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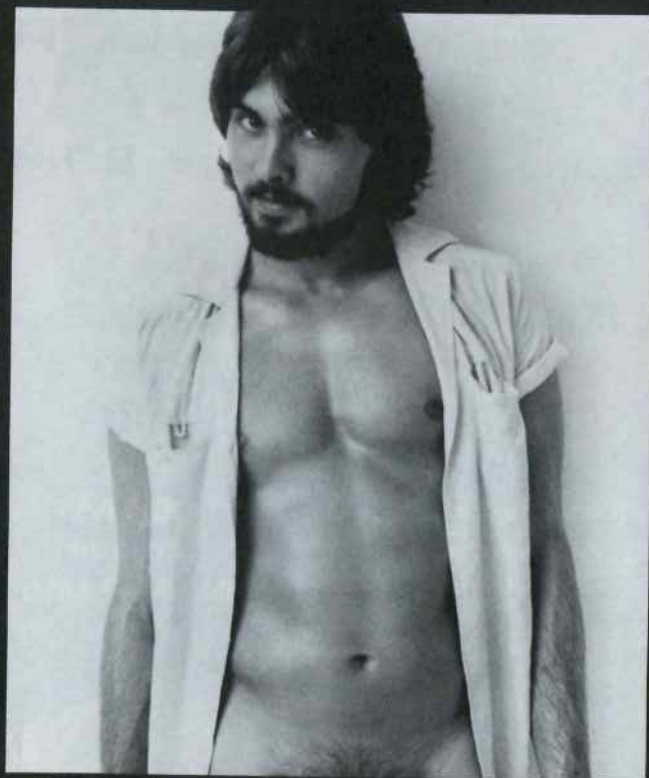

Vote No on 9-5

Houston could eventually have a gay councilman if you vote "No" on election day, Tuesday, August 11. "Keep our city alive, vote No to 9-5." Houston could have a district whereby the gay community would have a responsive representative on city council. But, first you must vote "No" on the proposed "9-5" plan which would include only five councilmen elected at large and nine elected by district. The proposed nine district plan is not much of an improvement over the current plan which includes only eight councilmen who are all elected at large. By defeating the "9-5" plan, a "16-4" plan could then get on the November ballot.

Mayor Jim McConn has announced that he will help get the "16-4" plan on the ballot if voters reject the "9-5" plan August 11.

A "16-4" plan would divide Houston into sixteen separate districts allowing Montrose to be its own district. Under the other

plan, Montrose would still be swallowed up in a larger district.

The Federal government has decisively instructed Houston to come up with a different system of electing councilmen, since under the current system of only eight councilmen, all are elected "at large," none by district, and only one is of a minority (Judson Robinson, Jr.). In Houston, half the population is of a minority. In other words, half of Houston is under-represented by only one councilman and the other half is over-represented by seven councilmen.

The Citizens Coalition for Responsive Government will be circulating a petition for the "16-4" plan soon. Your signature can help change the law on how Houston selects city councilmen. Your "No" vote at the polls can help defeat a lame game plan of proposed redistricting.

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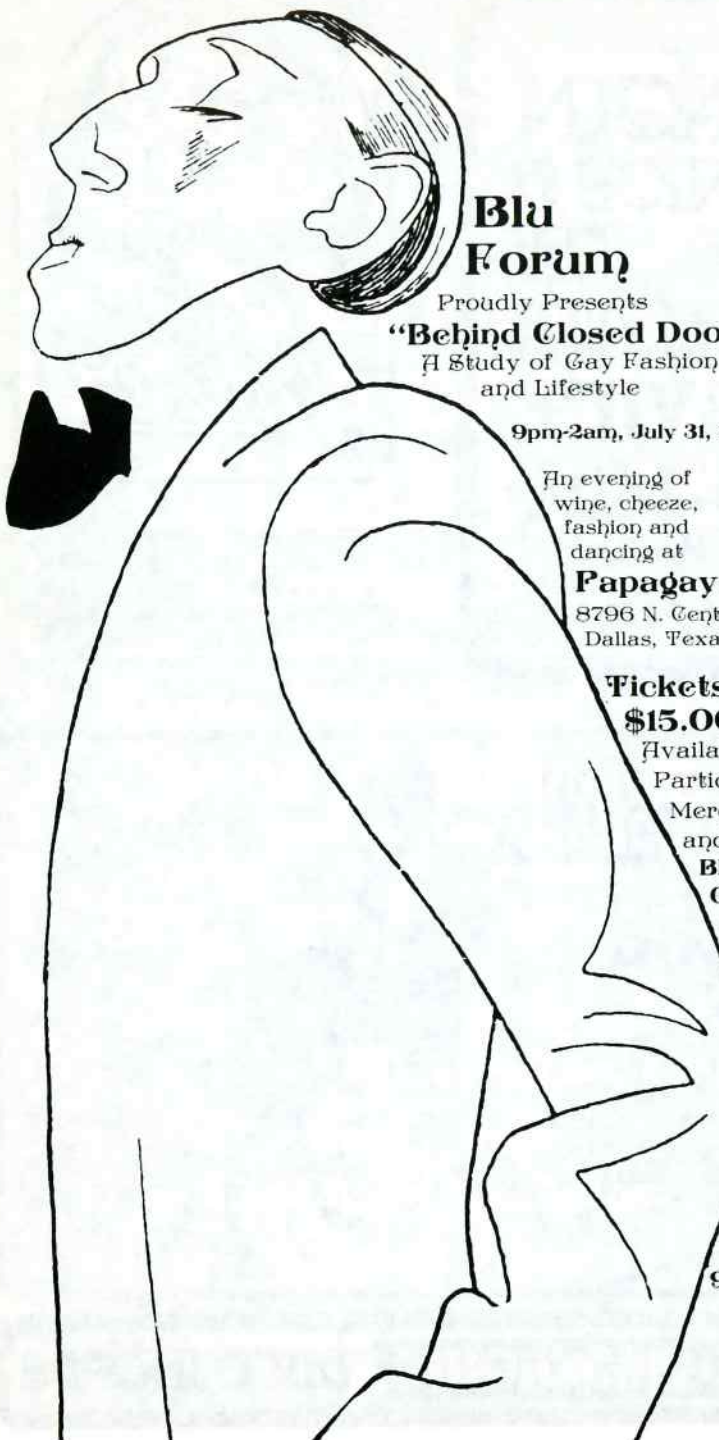

This is what our many gay organizations are struggling for, our equal rights. Remember, we are all struggling for advancement and progress as gays. The gays want to be recognized, as all minority races and groups are, and should. The prejudices in the gay community should be resolved; arguments of this nature should be silenced. Acts of bad abuse & treatment of all gays, whatever race, should not be condoned by gay establishments and organizations who are in a struggle for gay equal rights and just human rights. I am sending you a copy of a letter mailed to Marvin Zindler regarding his coverage of the recent "children's home rape affair."

After hearing again on the news tonight at 10:00 the deplorable actions that have taken place at the children's home, I felt urged to write concerning the use of certain "scare" words and phrases on supposedly unbiased media presentations. The use of "Homosexual tortures and rapes, not to mention murders" in the Henley case and, now, the use of "Homosexual rapes" in the matter of the children's home point to rather biased reporting. When a man shoots his wife or a woman kills her lover, it is never reported as a "Heterosexual murder," nor are any of the numerous Houston rapes referred to as "Heterosexual rape," even the case several years ago which involved public employees (male) and their wards (female) in a similar children's home incident.

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If you really desire to investigate "Homosexual rapes" or "Homosexual murders," you should investigate the files of the Montrose Community Center, Gay Political Caucus, American Civil Liberties Union, or the committee which has taken documented depositions and will shortly be investigating the alleged crimes themselves. These include the rapes of homosexual men by supposedly "straight" rednecks, the murder of homosexuals (ditto), and the beating up of homosexuals by cruising thugs, "macho" gangs and bored police — all condoned by the cloak of "That's all right! They're fair game! Everybody knows what they are!" Please, Mr. Zindler! All we ask is "Be fair!"

Libertarian Beliefs

Dear TWT,
 Recently I offered the hand of friendship and cooperation to "RCB" in repealing 21:06 and, afterwards, was disappointed to find a few of my fingers missing. As much as I dislike a controversy in print, "RCB"'s letter contained so many false statements about libertarian beliefs that they need correction. It is simply not true that most libertarians want to "abolish the institution of government." The majority of libertarians just want to get back to the foundations of our nation — limited government and individual freedom.

We do believe in the rights of every individual to control his or her own life, liberty, and property, provided they respect the equal rights of others to do the same. Consequently, we oppose all laws which seek to impose the morality of one group (even a majority) on others. Therefore, straight or gay, we oppose such laws as 21:06 and the laws prohibiting marijuana. We believe our bodies belong to us, not to the government, not to "society", and they sure as hell don't belong to Anita Bryant!

For the same reasons, we oppose the excessive regulation and interference of a person's business. We favor fewer and lower taxes. Americans now work from January to June for the government. And single people pay the highest proportion of taxes. Even a medieval serf only worked 1/3 of his life for his lord.

In short, we agree with liberals on matters of personal freedom and with conservatives on matters of economic freedom. Thomas Jefferson said it best: "I mistrust an over active government, because it almost always becomes oppressive." You say that "any political science student will tell you that the major problem with our government is that the legislature only meets a few months..."

I have news for you. My B.A. in political science is from the Univ. of Texas, my M.A. in political science is from Yale and I also completed all the requirements except the dissertation for a Ph.D. at Yale in political science. As Will Rogers said, "Thank goodness we don't get all the

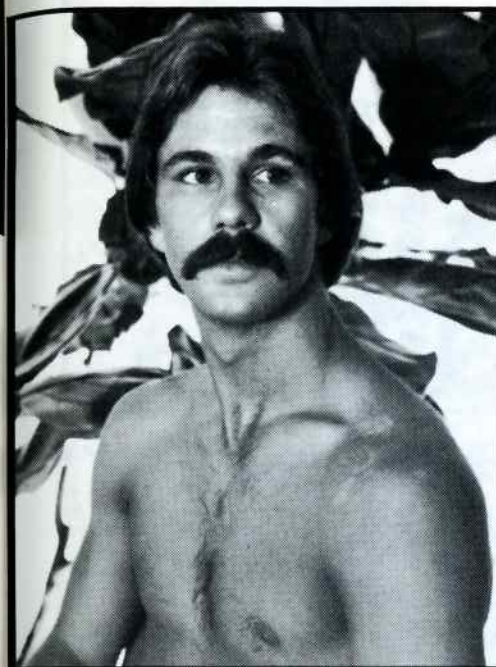

government we pay for." If the legislature met any longer, we couldn't stand it. Also, I too lived in California — 14 years of my life — 8 in San Francisco and 6 in Oceanside. It amazes me that you would quote a homophobic bigot like Police Chief Ed Davis, a government bureaucrat, and then say in the next breath that we need *more* government! I can say from my own personal experience that the bureaucratic mess is bigger there than here.

Californians recently voted for Proposition 13 to cut and freeze their taxes while voting against Proposition 6, which would prohibit gays from teaching in public schools. Libertarians vehemently supported the rights of gays to teach and were the only political party to support the taxcutting Proposition 13 *before* it passed by an 80% majority.

One final thing, "RCB". I am tired of this dialogue with someone who will not give his name.

My name is **FRED EBNER**. I am proud of being gay.

The name Ebner is also a source of pride because my forefathers were pioneers in the cattle and meat-packing industry in Wichita Falls, Texas, almost as soon as the city existed.

I am also proud of the fact that I am a libertarian whose beliefs stem from Jefferson and the American Revolution we celebrate on July 4th. These are beliefs in the just limits of government's power over our lives.

And, not the least, I am proud of my political record in Austin, where I ran for city council, gathering 4,985 votes and coming in second in a field of four. This was the largest vote ever gained by a libertarian or an open gay in the state of Texas.

Mine is not the "love that dare not speak its name." I have put my name out front, run for office, and I have paid my dues.
