren Chisum, Republican of Pampa, on the House floor, sends Texas down a particularly dangerous path. If passed in this form by two-thirds of the state Senate ratified by the voters, gay Texas couples would find themselves in the dilemma now faced by their counterparts in Ohio, Michigan, Utah, Nebraska and elsewhere, where far-reaching amendments are having an effect on basic legal rights.

In Kalamazoo, Mich., the town council has pulled a plan for domestic partner benefits on the advice of the Michigan attorney general. In Nebraska, a state legislator was told by that state's attorney general that she could not even introduce a bill allowing same-sex cou-

ples to make burial decisions. Policy makers at Utah State University are holding off on partner insurance based on their amendment, while just this week, a lawyer in tiny Mason, Ohio, told a lesbian family that they could not take advantage of the family rate for the community center because the town "cannot take actions that conflict with the state constitution."

Amending the constitution is far more drastic than passing a law, and amending the constitution with fuzzy language referring to a "legal status" that might be "similar" to marriage is a disaster waiting to happen for families headed by a same-sex couple.

Still, the resolution has a distance to go. According to Ellis, the measure does not have a sponsor in the state Senate, and there is a slender chance that it could simply founder in the upper chamber.

If the resolution is picked up in the Senate, as will likely be the case, it will still have to win a supermajority of two-thirds of the members of that chamber. The House reached the two-thirds benchmark by one vote, passing 101-29 with 20 members abstaining or not voting for some reason. There is some chance that Senate allies could rise to the occasion and block passage in the month or so remaining in the 79th session.

But it is more likely that the state will spend this summer and fall in a bruising anti-gay campaign — preceeding the first referendum on gay rights in Texas history.

Senators on panel oppose Talton's amendment

The five senators appointed to a House-Senate conference committee working on legislation to reform Child Protective Services all oppose an amendment added in the House that would ban gays and lesbians from becoming foster parents, according to Senator Jane Nelson, a Lewisville Republican.

Nelson, the senior Republican in the Senate and the sponsor of the reform **AUSTIN** measure, said "legal, fiscal and practical concerns" compelled her to oppose the amendment.

"I am worried about the potential displacement of children," said Nelson, who is chair of the Senate's Committee on Health and Human Services.

"We need these reforms immediately to help those children who are living in

danger as we speak," Nelson said, "and we cannot allow this reform bill to be tied up in the courts for years over an issue that was never part of our review."

The other senators on the conference committee are Republicans Kyle Janek and Jon Lindsay, both of Houston, and Democrats Eliot Shapleigh of El Paso and Judith Zaffirini of Laredo.

House appointees to the conference committee had not been named Wednesday afternoon.

In January, Governor Rick Perry declared that reforming Child Protective Services was an emergency situation

requiring the Legislature's priority attention.

The Senate had already approved a CPS reform measure when the House version came up for a vote on April 19. Representative Robert Talton, a Republican of Pasadena, succeeded in attaching an amendment that would ban gays and lesbians from becoming foster parents and would remove foster children already placed in households headed by gays or lesbians.

The legislation now goes to the conference committee, which will reconcile differences in the two versions.

Randall Ellis, executive director of Lesbian/Gay Rights Lobby of Texas, said studies by his organization show that the Talton amendment would cost the state about \$15 million in the first year, and up to \$80 million over a five-year period.

Out candidate is off and running

Lesbian activist Sue Lovell begins 2nd campaign for Houston City Council seat

The race for the At-Large Position 2 seat on the Houston City Council won't be decided until November. But the campaign trail is already heating up.

Longtime Houstonian Sue Lovell, a lesbian making her second run for the council, joins three others in the contest for the seat once held by Annise Parker. They are Jay

HOUSTON Aiyer, a Houston Community College trustee; John Elford, a business consultant for architects, engineers and general contractors; and Rogelio Morales.

Lovell said preparing for the hotly contested race is simple.

"You make your plan, then you go out and campaign," Lovell said.

Her opponents have ties to the city's business and political communities. But Lovell's experience with the GLBT community and her involvement in local politics may set her

apart from the field. Lovell, who moved to Houston from Fresno, Calif., in 1970, said she first got involved locally when a friend asked her to donate printing for the then-Houston Gay Caucus. Eventually, she became the caucus's first woman president.

Those elected to the five at-large positions represent the entire city, not specific districts. Lovell's already proving she can move beyond her GLBT base of support — witness endorsements from Hispanic leaders like state Representatives Jessica Farrar, Melissa Noriega and Joe Moreno, already in hand.

Maria Gonzalez, president of the Houston GLBT Political Caucus, said that Lovell appears to have learned from her unsuccessful 2003 bid for the council.

"Sue Lovell knows she needs citywide support," Gonzalez said. "She is getting out to more diverse populations."

Gonzalez also said that Lovell seems serious about running "a grassroots campaign that is about individuals."

In the 2003 election, Lovell said she came very close to making the runoff by garnering 52,000 votes, or 21 percent. And although she said she plans "to make no changes" in how her campaign is run, she said she will focus on the strengths she uses as the Mills

Corporation's director of access to help put together groups with resources that enhance each other.

Lovell said by bringing in corporations to work in partnership with local nonprofit and government organizations, public costs for major projects like the Katy Mills can be supplemented while creating new jobs.

Lovell said the neighborhood surrounding the city's new light-rail line along Main Street needs to be redeveloped quickly.

"If I can convince people to think outside the box, we can positively impact the lives of the people in those neighborhoods," Lovell said, adding that she also wants the rail line expanded to other areas of Houston.

Lovell said in Houston the mayor sets the council's agenda. She is unsure whether Mayor Bill White plans to put the city employees' partner benefits measure on the schedule.

"The political reality is, if the mayor doesn't want it there, it won't be there," she said.

Gonzalez said strong candidates are competing against Lovell, and predicted a tough race. But she said that she sees "out electioneers" like Lovell and City Controller Annise Parker — Houston's only out lesbian official — as vital to the GLBT community.

"It is pivotal that everyone sees that there are viable GLBT people in all aspects of politics and society," Gonzalez said. "They demand the promises that America makes to its citizens."

Pop celebs join others entertaining at Pride Fest

What do a self-described bisexual Canadian, some pansies, a former Lilith Fair veteran and a handful of gay icons have in common?

This June they will perform in Montrose — all on the same day and stage!

Coordinators have announced that Grammy-nominated singer Sophie B.

Hawkins and pioneering gay punk rock legends Pansy Division will headline the 2005 Houston Pride Festival. Scheduled to precede the Pride Parade on June 25, the festival will begin at 2 p.m. near the intersection of Yoakum St. and Westheimer Road, one block west of Montrose Blvd.

With tickets costing \$10 at the gate, coordinators describe the festival as "a huge entertainment value" and an opportune time to enjoy top GLBT artists at one venue.

"We searched the GLBT music universe for artists who are known for their energetic

live performances," said festival co-chair Matthew Stone.

Since debuting in the mid-'90s with her sultry hit, "Damn! I Wish I Was Your Lover" and revealing to the press that she is bisexual, Canadian singer Sophie B. Hawkins has sold over a million albums. Pansy Division, veterans of more than 800 live shows, is one of the first studio bands with unapologetic gay lyrics, including "A Song of Remembrance for Old Boyfriends." Jade Esteban Estrada, author and star of the nationally touring solo show, *ICONS: The Lesbian and Gay History of the World, Vol. 1*, will also perform. And

former Lilith Fair talent search winner Rachael Sage and Baltimore rockers Sarah Pinsky & The Stalking Horses will complete the lineup.

Along with food and beverage vendors, a number of businesses will offer products and services in the festival's "Community Market," coordinators said. The Hollyfield Community Pride Tent will showcase more than 35 local and national nonprofit organizations.

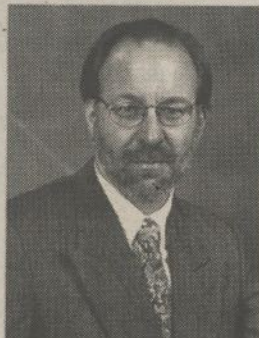

Washington state's gay rights measure one vote shy of passage

Microsoft changes position to 'neutral' after evangelical leader threatens boycott

Did Microsoft kill Washington state's gay rights bill last week? Based in Redmond, Washington, the software giant is considered one of the most gay-friendly corporations in the country. The company bans discrimination against gays, offers spousal benefits to domestic partners and stands firmly for civil rights.

For the last several years, Microsoft has expressed support for legislative efforts to outlaw and punish gay bias, even though those efforts have been unsuccessful.

But this year, the gay rights bill had a serious chance of passage. It cleared the

WASHINGTON Washington House 61-37 in February, and was headed for a close vote in the Senate. Washington's high tech leaders and other major state employers, including Nike, Boeing, Coors, and Hewlett-Packard, were united behind the legislation.

And where was Microsoft? It turns out, Microsoft had changed its position on the bill from "support" to "neutral." According to an investigative report published in the Seattle alternative newspaper *The Stranger* on April 21, Microsoft's senior vice president and general counsel, Bradford Smith, had a meeting in February with a powerful evangelical church leader, Ken Hutcherson, and agreed to back away from the bill. Smith subsequently met with gay employees in early April, and explained that the company had decided to avoid taking

stands on controversial social issues and focus instead on legislative initiatives that had a direct impact on business.

Smith and Microsoft denied that Hutcherson influenced their decision. But they do acknowledge that Hutcherson threatened a boycott by Christian evangelicals.

Last week, the minister told the *New York Times*: "I told them [Microsoft] I was going to give them something to be afraid of Christians about."

Representative Ed Murray, the gay lawmaker who sponsored the gay rights bill, told the *Times* that Smith made it clear that he and his company were under pressure from the Christian right. As far as Murray's concerned, the idea that Microsoft made its decision based on business considerations was "an absolute lie."

According to the *Stranger*, Representative Murray first heard of the shift from Microsoft's state legislative lobbyist, DeLee Shoemaker. "I told her, this is a crisis. It will kill the bill," Murray told the *Stranger*. "She said no one will know," the lawmaker said.

The gay rights bill died in the Senate last Friday by one vote, 24-25. Gay advocates in Washington have been trying to get anti-discrimination legislation passed without success for 30 years.

Justices order state to alter birth certificates

The Virginia Supreme Court has overturned a lower court decision and ordered the state registrar's office to issue revised birth certificates for several children of same-sex parents.

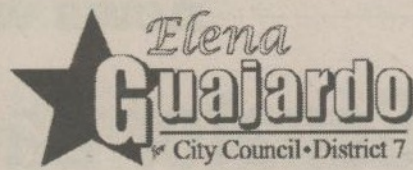
Represented by the American Civil Liberties Union, three families were at an impasse. Two families lived in Washington and the other lived in New York. They had all adopted children who were born in Virginia,

VIRGINIA and they were unable to get a routine piece of paper showing the child's name, place and time of birth, and the name of both the child's legal parents. Revised birth certificates are issued as a matter of course by virtually every state in the nation, and indeed, an accurate birth certificate is required for all sorts of standard administrative tasks, such as

enrolling in school or applying for a passport.

These parents, however, were given the runaround. In one family, a man had adopted his partner's biological children, and the biological mother had formally relinquished parental rights. Virginia went ahead and revised the children's birth certificates, placing the adoptive father on the new paperwork. But while they were at it, officials deleted the biological father, insisting that a child could only have one parent of each gender. Among other reasons, the bureaucrats explained there was no space on the birth certificate form for two fathers or two mothers.

In a 5-2 decision issued April 22, the justices said that existing forms were irrelevant, and that state statute provides no excuse for failing to provide the correct paperwork. The high court declined to discuss the constitutional issues at stake, ruling that since the law was so clear-cut, there was no need for further analysis.

According to the *Minneapolis Star Tribune*, a blogger posted an account of the incident that said witnesses heard her yelling: "Help!!! HEEEEELLLLLLLLLPPPPPP!!!!!!" from inside the facility. Then they saw her come out "in a crouching run," insisting, "I

change the dynamics," because "there are personal safety issues involved." She has also asked for an official bodyguard, but that request has been denied.

She wouldn't be considered bad looking except she's got that "too rigid to actually be cute" look that seems to afflict many otherwise attractive Republican women. Sad to say I would

have to kick her out of bed, unless she begged and begged and begged.

California dreaming

Well, while we're on the subject of state legislatures, the Colorado Senate snuck a gay employment rights bill through by a 18-17 party line whisker on Monday. So we'll see what happens with that in the House. And the California Assembly's judiciary committee on Tuesday passed the bill to legalize same-sex marriage through to its next date on the legislative calendar. The vote was 6-3 along party lines.

Sharp readers will recognize that the vague language at the end of that sentence means I have no idea what happens to the bill now. Does it go to the Assembly floor? The appropriations committee? Who knows! We'd have to actually *call* someone in California to find out.

Namely, the fact that the Legislature does not have the power to overturn a voter-passed initiative, and on the surface, it appears that the voters banned same-sex marriage by a 61-39 margin back in 2000.

But look beneath the surface, our side insists, and you'll see that the voters actually revised the section of the marriage code that governs recognition of out-of-state marriages. They did not touch the section that governs who can get married in California. So in theory, the Legislature could legalize same-sex marriage for state residents, while keeping in place the law against honoring

marriages conducted elsewhere. It would be weird, yes. But technically legal.

Gay penguins anyone? No!

We'll see. I have several long legal papers on the California situation that I am looking forward to reading in the near future, after which I will share their conclusions with all of you. Oh, don't roll your eyes. This stuff is interesting, and you should pay attention. We're not going to be able to discuss cannibals or gay penguins in every issue.

Particularly not this week, which is jam-packed with serious news items, such as the Swedish women who were awarded \$7,100 in damages by an appellate court after they were kicked out of a Stockholm restaurant for making out. The owner insisted that no couples were permitted to make out in his establishment, but it came out in court that the incident was lesbo-phobic in nature.

Pierce me, Jesus!

Plus, I've also been reading a lot about religious freedom. I learned from the *National Law Journal* recently that last December, a woman lost a discrimination case before the First Circuit, where she argued that she belongs to the "Church of Body Modification," and that her religion required her to wear an eyebrow ring in defiance of Costco dress codes. Doncha love it?

Foreign affairs

You know, I would not enjoy sitting next to a couple making out in a restaurant. That's what bathroom stalls are for, ladies! Moving on, same-sex couples can sign up for some kind of partner union thing in New Zealand as of Monday. To be accurate, it's a "civil union license" and it started Tuesday, but you get the picture. And I may have mentioned last week that Spain's Cortes — that's Spanish for Parliament — legalized same-sex marriage the other day, and the Spanish Senate is expected to follow suit shortly. Pope Ratso did some huffing and puffing, but Prime Minister Zapatero blew him off, adding diplomatically that he only has the greatest respect for the Pope's (irrelevant) opinions.

Canada in a mess

And before we leave the international realm, you should know that the Canadian government has been tarnished by a huge kickback scandal, the liberal party has lost tremendous ground in the polls and the conservatives may call for a vote of no confidence that would trigger another national election. They just had one last summer, or at least very recently. And at that point, the



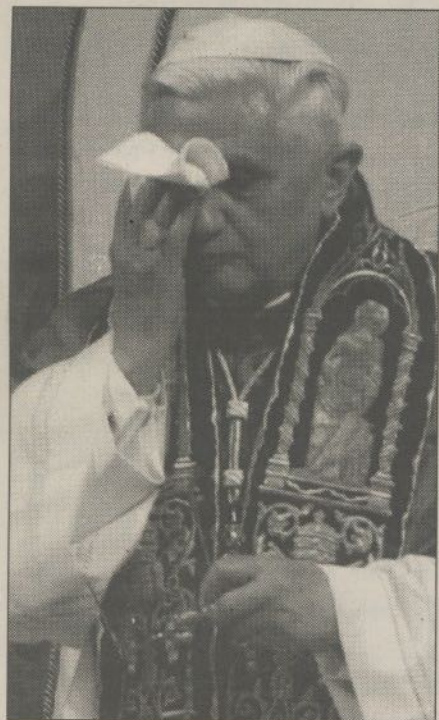
Conservative Party leader Stephen Harper opposes same-sex marriage. He may get his way.

The vote on legalizing same-sex marriage, expected later this year, would be off the agenda, even though marriage would remain legal by court order throughout all but three Canadian provinces. Winning it the legislative way

Connecticut offers lessons that many advocates in gay community have yet to learn

There are right ways and wrong ways, helpful ways and counterproductive ways, to win. In Connecticut, advocates for gay marriage won the right and helpful way by persuading state legislators to enact civil unions for same-sex couples.

While Connecticut is in some respects exceptional, it provides a lesson in democratic politics that can and should be exported to other states. And from that lesson, several rules can be discerned.

Advance through legislatures, not courts. Connecticut becomes the first state in the country to recognize gay relationships in such an exhaustive fashion without being ordered to do so by a court. While evangelical opponents intend, in the 2006 election, to challenge lawmakers who voted for civil unions, I doubt the effort will succeed. Connecticut is a gay-friendly state dominated by liberal Democrats and moderate Republicans. Six of the 12 Republican state senators voted for the civil-union law and the Republican governor signed it. The response among the electorate has been muted.

Contrast that to the reaction when courts have forced gay marriage on states. In the 1990s, courts in Hawaii and Alaska ordered the recognition of gay marriage, only to have the people in those states ban it by state constitutional amendment, a precedent that would soon be followed.

Vermont enacted civil unions in 2000 under compulsion of a court order, which produced a toxic political upheaval. Civil unions survived, but no further progress toward gay marriage has been made there.

Massachusetts recognized gay marriages in 2004 only because the state's highest court ordered it. That led directly to consideration of a state constitutional amendment (still pending) and indirectly to the passage of state constitutional amendments in more than a dozen states last fall.

Until recently, California was advancing steadily and democratically toward gay marriage. From 1999 to

2003 the state Legislature added annually to the benefits and responsibilities conferred on gay couples. By the beginning of this year, California's domestic partnerships offered gay couples legally much of what marriage offers. Those democratic gains for gay couples induced only a statewide yawn.

Recently, however, a state judge in San Francisco threatened that progress by declaring the state's marriage law unconstitutional. Unless the decision is reversed by the state's highest court, as I expect it will be, California too will face a possible referendum banning gay marriage. And that referendum might be broad enough to eliminate not just gay marriage, but much or all of the painstaking legislative progress already made.

Connecticut has so far followed a wiser path. However, even in Connecticut this progress is threatened by a pending lawsuit challenging the state's marriage laws. It might be fair to say that judicial victories have primed the legislative pump in Connecticut and elsewhere. Even so, more such judicial pump-priming just now will only fuel a backlash not just in Connecticut but further kindle the fire, consuming gay-marriage advocates across the country.

There's something about representative democracy that makes even losers accept the legitimacy of the result. There's something about courts that makes losers want to dump tea in Boston Harbor.

Incremental steps to gay marriage are necessary, but the steps can be large. No state has yet authorized gay marriage by legislative action. That suggests that almost everywhere progress will have to be made piecemeal. In California, the legislative pace has been glacial in some years, lightning fast in others.

While incremental legislative steps toward gay marriage are often necessary, they can sometimes and in some places be very large. By recognizing civil unions, Connecticut has taken a huge leap to gay marriage. It will now be easier, in just a few years, to argue that granting Connecticut's gay civil unions the legal and social dignity of "marriage" poses no threat to society.

In this respect, however, the Connecticut model has limited application. Polls showed that 56 percent of the

state's residents already favored civil unions. That level of support may be present or quickly obtainable in most of the northeastern states. Beyond those core states, any legislative progress will have to be much slower. For example, Illinois should probably be on the slow track.

Compromise. Reform movements need idealists and pragmatists. Without idealists, the pragmatists have no idea where to go. Without pragmatists, idealists have no idea how to get there. The early years of the gay marriage struggle have necessarily been dominated by idealists, people who thought the revolutionary thought that gay couples should be allowed to marry. Now that this idea has been implanted in the political culture, and has awakened a fierce resistance, it's time for a season of pragmatism.

Pragmatism means compromise. If we stamp our feet and demand marriage, and nothing less, we will get

nothing. That was initially the stand taken by Love Makes A Family, the Connecticut group supporting marriage equality. The group opposed civil unions as "separate but equal" and a "dead end" that would never lead to gay marriage. Yet the Legislature was unready for gay marriage, and even getting civil unions required a reaffirmation of the principle that marriage is for "one man and one woman."

After universal criticism in gay circles, Love Makes A Family pragmatically ended its opposition to civil unions. The legislation then passed. Now even the group's president admits that civil unions are not a dead end, but part of a "conversation about marriage equality [that] will continue."

Graphic Lust

An erotic picture book offers walk through vintage porn

Lust Unearthed: Vintage Gay Graphics from the DuBek Collection, by Thomas Waugh with Willie Walker (Arsenal Pulp Press, 316 pages, \$23.95 paper)

Consider a collection of several hundred often amateurish and cartoonish erotic gay drawings: fun to flip through, sometimes stirring, but essentially ephemeral.

Invest that collection with the personality of the man who collected those drawings, with an understanding of the closeted times through which they circulated and with a thoughtful academic's historical perspective, and the result is *Lust Unearthed*, a paean to vintage gay porn.

In an earlier book, *Out/Lines: Underground Gay Graphics from Before Stonewall*, Waugh gathered a scattered showcase of like artwork, spotlighting the work of a number of artists. The focus on classic hard-core and soft-core art in this comprehensively complementary tome is less on individual artists and — with generous contextual captions for the 200-plus drawings — more on what the artwork imparts to queers bombarded these days by a glut of Internet porn.

Equally valuable context is further provided by Walker's minibiography of collector DuBek, a Hollywood set designer (George Cukor's *The Women*) who died in 2002 at age 87, but not before donating his historic collection to an archive in San Francisco.

Beach Reads 2005

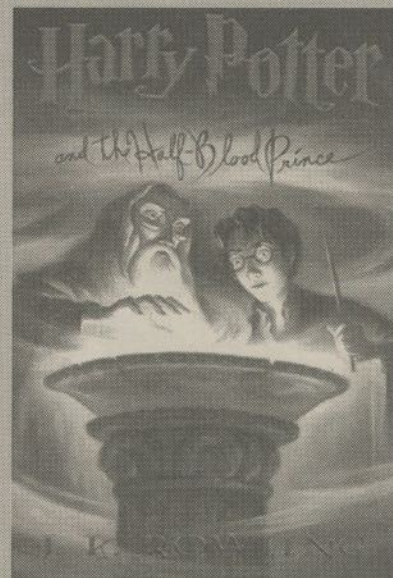

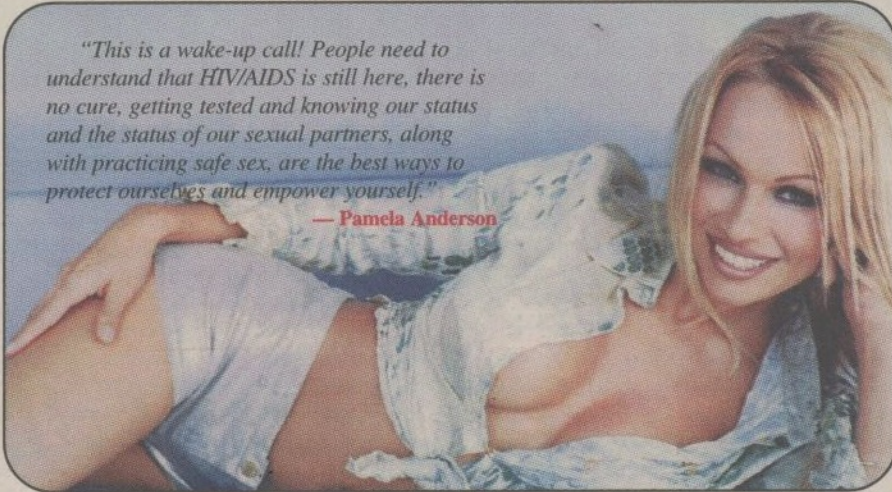
Now Ross has announced that she's in discussions to have a clothing line of her own. Watch out, Jaclyn!

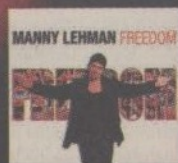

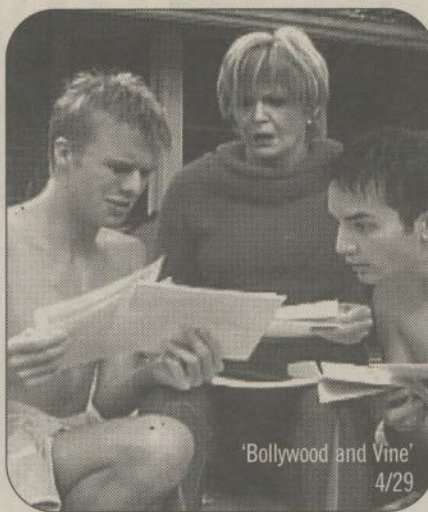

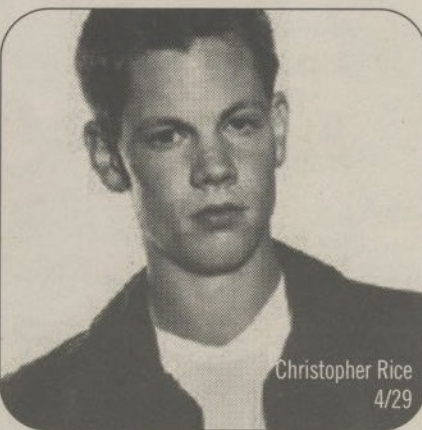

Rufus's little sister gets her own solo CD

Part Wainwright, part McGarrigle, the little sister of Rufus (whom we love) is one of our favorite songstresses. And finally, Martha Wainwright has come forth with her self-titled debut CD.

Martha is a musical artist of keen insight and originality. Born in 1976, she's the daughter of renowned folk singer Kate McGarrigle and singer-songwriter Loudon Wainwright III. Growing up in a family where music was the central focus, she sang on stage and in the studio from an early age and began writing songs and performing in clubs while a drama student in her native Montreal.



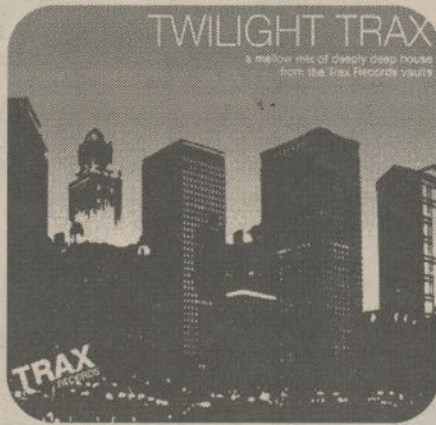

Wainwright meshes her acute familiarity with the folk/rock tradition with a youthful sense of adventure. Singing dramatic ballads, flushed with character, her material is wise, vulnerable and revealing. She brings a solid musical strength to her songs with a voice that can break your heart.

Until this year, she has played a mostly supporting role in her family as the featured backing vocalist for her brother Rufus's acclaimed debut recording for Dreamworks, and on the tour supporting it.

Now based in New York City, Martha is playing regularly with her own band. She has gathered an ardent and growing following in the city's clubs, and has been warmly embraced by the downtown pop music world. Her combo includes longtime musical ally Tom Mennier on piano, and her cousin Lily Lanken (daughter of Anna) on harmony vocal.

This past year also marks her entry into the world as a recording artist, singing her own song "Year of the Dragon" as well as a



stunning interpretation of Cole Porter's classic "Allez-vous-en," on the Hannibal/Ryko album, *The McGarrigle Hour*.

Classics (Mr. Fingers's "Can You Feel It," Virgo 4's "In a Vision," Ron Hardy's "Liquid Love") and previously unreleased nuggets (Screamin' Rachael's "Just Want to Make Love," Master C&J's "It Will Make You Happy") ride alongside brand new productions making their debut here (Merl Sanders's "Elevator House Music," K-Alexi's "Us," Joe Smooth's "Jackson Park").

Whether you are an old school house head or cool cocktailer, *Twilight Trax* should find a comfy, permanent home in your favorite player. A perfect little mix for a rooftop party, backyard barbeque, day at the beach, quiet night in or that long commute.

Twilight Trax was arranged and mixed by Steve Yanko, the Toronto-based producer and D.J. who's also been responsible for remastering much of the Trax catalog. As producer, he is half the duo The Voices (with singer/guitarist Chris Field), whose "Sure Thing" can be heard on the very cool comp, "The Sound of Young New York II" (Plant Records).

And that's the beat.
