Prelude to a GAY LEGEND

Excerpt from *The Diana Foundation: 65 Years of History*

On Thursday, March 19, 1953, the country was buzzing. The annual Academy Awards — otherwise known as the Oscars — were to be broadcast on television for the first time that evening. David Moncrief, a gay man living in Houston, Texas, purchased a new television set as he was excited about the upcoming broadcast. Moncrief, and his roommate Curtis Wright, loved to entertain, and the impending Oscars broadcast gave them a perfect event to build a party around. Television was the exciting new technology of the times, and Moncrief knew his guests would be dazzled.

Moncrief invited a select group of approximately ten friends to join him at his apartment for a pre-awards cocktail party, which would be followed by the first televised Oscar broadcast. Houston in 1953 was not an accepting place for gay men and lesbians, so private house parties were the only way for them to socialize freely. Johnna Lee Mueller, in her early twenties and a model at Sakowitz department store, was delighted to be included on Moncrief's guest list. She arrived for the party dressed in after-five cocktail elegance, as would the other guests.

In the living room of Moncrief and Wright's apartment was an eye-catching plaster model of Diana, the Roman goddess of the hunt. Nearly life-size, the statue stood in a corner. It had previously resided at Sakowitz, where Wright worked as a window dresser, and when the store no longer needed it, he decided it would add an eclectic touch to the apartment.

The statue reminded Mueller of the Diana statue on the grounds of Ima Hogg's Bayou Bend mansion in River Oaks. Diana's toga stopped just above the knees, and her right hand was bent up and backwards towards a quiver on her back. Mueller remembers eating hors d'oeuvres and enjoying cocktail chatter up until the time of the awaited Oscar broadcast. The moment finally arrived. Moncrief turned on the television set. But, as often happened in those days, the reception of the broadcast signal failed, and the set displayed only black and white "snow," accompanied by the sound of static.

The party had not proceeded as Moncrief had planned. But it did serve as an important catalyst for the birth of Houston's Dianas. Little did Moncrief know that he had set the stage for what would become America's oldest continuously active gay organization.

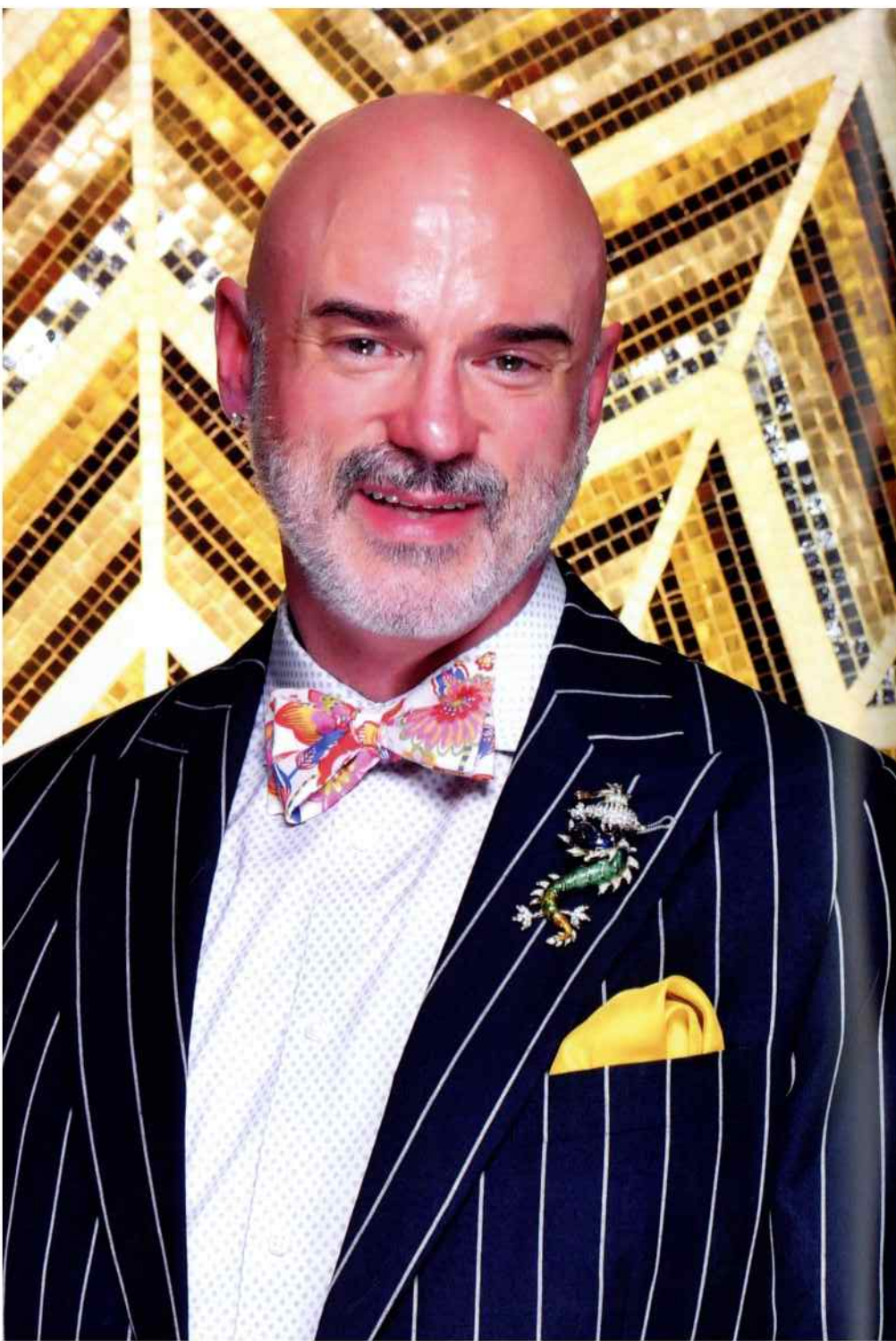
MICHAEL LEIBBERT

Michael Leibbert's journey with The Diana Foundation began in the early 2000s when he was introduced to the organization by Bobby Reynolds, who had just come from a Diana Awards Show, adorned in jewels and a tuxedo. Bobby's invitation to Diana socials and award shows led Michael to meet then-President Bob Briddick, and later, President John Heinzerling. Inspired by the camaraderie and mission of the organization, Michael requested Bobby to nominate him for membership in 2006.

Within a year, Michael was already making an impact, volunteering as the Social Chair. In 2008, he was elected to the Board of Governors as Treasurer, a position he held for three years before stepping into leadership as The Diana Foundation's 13th President. His leadership continued in 2012 when he played a key role in encouraging longtime member Michael Kemper to run for President for the organization's milestone 60th year. That year, Michael served as Vice President, supporting the Foundation's continued growth and impact.

Over the years, Michael has remained a dedicated leader, serving multiple terms on the Board of Governors. His contributions extend beyond board service—he has chaired numerous Country Dinner and Diana Awards Show committees, as well as the Past Presidents Advisory Council. His unwavering commitment to The Diana Foundation and its mission exemplifies the long-standing tradition of what it truly means to be a Diana.

JUDGE PHYLLIS FRYE

A trailblazer, a fierce advocate, and a history-maker—Judge Phyllis Frye has dedicated her life to advancing the rights and visibility of the transgender community. Widely regarded as the “Grandmother of the Transgender Legal and Political Movement,” she shattered barriers as the nation’s first openly transgender judge, appointed in 2010 to Houston’s municipal court.

Beyond the bench, Judge Frye has been a relentless force for justice. A U.S. Army veteran, engineer, lawyer, and activist, she founded the country’s first transgender law conference, paving the way for countless legal victories in trans rights. Her decades of work have helped shape policies, protect lives, and inspire new generations of advocates.

Tonight, we honor Judge Phyllis Frye not only for her groundbreaking achievements but for her unwavering commitment to equality, dignity, and the power of living authentically.

MONICA ROBERTS

Monica Roberts was a visionary, a fierce advocate, and a relentless truth-teller whose work transformed the landscape of trans visibility and justice. As the founder of *TransGriot*, the first blog dedicated to amplifying the voices of Black transgender people, Monica became a beacon of truth in journalism, shedding light on the lives, struggles, and triumphs of the trans community.

A Houston native, Monica dedicated her life to fighting for trans rights, racial justice, and inclusion. She was a mentor, a historian, and a powerhouse activist whose voice resonated far beyond the city, making an indelible impact on national and global conversations surrounding trans equality. Her advocacy work influenced policies, challenged injustices, and, most importantly, gave countless trans individuals the representation and dignity they deserved.

Though she left us too soon in 2020, Monica's legacy endures as a guiding light for the fight for equality. The Diana Foundation is honored to present this posthumous award in recognition of her extraordinary contributions and unwavering commitment to justice, truth, and community empowerment.

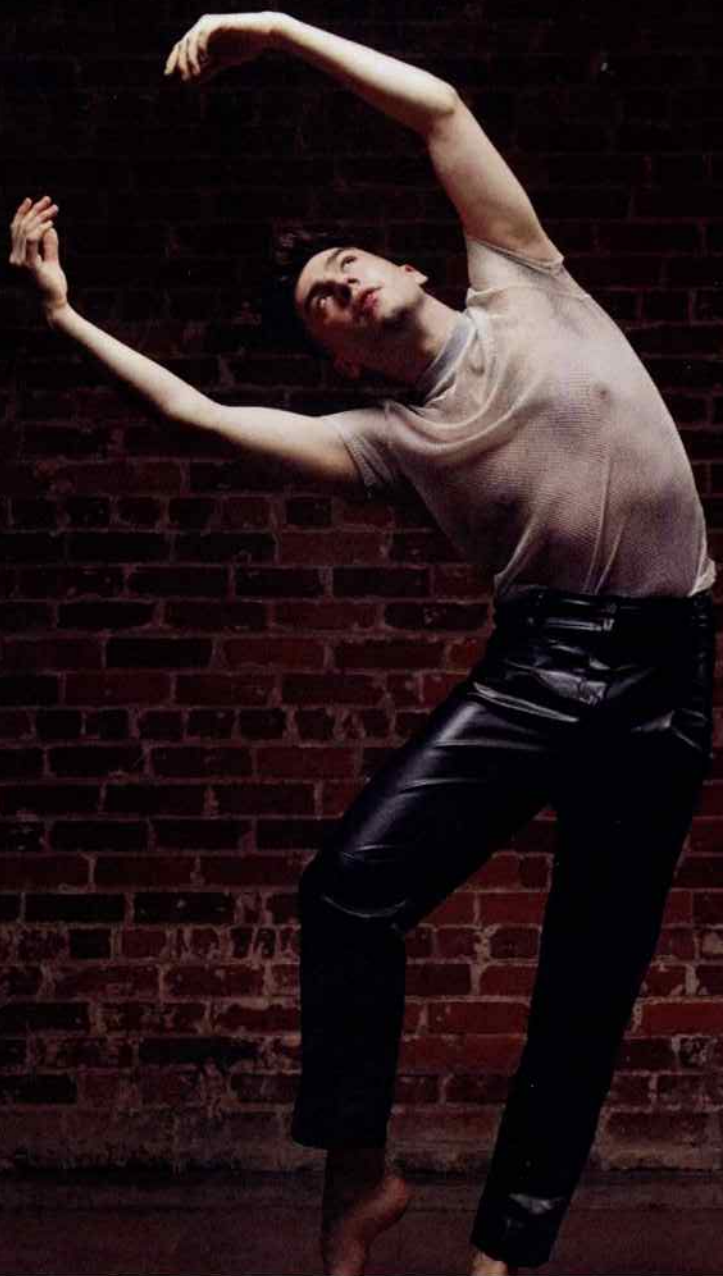


SINGER & PERFORMER

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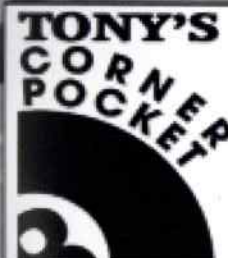
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
