
WHAT IS A HEALTHY RELATIONSHIP?

How do you know if you have healthy relationships? Many women find themselves in unhealthy and even abusive relationships. These problem relationships could be with a spouse, a parent, or even a friend. Since many women draw their sense of personal identity and self-esteem from the quality of their relationships, it's important to evaluate your relationships for these positive traits:

- Mutual Trust do you trust each other without doubt?
- Mutual Respect do you value each other's opinions, values, ideas?
- Giving of Quality Time do you make time for each other, apart from other distractions, such as the jobs, the kids and friends?
- Good Communication do you actively listen and express your emotions in a healthy way?
- Problem solving do you compromise and negotiate fairly to solve differences?
- Sense of flexibility are you able to go with the flow when necessary?
- Ability to show affection do you give your loving affection freely and frequently?
- Ability to achieve and enjoy intimacy do you enjoy an intimate relationship with your mate?
- Freedom to be one's self do you feel free to express your opinion, share your dreams, fears and hopes?
- Respect of shared independence and individual differences - do you allow yourself and/or your mate to live a separate life, with separate interests and friends?
- Freedom to terminate or continue the relationship do you have the ability to end a bad situation or pursue a terrific one?
- Abuse is not acceptable is it clear that any form of abuse (physical, sexual, verbal, emotional) is not acceptable?

If you are uncomfortable with any of the answers to these question, perhaps it is time to reevaluate your relationships. Professional help is available if you want it. But you're the only one who can honestly answer these important questions.

A RECENT VISIT TO SOUTH AFRICA

Kittu Riddle and Margot Kostenbader

Margot and I were part of a Women's Studies Delegation invited by People to People, Citizen Ambassador Programs to spend two weeks in South Africa. Such delightful women in the Delegation! We were the only lesbian couple, but others were glad to identify with us. One of them contacted a South African lesbian who told us she had succeeded in getting health care support for her spouse.

It's true! Sexual orientation is part of the diversity spelled out in the new constitution! It calls for a non-sexist, non-racist Democracy! Incredulous, we listened to Dr. Ellen Kornegay, head of the Office on Women's Status, describe how they are working to assure that government lives up to its promise. She works in Pretoria right under the Deputy President whose office has responsibility for the 'transformation' of their society, implementing a 'transparent process' known to all.

The new government, barely four years old, has a formidable task. Blacks are the majority, but, having been relegated, up till four years ago, to the 'townships' and 'homelands,' many are poor. Still we saw small, neat, houses being built in the townships on plots where water and electricity are available. Jobs are slowly being created, education is compulsory, health care is being extended. The country is on the move; we felt it and saw it.

In Capetown the Mayor, a Black woman, who brings great vision and energy to her job, told us candidly of the problems she faces. In the tourism business, many bars and restaurants are loathe to hire Blacks into visible positions up front. We also had long sessions with women faculty in the Gender Studies sections of several Universities and made new friends. Our Capteown guide was a Black woman, a single mother, who shared with us some of her anguish in wanting to remain part of her tribe and realizing her children were growing up in a very different culture.

We had our pictures taken at the spot where the Atlantic Ocean meets the Indian Ocean. That we were in the southern hemisphere came clear when we noticed the sun circled in the north, the waning moon was flat on its top side rather than its lower, and the constellation of Orion was upside down.

From our round huts in Krueger National Park, we could hear hippos bellowing at night in the Sabi river. We saw three lions sitting over their kill, fending off the circling vultures. Elephant, giraffe, rhino, impala and a host of smaller animals kept us on the watch. We ended our visit at Victoria Falls between Zambia and Zimbabwe. Such a powerful sight whether viewed from the side if its expanse or across the valley through mists which rise up!

When we returned, there was a blizzard in JFK as we landed after a 17 hour flight. We were relieved to get out of there and glad to get home to our doggies. Blue bonnets welcomed us.

"THE CRONE"

A WORKSHOP FACILITATED BY ANTIGA (FOR WOMEN OF ALL AGES)

In the patriarchal, dominator society the crone, the old wise woman, is ignored. In woman-honoring days, the crone was revered and respected. The wisdom she had gained through her long life was honored. To ignore and put down the crone is to ignore and put down all of women's lives, for the crone is as much a part of us as any other stage of our lives.

Reclaiming the crone and giving the crone her due can help young women look forward to their aging years and help old women to accept and use the power that is theirs. The dominator society has good reason to fear the crone, for once a large number of old women begin to exercise our power, many of the values in our current society will be challenged. In this workshop, we will tell our stories and the stories of crones who have affected our lives. This workshop will explore ways of respecting old women. We will use discussion and ritual to honor the wisdom gained through living and will celebrate


the possibilities that come to us as our bodies and our spirits ripen. We will share our experiences of aging and honor what the years we have lived have given us.

We will explore the gifts we have to give as old women. We will drum, dance, sing and raise energy for more honor of the crone in the world we live in. We will pay special attention to the crone goddesses and discover how we can give them their due at the same time we honor the crone in ourselves. Bring an image of the crone (either an object or a mental image) to share in the workshop.

ANTIGA is a feminist witch, writer, singer, artist and crone. She has celebrated her passage into vibrant aging by crone crossing rituals. 
