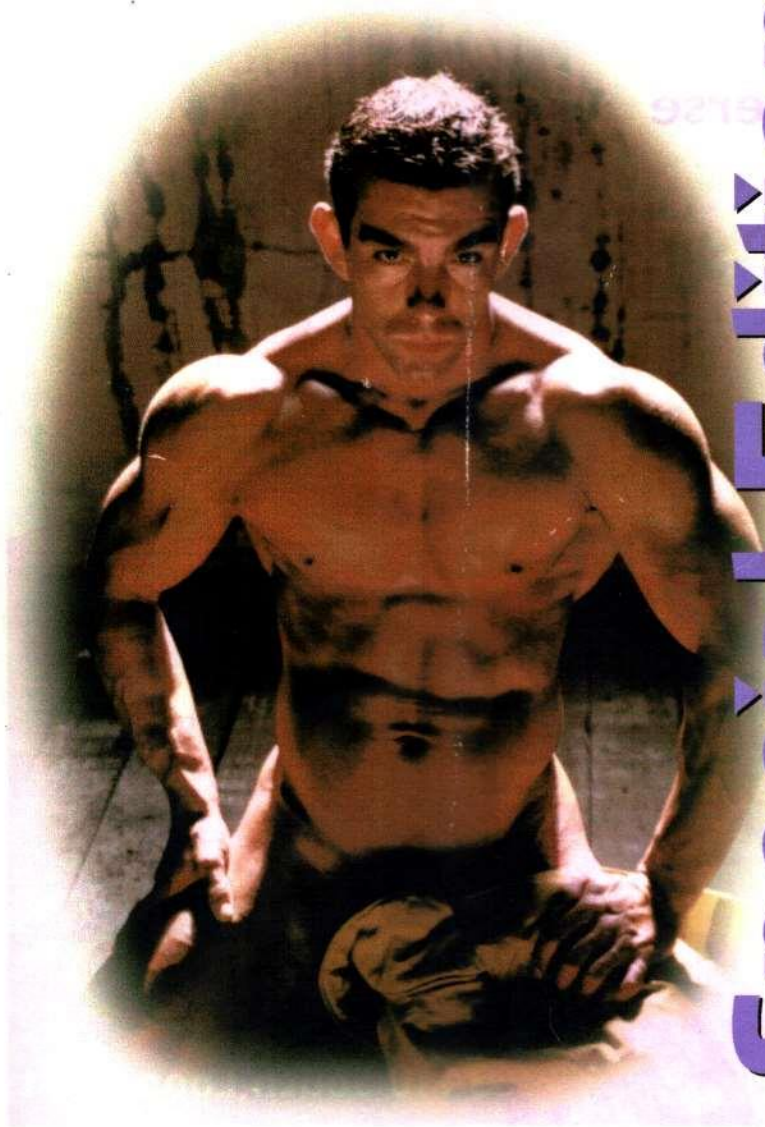

Can we continue as the "TWT" of yesterday? Or, are we an evolution of yesterday? Something new that brings back the best of what was.

Something that holds the same integrity and principles as the TRUE This Week In Texas Magazine. The little book that brought joy into everyone's life.

This Week In Texas Magazine was the best part of my life. I worked for TWT during the late 80's and early 90's. It was the time of my coming to terms with my sexuality.

Acceptance and appreciation embraced me by TWT Magazine staff, as well as the community.

I've seen This Week In Texas Magazine go through numerous changes throughout its years in operation, but one thing is clear. This Week In Texas Magazine is an institution. With a foundation based on community pride and an all inclusive acceptance of the entire community.

I have spent years helping create the spirit of what TWT has become.

Through the knowledge of production and the inner workings of TWT, I have acquired the spirit of TWT. It is that spirit that I wish to pass on to a new generation of gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgendered and questioning young Texans.

That spirit consist of pride, dignity, respect and acceptance of ourselves and others within our diverse community. To agree to disagree at times, but to always support one another.

TWT belongs to everyone. We are all the benefactors of TWT. You will decide what Twit will become in this melineum. It is your magazine and it will evolve through your comments and contributions.

I can only try to give back to the Texas GLBT communities what I received from my years of association with TWT.

I remember working for TWT when people would stop in all day long to pick up their Twit, place a classified, or just stop by, to say hi.

From the heels to the chaps, coming and going, the community in all it's diverse and wonderful colors. My closet door was removed from its hinges and I was living in a completely open and free world for the first time in my life.

The first Twit ever, over 29 years ago, was eight pages copied on a xerox machine. The new Twit is 32 pages printed on a xerox color printer. The first Twit published 500 copies. The new Twit publishes 5,000.

With today's technology, it is possible to print a full color book on a nice color laserwriter printer and produce a quality publication rivaling that of an ink press. I have invested in three such machines, using a new technology that prints with real ink, like an inkjet printer, yet through a laserwriter process using hard ink. The quality is what you see on these pages. I have also purchased machines for folding, binding and trimming. Not only has the cost of printing been cut considerably, but we are able to offer full color as well. And, the entire process is done in-house.

Yes, it is small, and yes, it is printed in an office rather than a huge printing plant.

I don't think the packaging, nor how it was produced, had anything to do with the success of the original Twit.

What was it that made Twit Magazine a success? In one word, content.

There was a recipe that Twit had that seems to have been lost. That recipe involved a lot of ingredients, that when stirred together, created a delectable atmosphere of community togetherness.

I offer you this special edition of the new Twit Magazine. I call it a sampler. A small installment of what I hope becomes the recipe that sparks the spirit of a new generation.

As a lot of you know, we came very close, two years ago, to a come-back of the publication. As you may remember, the community support was there, but weekly commitments from advertisers were way below that needed to sustain the weekly magazine.

At the time, I was of a mindset, a return to statewide distribution, like the old publication. The amount of magazines for

the state wide distribution was 20,000 copies, and the average page count was 98. This resulted in a printing & binding bid of approximately \$20,000 per week. No matter how I structured the amount of books to be printed to the amount of pages per issue, the price quote for production, changed very little.

Most of those who participated in advertising with us were located in Houston, but the lack of support in other cities caused the production cost to be to burdensome for the weekly publication.

As prepared as we were two years ago, with the writers, photographers, production and every other aspect, right down to the distribution, we are even more prepared today! There were two reasons I made the decision to stop the production we began two years ago. Those were the financial burden printing 20,000 copies, distributed across Texas, without statewide support would cause, and the high cost of printing.

That is what led me to rethink – and restructure the situation. My intention now is to concentrate mostly on Houston for the time being, and create a smaller publication with mostly, a local distribution.

With technology that allows us to print in-house, and a more local distribution, we are able to produce a magazine that is economical and attractive.

This allows businesses with a small advertising budget the ability to participate.

We hope our recipe of content is such that our readers will not only be entertained, but informed of the diverse and thoroughly inspiring community around them.

We will be printing a total of 5,000 magazines a week, with 3,000 being distributed here in Houston and 2,000 to be distributed throughout Dallas, Fort Worth, Austin and San Antonio. Our regular weekly publication will begin Thursday, August 26 and will be distributed every Thursday.

This special edition sampler is our gift to the community in this time of celebration for our achievements and our growth.

We look forward to serving you on a weekly basis soon.

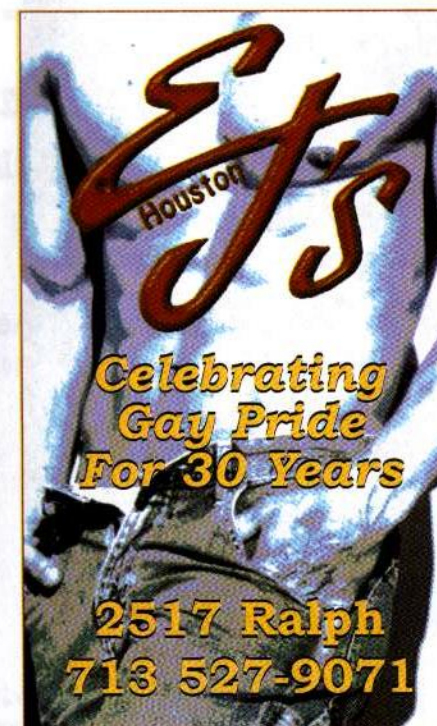

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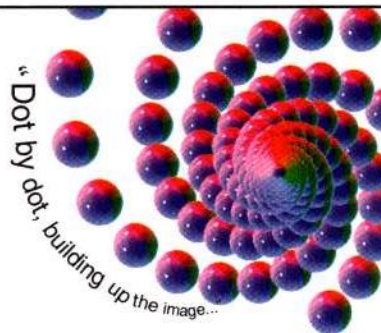
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**Texas Senator Kay Bailey

**Kerry Calls for a \$7 Minimum
Wage to Help Families Get Ahead**

As part of his plan to build a stronger economy for America's families, Democratic Presidential candidate John Kerry called for raising the minimum wage to \$7.00 by 2007. The increase will impact nearly 15 million workers, helping families make ends meet and move another step towards the American Dream.

An increase in the federal minimum wage is well overdue. It has fallen further and further behind the cost of living, and the impact of the last increase

has been entirely eroded by inflation. Today, the minimum wage is worth only 33 percent of the average American wage, its lowest level since 1949.

According to a new report released today by nine leading labor economists, no group will benefit more from an increase than working women. A \$7.00 minimum wage will help millions of women and mothers pay for education or for household expenses like groceries, healthcare and rent.

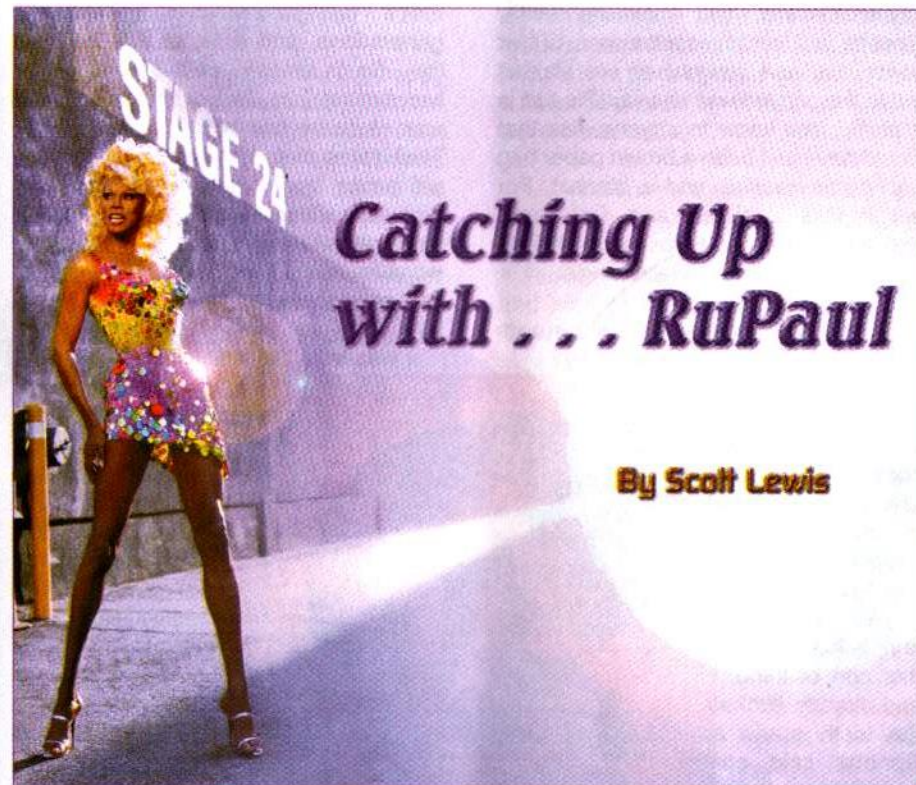
"I'm running for President to build a stronger economy that lifts up families and expands opportunity for hardworking Americans," Kerry said. "It's time to remember a basic truth: a stronger America begins right here at home. Today, there are workers - many of them working women - struggling to get by on the minimum wage. That's wrong. We can do better. And together, we're going to change it."

Contrary to the claims of critics who say a minimum wage increase only helps teenagers, today's report notes that many minimum wage workers are primary breadwinners whose families depend on their income. Of the women who would benefit from an increase, over 75 percent are adults.

Striving to do the right thing and help their families, millions of working women and mothers are struggling from the effects of a federal minimum wage that has not been increased in eight years. Increasing the minimum wage from \$5.15 to \$7.00 will help these working women by:

- Raising the income of 4.5 million working women
- Giving 1.4 million working mothers a raise, including 623,000 single moms.
- Providing a family enough money to pay for 10 months of groceries, 8 months of rent or an entire year of healthcare and community college expenses.

Overall, 15 million workers will benefit from an increase, with 7.4 million receiving a raise. ▼



It has been some four years since we last heard from RuPaul and I have to admit that her unique energy and positive spin on all things is something that I think we could use right now.

I remember when Ru first came into the national conscience. It was 1992 and it seemed as if "that rebellious Gay Community" was always in the news. Houston's Gay Community was going through so much then, between Queer Nation, Act Up, and The Paul Broussard case, RuPaul provided just the breath of fresh air that we needed to unwind.

It was as if RuPaul took the message of the activists "We're here were queer get used to it!" and put a fresh non threatening spin on it. Boy did it work. The music was sassy and fun and not since Boy George had America fallen in love with a drag queen. Fast forward some twelve years and RuPaul is back

with a new CD.

I caught up with RuPaul at her LA home on a recent Sunday afternoon as she prepared to leave for Rio.

SL: I understand that your first drag performance was at five in your front yard in a pink dress, doing The Supremes

Ru: That's right, doesn't everybody do that? You think that's abnormal?

SL: Absolutely Not! You spent a lot of time when you were little with your sisters, you were the only boy in an all female household. What influence did they have on you?

Ru: They taught me how to be compassionate. I don't know if compassion is something you can teach, but they taught me how to make magic out of something that was pretty

straightforward. You know my sister Renetta put some cookies in a brown paper bag and brought an old blanket out to the canyon and she said Ru this is a picnic. You know to anyone else that would have just been a brown paper bag with some cookies and a blanket. For her it was a picnic, and that really exemplifies the way I was taught to look at the world, you can make magic.

SL: You left home and moved in with your sister Renetta at fifteen, why?

Ru: I was having a hard time at school. First of all I was not happy, I mean when I hit fifteen the rebel in me came blaring out. I hated all authority and I just wanted to smoke cigarettes and talk back and that sort of thing. I had already flunked the tenth grade so Renetta said come live with me. And that's what I did.

SL: But after moving in with Renetta in Atlanta you came to love school didn't you?

Ru: Well I came to love school because it was The School of Performing Arts. I loved my school in Atlanta because it was the first time I was around other kids that were making magic also. You know I felt like such a freak saying that a bag of cookies was a magical picnic.

SL: You have a quote I love. You say you learned at the age of twenty that you had as much right to fulfill your dreams as any white person. What is RuPaul's message to young African Americans?

Ru: You know I come from the ghetto, that mindset. You know most brown skinned people inherit a lot of anger

that's passed down through the generations, and a lot of self loathing too. So it wasn't until I was about twenty that I really got the fact that it was ok to be however I wanted to be. That it was ok to not know something. I will never forget there was this girl in high school that I said to her, "Can I ask you a question?" and she said to me the word is ask. Of course, I have never said ax since.

It was from the time I left my mothers house at the age of fifteen until the time that I was about 21 that I really started loving things that I used to hate about myself. The way I spoke or the way you could tell that I was from country folks. My parents are from Louisiana, as a matter of a fact my sisters were born in Houston.

SL: I don't know if people are aware how much that you have done in the fight against AIDS. You have helped MAC raise over Twenty-Two Million Dollars. How did this association come about.

Ru: They had been watching me for some time and wanted to do something in the fight against AIDS and they thought that I would be a great liaison with the community and with the street meets fashion look and the clientele that they had. I have had a lot of associations with corporations but the ones that have really made a difference were the ones where the people behind the corporation had a real maverick spirit. We have been able to dole out tons and tons of money to the charities.

SL: You have said that the most fulfilling experience of your career was



The RuPaul Show on VH1, why?

Ru: People talk about one big happy family, well this was absolutely that, we just had a blast. We knew it wouldn't last forever, but we just had a blast. We had a great time on the set, but behind the scenes...it was so much fun. Then to have guests on that wouldn't have been considered A List guests for another talk show but in my world they were A List guests, there were all these people that I really wanted to talk to like Bea Author and Ester Rolle. We got to do the Porn Awards. It was just beautiful.

SL: You got an amazing fortieth Birthday gift when Madame Tussaud unveiled your wax replica. What was it like to see yourself in that light?

Ru: It's the strangest thing to see your self three dimensionally. There are angles that you can see of yourself that you could never see even if a camera was on you. I had to sit for them five or six times and they measured everything-but it was great it looks exactly like me. You know the weirdest thing is knowing that this replica is going to be on this planet long after my bones turn to dust.

SL: Fast forward to today. You have said that you felt it was time for your voice to be heard again with all that is going on in the world. Why now?

Ru: You know, even up until seven months ago I didn't think the time was right. About six months ago something happened and I knew the time was right. You know today we are basically living in the Fifties, with the censorship and the

church and state have become almost synonymous. This country was built by people who were trying to get away from a state controlled by the Church. Don't get me started.

SL: What can we expect from the new CD.

Ru: You can expect the fun, optimism, and kind of love anthems that people have come to couple with me but also I

got to sneak in some songs from the man behind the mask. You know I wouldn't have done that before on a record, but today I think that people are open enough to receive both.

To be perfectly honest I was ready to be disappointed by RuPaul Red Hot,

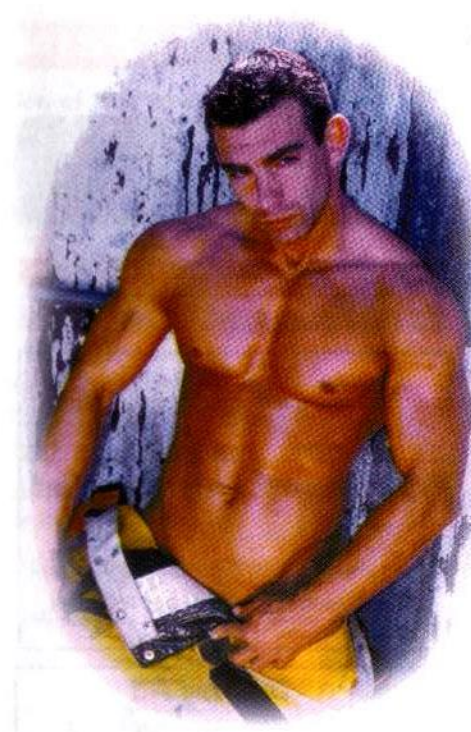
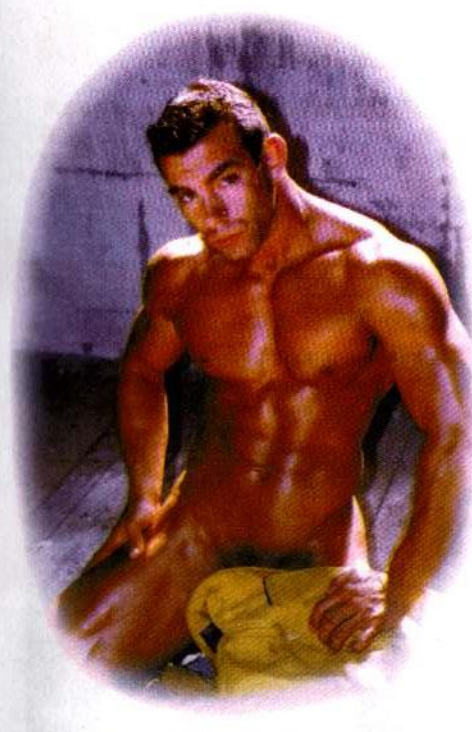
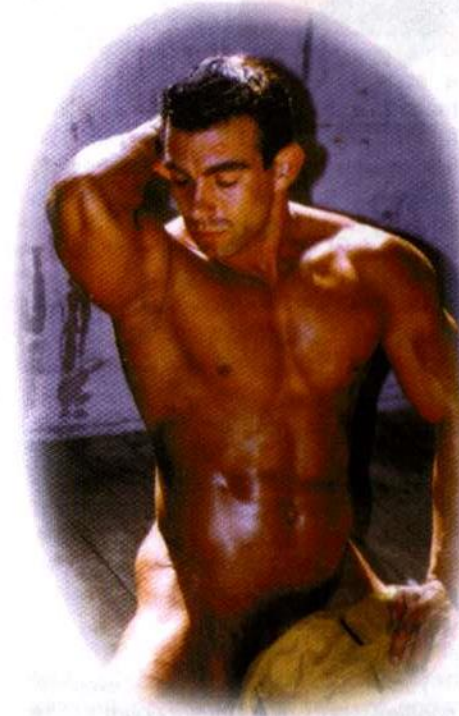
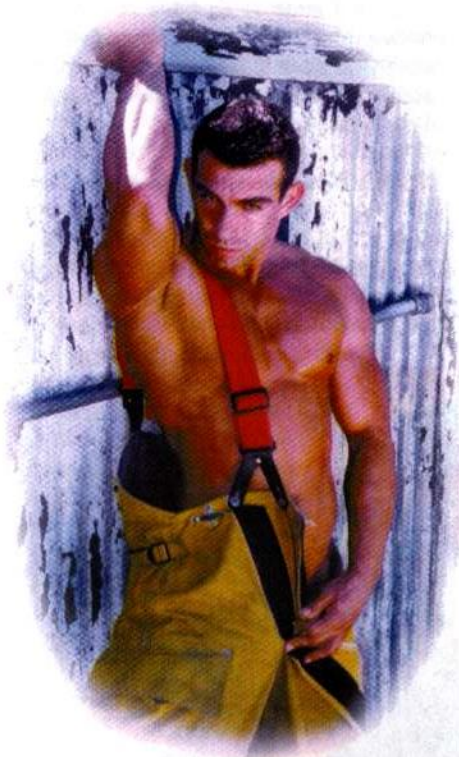
